19	1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity		
20	as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.		
21	2. On or about August 24, 2005, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician		
22 ·	Registration Number TCH 64204 to Frank Anthony Gutierrez (Respondent). The Pharmacy		
23	Technician Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought		
24	herein and will expire on November 30, 2010, unless renewed.		
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		Accusation	
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1	JURISDICTION		
2	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of		
3	Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the		
4	Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.		
5	4. Section 4300 of the Code states in pertinent part:		
6	"(a) Every license issued may be suspended or revoked.		
. 7	"(b) The board shall discipline the holder of any license issued by the board, whose default		
8	has been entered or whose case has been heard by the board and found guilty, by any of the		
9	following methods:		
10	"(1) Suspending judgment.		
11	"(2) Placing him or her upon probation.		
12	"(3) Suspending his or her right to practice for a period not exceeding one year.		
13	"(4) Revoking his or her license.		
14	"(5) Taking any other action in relation to disciplining him or her as the board in its		
15	discretion may deem proper.		
16	•••		
17	"(e) The proceedings under this article shall be conducted in accordance with Chapter 5		
18	(commencing with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of the Government Code, and the board		
19	shall have all the powers granted therein. The action shall be final, except that the propriety of		
20	the action is subject to review by the superior court pursuant to Section 1094.5 of the Code of		
21	Civil Procedure."		
22	5. Section 4301 of the Code states in pertinent part:		
, 23	"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional		
24	conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake.		
25	Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:		
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"(h) The administering to oneself, of any controlled substance, or the use of any dangerous drug or of alcoholic beverages to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to oneself, to a person holding a license under this chapter, or to any other person or to the public, or to the extent that the use impairs the ability of the person to conduct with safety to the public the practice authorized by the license.

"(k) The conviction of more than one misdemeanor or any felony involving the use, consumption, or self-administration of any dangerous drug or alcoholic beverage, or any combination of those substances.

"(1) The conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and 10 duties of a licensee under this chapter. The record of conviction of a violation of Chapter 13 11 (commencing with Section 801) of Title 21 of the United States Code regulating controlled 12 substances or of a violation of the statutes of this state regulating controlled substances or 13 dangerous drugs shall be conclusive evidence of unprofessional conduct. In all other cases, the 14 record of conviction shall be conclusive evidence only of the fact that the conviction occurred. 15 The board may inquire into the circumstances surrounding the commission of the crime, in order 16 to fix the degree of discipline or, in the case of a conviction not involving controlled substances 17 or dangerous drugs, to determine if the conviction is of an offense substantially related to the 18 qualifications, functions, and duties of a licensee under this chapter. A plea or verdict of guilty or 19 a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning 20 21 of this provision. The board may take action when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal or when an order granting probation is made 22 23 suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code allowing the person to withdraw his or her plea of guilty and to enter a plea of not 24 guilty, or setting aside the verdict of guilty, or dismissing the accusation, information, or 25 indictment. 26

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Accusation

6. Section 125.3 of the Code states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

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FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Criminal Convictions)

7. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct under section
4301(l) in that he was convicted of crimes which are substantially related to the qualifications,
functions, and duties of a pharmacy technician as follows:

a. On August 2, 2006, in the Superior Court, Madera County, California in the case
entitled *People of the State of California v. Frank Anthony Gutierrez*, Case No. C014586,
Respondent was convicted by the court of a violation of Vehicle Code section 23152(a) (driving
under the influence of alcohol or drugs) a misdemeanor. The circumstances are as follows: On
January 27, 2006, respondent drove a motor vehicle in Madera County while under the influence
of alcohol or drugs.

On March 7, 2007, in the Superior Court, Fresno County, California in the case b. 16 entitled People of the State of California v. Frank Anthony Gutierrez, Case No. M07912875, 17 Respondent was convicted by the court following his plea of guilty to a violation of Vehicle Code 18 section 23152(b) (driving with a blood alcohol level of .08 or higher) a misdemeanor. The 19 circumstances are as follows: On October 20, 2006, Respondent pulled out of a driveway in front 20 of another motorist and the arresting officer, causing both vehicles to be forced to take evasive 21 maneuvers to avoid a collision. After being stopped by the arresting officer, respondent failed the 22 field sobriety tests, and a subsequent breath test resulted in a BAC of .09. 23

c. On April 30, 2007 in the Superior Court, Fresno County, California in the case
entitled *People of the State of California v. Frank Anthony Gutierrez*, Case No. M07915412,
Respondent was convicted by the court following his plea of Nolo Contendere to a violation of
Vehicle Code section 14601.2(a) (driving when privilege suspended for prior DUI conviction) a
misdemeanor. The circumstances are as follows: On February 11, 2007, Respondent was pulled

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over for running a right red arrow at a traffic signal. At that time respondent's license was suspended as a result of his prior DUI conviction, and his arrest on October 20, 2006 set forth above in paragraph 7(a) and(b).

d. On December 6, 2007 in the Superior Court, Madera County, California in the case entitled People of the State of California v. Frank Anthony Gutierrez, Case No. R007641, Respondent was convicted by the court of a violations of Vehicle Code section 23152(b) (driving with a blood alcohol level of .08 or higher) a misdemeanor, and Vehicle Code section 14601.2(a) (driving when privilege suspended for prior DUI conviction) a misdemeanor. The circumstances are as follows: On May 18, 2007, respondent drove a motor vehicle in Madera County while under the influence of alcohol or drugs and while his license was suspended for prior DUI arrests and convictions.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Multiple Convictions involving the use of Alcohol)

8. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct under section 4301(k) in that he has suffered multiple convictions for crimes involving the use of alcohol as set forth above in paragraphs 7 (a), (b), and (d).

THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Use of Alcoholic Beverage to the Extent or in a Manner Dangerous or Injurious to Others)

9. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct under section 4301(h) in that he consumed alcoholic beverages to an extent or in a manner that was dangerous or injurious to himself and others as set forth in paragraphs 7(a), (b), and (d) above.

PRAYER

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WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 64204, 1. 26 issued to Frank Anthony Gutierrez Frank Anthony Gutierrez.

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Ordering Frank Anthony Gutierrez to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs 2. of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper. 3.
