8. Section 4060 of the Code states in relevant part:

"No person shall possess any controlled substance, except that furnished to a person upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7, or furnished pursuant to a drug order issued by a certified nurse-midwife pursuant to Section 2746.51, a nurse practitioner pursuant to Section 2836.1, a physician assistant pursuant to Section 3502.1, a naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.5, or a pharmacist pursuant to either Section 4052.1 or 4052.2...."

9. Section 4301 of the Code states:

"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake.

Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

n :

"(f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.

"(j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, or any other state, or of the United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.

"....

"(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency.

"..."

10. Code section 4324 states in relevant part:

"(a) Every person who signs the name of another, or of a fictitious person, or falsely makes, alters, forges, utters, publishes, passes, or attempts to pass, as genuine, any prescription for any

15. Zolpidem tartrate, sold under the brand name Ambien, is a Schedule IV controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11507(d)(32), and is a dangerous drug pursuant to Business & Professions Code section 4022.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct - Committing Acts Involving Moral Turpitude, Dishonesty, Fraud or Deceit)

- 16. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subdivision (f), for obtaining controlled substances or a prescription for controlled substances by fraud, deceit or misrepresentation. The circumstances are as follows:
- Pharmacies in Palm Springs, California, Respondent obtained 450 tablets of Hydrocodone/apap using unauthorized prescriptions on March 19, 2009 (Prescription No. 74373); April 7, 2009 (Prescription No. 102909); April 12, 2009 (Prescription No. 150893); April 19, 2009 (Prescription No. 952332); May 3, 2009 (Prescription No. 150893); May 6, 2009 (Prescription No. 154138), June 16, 2009 (Prescription No. 85028), and 40 tablets of Zolpidem using unauthorized prescriptions on April 20, 2009 (Prescription No. 104829) and June 16, 2009 (Prescription No. 85081) by transferring her prescriptions for Hydrocodone/apap 5-500 mg #60 and #30, and Zolpidem 10mg #20, between stores and by altering the number of refills on the prescriptions.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unlawful Furnishing and Possession of Controlled Substance)

18. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct under section 4301, subdivision (o), for for violation of the Pharmacy Act by forging prescriptions, furnishing controlled substances to herself, and unlawfully possessing controlled substances in violation of Code sections 4059 and 4060, as set forth in paragraph 17 above, which is incorporated here by this reference.

THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct - Unlawful Self-Prescribing of Controlled Substances)

Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct under section 4301, subdivision (j), for violation of the Pharmacy Act by unlawfully self-prescribing controlled substances in violation of Health and Safety Code sections 11170 and 11173 as is set forth in paragraph 17 above, which is incorporated here by this reference.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

- Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 51226, issued to Yvonne M. Canchola;
- 2. Ordering Yvonne M. Canchola to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and
