1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) brin	gs this Petition to Revoke Probation solely in he	
official capacity as the Executive Officer of the	Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer	
Affairs.		
2. On or about January 13, 1995, the B	Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician	
Registration Number TCH 14881 to Kenneth Charles Rhodes (Respondent). The Pharmacy		
Technician Registration expired on November 30, 2008, and has not been renewed.		
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1	3. In a disciplinary action entitled "In the Matter of Accusation Against Kenneth Charles		
2	Rhodes," Case No. 2617, the Board of Pharmacy, issued a decision, effective March 30, 2005, in		
3	which Respondent's Pharmacy Technician Registration was revoked. However, the revocation		
4	was stayed and Respondent's license was placed on probation for a period of three (3) years with		
5	certain terms and conditions. A copy of that decision is attached as Exhibit A and is incorporated		
6	by reference.		
7	4. Respondent remains on probation, since Respondent ceased practice as a pharmacy		
8	technician on or about April 30, 2005, and has not resumed practice since that date. Under		
9	express language of Probation Condition 11 ¹ of the Board's decision, no time since April 30,		
10	2005 is applicable to the reduction of Respondent's three year probation.		
11	JURISDICTION		
12	5. This Petition to Revoke Probation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board),		
13	Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section		
14	references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.		
15	6. Section 4300 of the Code states:		
16	"(a) Every license issued may be suspended or revoked.		
17	"(b) The board shall discipline the holder of any license issued by the board, whose default		
18	has been entered or whose case has been heard by the board and found guilty, by any of the		
19	following methods:		
20	"(1) Suspending judgment.		
21	"(2) Placing him or her upon probation.		
22 ່	At all times after the effective date of the decision, Probation Condition 11 provided:		
23	"It is a violation of probation for respondent to work less than 40 hours per month as a pharmacy technician/exemptee. Should respondent, regardless of residency, for any reason cease		
24	practicing as a pharmacy technician or an exemptee in California, respondent must notify the board in writing within 10 days of cessation of practice or the resumption of the practice. Such		
25	periods of time shall not apply to the reduction of the probation period. It is a violation of probation for respondent's probation to remain tolled pursuant to the provisions of this condition		
26	for a period exceeding three consecutive years. "Cessation of practice" means any period of time exceeding 30 days in which respondent		
27	is not engaged in the practice of a pharmacy technician as defined in section 4115 of the Business and Professions Code."		
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1	"(3) Suspending his or her right to practice for a period not exceeding one year.	
2	"(4) Revoking his or her license.	
3	"(5) Taking any other action in relation to disciplining him or her as the board in its	
4	discretion may deem proper.	
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6	board may, in its sole discretion, issue a probationary license to any applicant for a license who is	
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8	may issue the license subject to any terms or conditions not contrary to public policy, including,	
9	but not limited to, the following:	
10	"(1) Medical or psychiatric evaluation.	
11	"(2) Continuing medical or psychiatric treatment.	
12	"(3) Restriction of type or circumstances of practice.	
13	"(4) Continuing participation in a board-approved rehabilitation program.	
14	"(5) Abstention from the use of alcohol or drugs.	
15	"(6) Random fluid testing for alcohol or drugs.	
16	"(7) Compliance with laws and regulations governing the practice of pharmacy.	
-17	"(d) The board may initiate disciplinary proceedings to revoke or suspend any probationary	
18	certificate of licensure for any violation of the terms and conditions of probation. Upon	
19	satisfactory completion of probation, the board shall convert the probationary certificate to a	
20	regular certificate, free of conditions.	
21	"(e) The proceedings under this article shall be conducted in accordance with Chapter 5	
22	(commencing with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of the Government Code, and the board	
23	shall have all the powers granted therein. The action shall be final, except that the propriety of	
24	the action is subject to review by the superior court pursuant to Section 1094.5 of the Code of	
25	Civil Procedure."	
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7. Section 118, subdivision (b), of the Code provides that the suspension, expiration, surrender or cancellation of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued or reinstated.

FIRST CAUSE TO REVOKE PROBATION

(Failed to Maintain an Active Pharmacy Technician License)

8. At all times after the effective date of Respondent's probation, Condition 1 required that Respondent was suspended from working as a pharmacy technician until he was certified by the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board (PTCB), and provided satisfactory proof of the certification to the Board². Respondent failed to obtain the required certification and/or failed to provide proof of said certification to the Board.

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9. At all times after the effective date of Respondent's probation, Condition 9 provided as follows:

"Respondent shall, at all times while on probation, maintain an active current

technician registration/certification with the board, including any period during which suspension

or probation is tolled."

If Respondent's technician registration/certification expires or is cancelled by

18 operation of law or otherwise, upon renewal or reapplication, respondent's license shall be subject

19 to all terms and conditions of this probation not previously satisfied."

² Condition 1, subtitled "Certification Prior to Resuming Work" provides as follows: "Respondent shall be suspended from working as a pharmacy technician until he or she is certified by the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board (PTCB) and provides satisfactory proof of certification to the board.

During suspension, respondent shall not enter any pharmacy area or any portion of
the licensed premises of a wholesaler, veterinary food-animal drug retailer or any other distributor
of drugs which is licensed by the board, or any manufacturer, or where dangerous drugs and
devices or controlled substances are maintained. Respondent shall not do any act involving drug
selection of stock, manufacturing, compounding or dispensing; nor shall respondent manage,
administer, or be consultant to any licensee of the board, or have access to or control the ordering,
manufacturing or dispensing of dangerous drugs and devices or controlled substances.
Subject to the above restrictions, respondent may continue to own or hold an
interest in any entity licensed by the board in which he or she holds an interest at the time this
decision becomes effective unless otherwise specified in this order."

