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PETITION TO REVOKE PROBATION (Case No. 3458)

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SECOND CAUSE TO REVOKE PROBATION

(Reimbursement of Board Costs)

9. At all times after the effective date of Respondent's probation. Probation Condition 7 stated:

Respondent shall pay to the board its costs of investigation and prosecution in the amount of \$1,185.00. Respondent shall make monthly payments of \$75 or more per month until the costs have been paid in full.

If respondent fails to pay the costs as specified by the board and on the date(s) determined by the board, the board shall, without affording respondent notice and the opportunity to be heard, revoke probation and carry out the disciplinary order that was stayed. The filing of bankruptcy by respondent shall not relieve respondent of her responsibility to reimburse the board its costs of investigation and prosecution.

10. Respondent's probation is subject to revocation because Respondent made a single payment towards Board costs in March 2008 in the amount of \$200. Respondent still owes a balance of \$985.00 and has not made any payments since March 2008, in violation of Probation Condition 7, referenced above.

THIRD CAUSE TO REVOKE PROBATION

(Notification of Employment/Mailing Address Change)

11. At all times after the effective date of Respondent's probation, Probation Condition 10 stated:

Respondent shall notify the board in writing within 10 days of any change of employment. Said notification shall include the reasons for leaving and/or the address of the new employer, supervisor or owner and work schedule, if known. Respondent shall notify the board in writing within 10 days of a change in name, mailing address or phone number.

12. Respondent's probation is subject to revocation because she failed to notify the Board of her May 29, 2009, termination from her employment at Rancho Park Pharmacy. Respondent further failed to notify the Board within 10 days of her change of residence to Alabama, on July 31, 2009. in violation of Probation Condition 10, referenced above.

FOURTH CAUSE TO REVOKE PROBATION

(Attend Substance Abuse Recovery Relapse Prevention and Support Groups)

13. At all times after the effective date of Respondent's probation, Probation Condition 12 stated:

 License No. TCH 44416 issued to Mary Jane Guy;
- 2. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician License No. TCH 44416, issued to Mary Jane Guy;
 - 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
