4. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, states:

"For the purpose of denial, suspension, or revocation of a personal or facility license pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and Professions Code, a crime or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or registrant if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of a licensee or registrant to perform the functions authorized by his license or registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare."

5. Section 4301 of the Code states, in pertinent part:

"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake.

Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

- ...(h) The administering to oneself, of any controlled substance, or the use of any dangerous drug or of alcoholic beverages to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to oneself, to a person holding a license under this chapter, or to any other person or the public, or to the extent that the use impairs the ability of the person to conduct with safety to the public the practice authorized by the license.
- ...(I) The conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a licensee under this chapter. The record of conviction of a violation of Chapter 13 (commencing with Section 801) of Title 21 of the United States Code regulating controlled substances or of a violation of the statutes of this state regulating controlled substances or dangerous drugs shall be conclusive evidence of unprofessional conduct. In all other cases, the record of conviction shall be conclusive evidence only of the fact that the conviction occurred. The board may inquire into the circumstances surrounding the commission of the crime, in order to fix the degree of discipline or, in the case of a conviction not involving controlled substances or dangerous drugs, to determine if the conviction is of an offense substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a licensee under this chapter. A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of *nolo contendere* is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of this provision. The board may take action when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the

judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal or when an order granting probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code allowing the person to withdraw his or her plea of guilty and to enter a plea of not guilty, or setting aside the verdict of guilty, or dismissing the accusation, information, or indictment.

.. (p) Actions or conduct that would have warranted denial of a license.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Criminal Conviction for DUI)

- 6. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Section 4301 of the Code and California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, and, in that on or about September 11, 2007, in the Superior Court of California, County of Mendocino, in *People of the State of California v. Jerry Bradley Klein*, (Case No. MCTM-MCTR-07-77890-01), Respondent was convicted on his plea of *nolo contendere* of violating Vehicle Code section 23152(a), (Driving while intoxicated), a misdemeanor. Such crime is substantially related to the qualifications, functions and duties of a licensed pharmacist.
- 7. The crime occurred on or about May 21, 2007 when Respondent was unable to maintain control over his pickup truck while driving south on SR-1 near Fort Bragg, left the roadway and traveled onto a grassy shoulder. For unknown reasons, a fire started in the engine compartment and Respondent was removed from the truck by a passerby. Respondent was then transported to Mendocino Coast Hospital where he was evaluated by a C.H.P. officer, admitted to intoxication, but refused a blood draw.

COST RECOVERY

6. Section 125.3 of the Code states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.