1	10. Respondent's license expired on November 30, 2008 and has not been renewed.
2	11. Respondent's probation is subject to revocation because he failed to comply with
3	Condition 1 by obtaining the required PTCB certification which would have allowed him to
4	resume practice, and because he has failed to comply with Condition 9, which requires him to
5	maintain an active current pharmacy technician license with the Board, at all times while on
6	probation.
7	SECOND CAUSE TO REVOKE PROBATION
8	(Failure to Maintain 40 Hours Monthly Employment as a Pharmacy Technician)
9	12. At all times after the effective date of Respondent's probation, Condition 11
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11	required:
12	"It is a violation of probation for respondent to work less than 40 hours per month as a
13	pharmacy technician/exemptee. Should respondent, regardless of residency, for any reason cease
14	practicing as a pharmacy technician or an exemptee in California, respondent must notify the
15	board in writing within 10 days of cessation of practice or the resumption of the practice. Such
16	periods of time shall not apply to the reduction of the probation period. It is a violation of
17 18	probation for respondent's probation to remain tolled pursuant to the provisions of this condition
19	for a period exceeding three consecutive years.
20	"Cessation of practice" means any period of time exceeding 30 days in which respondent
21	is not engaged in the practice of a pharmacy technician as defined in section 4115 of the Business
22	and Professions Code."
23	13. Respondent's probation is subject to revocation because he failed to comply with
24	Probation Condition 11, referenced above, in that he has not worked at least 40 hours per month
25	for each month of probation. Respondent has not been legally employed as a pharmacy technician
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27	at any time during the probation period. The circumstances of the violation are as follows:
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1	А.	Respondent is and remains suspended from working until certified
2	-	Under Condition 1 of the probation order, Respondent was suspended from working
3	as a pharm	acy technician until he was certified by the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board.
4	At no time	after the effective date of the probation order, did Respondent obtain the required
5	certificatio	n and/or provide proof of said certification to the Board.
6	В.	Expired License
7		Respondent's license expired on November 30, 2008 and has not been renewed.
8	C.	Tolling of Probation
9	i.	Under Condition 11 of the Probation Order Respondent's failure to maintain
10	employme	nt is construed as a "cessation of practice", which results in the tolling of his probation.
11	The Board	's probation monitor calculates that Respondent 'ceased practice' on April 30, 2005.
12	No time si	nce that date has applied to the reduction of his three year probation
13		THIRD CAUSE TO REVOKE PROBATION
14		(Failure to Submit Quarterly Reports)
15	14.	At all times after the effective date of Respondent's probation, Condition 3 stated:
16		"Respondent shall report to the board quarterly. The report shall be made either in
17	person or i	n writing as directed. Respondent shall state under penalty of perjury whether there
18	has been co	ompliance with all the terms and conditions of probation. If the final probation report
19	is not made	e as directed, probation shall be extended automatically until such time as the final
20	report is m	ade and accepted by the board."
21	15.	Respondent's probation is subject to revocation because he has failed to comply with
22	Probation	Condition 3, referenced above, in that the Board's probation monitor has not received
23	any require	ed written quarterly report(s) from Respondent since January 17, 2008.
24		FOURTH CAUSE TO REVOKE PROBATION
25		(Failed to Submit Cost Recovery Payments)
26	16.	At all times after the effective date of Respondent's probation, Condition 7 stated:
27		"Respondent shall pay to the board its costs of investigation and prosecution in the
28	amount of	\$4,345.75. Respondent shall make said payments in quarterly installments over the
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1	period of probation as follows: 19 quarterly installments of \$217.28 and a final installment of
2	\$217.43. Each payment shall be made with the quarterly report required above.
3	If Respondent fails to pay the costs as specified by the board and on the date(s)
4	determined by the board, the board shall, without affording the respondent notice and the
5	opportunity to be heard, revoke probation and carry out the disciplinary order that was stayed.
6	The filing of bankruptcy by respondent shall not relieve respondent of his or her responsibility to
7	reimburse the board its costs of investigation and prosecution."
8	17. Respondent's probation is subject to revocation because he failed to comply with
9	Probation Condition 7, referenced above, in that, though he has made payments from time to
10	time, Respondent has failed to complete cost recovery payments in a timely manner, and has
11	failed to pay the remaining balance of \$2,263.00.
12	FIFTH CAUSE TO REVOKE PROBATION
13	(Tolling of Probation for Period Exceeding Three Years)
14	18. As previously alleged, under Condition 11 of the Probation Order Respondent's
15	failure to maintain an active license, is construed as a "cessation of practice", which has resulted
16	in the tolling of his probation for a period of time exceeding three years, commencing on or about
17	April 30, 2005, and continuing.
18	19. Respondent's probation is subject to revocation under the express language of
19	Condition 11, which states "it is a violation of probation for Respondent's probation to remain
20	tolled pursuant to the provisions of (Condition 11) for a period exceeding three consecutive
21	years."
22	PRAYER
23	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
24	and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:
25	1. Revoking the probation that was granted by the Board of Pharmacy in Case No. 2617
26	and imposing the disciplinary order that was stayed thereby revoking Pharmacy Technician
27	Registration No. TCH 14881 issued to Kenneth Charles Rhodes;
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2. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 14881, issued to Kenneth Charles Rhodes; and Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper. 3. has DATED: 3 VIRGINIA ROLD Executive Officer Board of Pharmacy Department of Consumer Affairs State of California Complainant LA2010600178 50595513.doc PETITION TO REVOKE PROBATION
