17	PARTIES			
18	1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official			
19	capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.			
20	2. On or about October 17, 2002, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy			
21	Technician License Number TCH 44904 to Randy Allen Costere (Respondent). The Pharmacy			
22	Technician License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein			
23	and will expire on August 31, 2010, unless renewed.			
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25	JURISDICTION			
26	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board),			
27	Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section			
28	references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.			
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4. Section 4011 of the Code provides that the Board shall administer and
 enforce both the Pharmacy Law [Bus. & Prof. Code, § 4000 et seq.] and the Uniform Controlled
 Substances Act [Health & Safety Code, § 11000 et seq.].

4 5. Section 4300(a) of the Code provides that every license issued by the
5 Board may be suspended or revoked.

6. Section 118(b) of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the suspension, 6 7 expiration, surrender, or cancellation of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to 8 proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, 9 restored, reissued or reinstated. Section 4402(a) of the Code provides that any pharmacist license that is not renewed within three years following its expiration may not be renewed, restored, or 10 reinstated and shall be canceled by operation of law at the end of the three-year period. Section 11 4402(e) of the Code provides that any other license issued by the Board may be canceled by the 12 Board if not renewed within 60 days after its expiration, and any license canceled in this fashion 13 may not be reissued but will instead require a new application to seek reissuance. 14

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

7. Section 4301 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board shall
take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of "unprofessional conduct," defined to
include, but not be limited to, any of the following:

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(h) The administering to oneself, of any controlled substance, or the use of any
dangerous drug or of alcoholic beverages to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or
injurious to oneself, to a person holding a license under this chapter, or to any other person or to
the public, or to the extent that the use impairs the ability of the person to conduct with safety to
the public the practice authorized by the license.

(j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, of any other state, or of the
United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.

(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or
abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the
applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy . . .

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1	8. Section 4327 of the Code, in pertinent part, makes it unlawful, while on
<b>2</b> <sup>1</sup>	duty, to sell, dispense or compound any drug while under the influence of any dangerous drug.
. 3	9. Health and Safety Code section 11170 provides that no person shall
4	prescribe, administer, or furnish a controlled substance for himself or herself.
. 5	10. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may
6	request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation of
7	the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed its reasonable costs of investigation and enforcement.
. 8	CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES / DANGEROUS DRUGS
9	11. Section 4021 of the Code states:
10	"'Controlled substance' means any substance listed in Chapter 2 (commencing
	with Section 11053) of Division 10 of the Health and Safety Code."
12	12. Section 4022 of the Code states, in pertinent part:
13	"'Dangerous drug' or 'dangerous device' means any drug or device unsafe for
14	self-use, except veterinary drugs that are labeled as such, and includes the following:
15	"(a) Any drug that bears the legend: 'Caution: federal law prohibits dispensing
. 16	without prescription,' 'Rx only,' or words of similar import.
	•••
18	"(c) Any other drug or device that by federal or state law can be lawfully
19	dispensed only on prescription or furnished pursuant to Section 4006."
20	13. Norco, Vicodin, Vicodin ES, Lortab, and Lorcet are among the brand
21	names for compounds of varying dosages of acetaminophen (aka APAP) and hydrocodone, a
22	Schedule III controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11056(e)(4)
23	and dangerous drug as designated by Business and Professions Code section 4022. The varying
24	compounds are also known generically as Hydrocodone with APAP. These are narcotic drugs.
25	14. <b>Percocet</b> is a brand name for a compound of acetaminophen (APAP) and
26	oxycodone, a Schedule II controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section
. 27	11055(b)(1)(N) and a dangerous drug as designated by Business and Professions Code section
28	4022. It is a narcotic analgesic used for relief of moderate to severe pain.
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15. Ativan is a brand name for lorazepam, a Schedule IV controlled 1 2 substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11057(d)(16) and a dangerous drug as designated by Business and Professions Code section 4022. It is a depressant drug. 3 16. Xanax is a brand name for alprazolam, a Schedule IV controlled 4 substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11057(d)(1) and a dangerous drug as 5 designated by Business and Professions Code section 4022. It is a depressant drug. 6 FACTUAL BACKGROUND 7 By his own admission, Respondent has had, since at least January 2007, an 17. 8 addiction to narcotics or other controlled substances and/or dangerous drugs, primarily brand and 9 generic drugs containing hydrocodone (e.g., Norco) or oxycodone (e.g., Percocet). 10 18. Between at least January 2007 and September 2007, Respondent ingested 11 and self-administered significant quantities of controlled substances and dangerous drugs, mostly 12 hydrocodone drugs, but also some oxycodone drugs, lorazepam, and/or alprazolam. The exact 13 number of drugs consumed is not known, but between February 5, 2007 and August 20, 2007, an 14 average of at least 15 tablets of controlled substances were used by Respondent, a number that 15 would have affected Respondent's ability to function and perform safely in a pharmacy. 16 During all or most of this time period from January 2007 to and including 17 19. September 2007, Respondent was employed as a pharmacy technician at the Dominican Hospital 18 Pharmacy (PHY 45521) in Santa Cruz, CA. This employment ended on or about April 15, 2008. 19 For some or all of the January to September 2007 period, the duties of his employment included 20 selling, dispensing or compounding dangerous drugs. For some or all of this period, Respondent 21 was under the influence of one or more controlled substances while engaged in this employment. 22 On or about May 10, 2008, officers from the Santa Cruz County Sheriff's 20. 23 Office were called to the residence of Respondent's parents, where Respondent was in the front 24 yard exhibiting signs of substance and/or alcohol abuse, including unsteadiness, vomiting, and 25 belligerence. Respondent was arrested pursuant to Penal Code section 647, subdivision (f), for 26 public intoxication or drug abuse (unable to care for his own safety or the safety of others). He 27 was subsequently released without charges being filed pursuant to Penal Code section 849. 28

3	21. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301(h) of the	
4	Code, in that as described in paragraphs 17-20 above, between at least January and September	
5	2007, Respondent self-administered and/or used controlled substances, dangerous drugs, and/or	
6	alcoholic beverages to an extent or in a manner so as to be dangerous or injurious to himself or to	
7	others, or to the extent that the use impairs his ability to conduct with safety to the public the	
8	practice authorized by his Pharmacy Technician License.	
9	SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
10	(Selling, Dispensing, or Compounding While Under the Influence)	
.11	22. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301(j) and/or	
12	(o) of the Code, and section 4327 of the Code, in that as described in paragraphs 17-20 above,	
13	between at least January and September 2007, Respondent sold, dispensed or compounded one or	
14	more drugs while under the influence of a dangerous drug, and/or directly or indirectly attempted,	
15	conspired, and/or assisted in or abetted such conduct.	
16	THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
17	(Self-Administration of Controlled Substance)	
18	23. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301(j) and/or	
19	(o) of the Code, and Health and Safety Code section 11170, in that as described in paragraphs 17-	
20	20 above, between at least January and September 2007, Respondent self-administered one or	
21	more controlled substances in an improper or abusive manner, and/or directly or indirectly	
22	attempted, conspired, and/or assisted in or abetted such conduct.

24	PRAYER	
25	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein	
26	alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:	
. 27	A. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician License Number TCH	
28	44904, issued to Randy Allen Costere (Respondent);	

B. Ordering Respondent to pay the Board reasonable costs of investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; Taking such other and further action as is deemed necessary and proper.
