23	2. On or about September 1, 2005, the Board of Pharmacy issued Original Pharmacy		
24	Technician Registration Number TCH 64864 to Heidi Sue Collins (Respondent). The Original		
25	Pharmacy Technician Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges		
26	brought herein and will expire on September 30, 2011, unless renewed.

2	3.	This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of	
3	Consum	er Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the	
4		Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.

24	15. Flurazepam, sold under the brand name of Dalmane, is a controlled substance	ĺ
25	pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 11057(d)(14), a dangerous drug as defined by	
26	Business and Professions Code section 4022, and is used as a sleep aid.	
27	16. Amitriptyline, sold under the brand name of Elavil, is a dangerous drug as defined b	уy
28	Business and Professions Code section 4022, and is used as an anti-depressant.	
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17. Butalbital 50 mg, Caffeine 40 mg with APAP 325 mg, sold under the brand name of
 Fioricet, is a controlled substance pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 11056(c)(3), a
 dangerous drug as defined by Business and Professions Code section 4022, and is used to treat
 headaches and migraines.

18. Hydrocodone/APAP, sold under the brand name of Lorcet or Vicodin or Vicodin ES,
or Norco, is a controlled substance pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 11056(e)(4), a
dangerous drug as defined by Business and Professions Code section 4022, and is used to treat
pain.

9 19. Eszopiclone Analog (Zopiclone), sold under the brand name of Lunesta, is a
10 controlled substance pursuant to Code of Federal Regulations title 21, section 1308.14(c)(51), a
11 dangerous drug as defined by Business and Professions Code section 4022, and is used as a sleep
12 aid

20. Isometheptene/Dichloralphenazone/APAP, sold under the brand name of Midrin, is a
dangerous drug as defined by Business and Professions Code section 4022, and is used to treat
tension and vascular headaches.

16 21. Temazepam, sold under the brand name of Restoril, is a controlled substance pursuant
17 to Health and Safety Code section 11057(d)(29), a dangerous drug as defined by Business and
18 Professions Code section 4022, and is used as a sleep aid

22. Quetiapine, sold under the brand name of Seroquel, is a dangerous drug as defined by
Business and Professions Code section 4022, and is used to treat acute manic or depressive
episodes with Bipolar Disorder.

22 23. Pyrazolopyrimidine (Zaleplon), sold under the brand name of Sonata, is a controlled
23 substance pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 11057(d)(31), a dangerous drug as defined
24 by Business and Professions Code section 4022, and is used as a sleep aid.

25 24. Alprazolam, sold under the brand name of Xanax, is a controlled substance pursuant
26 to Health and Safety Code section 11057(d)(1), a dangerous drug as defined by Business and
27 Professions Code section 4022, and is used to treat panic disorder and anxiety.

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25. Diazepam, sold under the brand name of Valium, is a controlled substance pursuant 1 to Health and Safety Code section 11057(d)(9), a dangerous drug as defined by Business and 2 Professions Code section 4022, and is used to treat seizures and anxiety. 3 FACTS 4 26. 5 On October 27, 2008, and on February 20, 2009, the Board received notification of losses of controlled substances from Rite-Aid Pharmacy located in San Juan Capistrano, 6 California. The losses were of the following substances: Alprazolam, Amitriptyline, Ambien 7 CR, Diazepam, Fioricet, Flurazepam, Seroquel, Temazepam, Xanax, Hydrocodone/APAP 7.5 -8 750, Isometheptene/APAP/Dichlor, Lorazepam, Lunesta, and Sonata. 9 On March 3, 2009, the Board received notification from Rite-Aid that it had 27. 10 terminated Respondent's employment at the San Juan Capistrano Rite-Aid. 11 28. An investigation into the losses revealed that Respondent had been taking large 12 13 amounts of controlled substances and dangerous drugs for her own purposes. 29. On January 27, 2009, Respondent was interviewed about the losses and she admitted 14 to stealing Alprazolam, Ambien, Diazepam, Flurazepam, Lorazepam, Lunesta and Seroquel in the 15 amount of \$4,828.51. Respondent wrote a letter of explanation admitting to stealing the drugs, 16 she said, "... being an insomniac it was like being in a candy store." Respondent signed a 17 promissory note to re-pay the company, and her employment was terminated. Respondent went 18 19 to her home and retrieved pills that she still had in her possession and returned them to the 20 pharmacy. On June 5, 2009, a Board Investigator received a letter from Respondent wherein she 30. 21 admitted to stealing the drugs in order to find the "perfect" sleeping pill to treat her lifelong 22 insomnia. 23 FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 24 (Obtained Controlled Substances by Fraud, Deceit and Subterfuge) 25 Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301(f) and Health and 31. 26 27 Safety Code section 11173(a) in conjunction with 4301(j) by obtaining controlled substances by 28 6

1	dishonesty, fraud, deceit or subterfuge, as more fully set forth above in paragraphs 26 through and
2	including paragraph 30.
3	SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
4	(Unprofessional Conduct – Self-administration of Dangerous Drugs)
5	32. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301(h), for
6	unprofessional conduct in administering to herself controlled substances and dangerous drugs, or
7	using dangerous drug to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to oneself, to a
8	person holding a license under this chapter, or to any other person or to the public, or to the extent
9	that the use impaired Respondent's ability to conduct with safety to the public the practice
10	authorized by her license, as set forth above in paragraphs 26 through and including paragraph 30.
11	THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
12	(Possessed Controlled Substances Without a Prescription)
13	33. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4060, and Health and
14	Safety Code section 11377(a) in conjunction with Code section 4301(j) by possessing controlled
15	substances and dangerous drugs without a prescription as more fully set forth above in paragraphs
16	26 through and including paragraph 30.
17	FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
18	(Furnishing of Controlled Substances Without a Prescription)
19	34. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4059, and Health and
20	Safety Code section 11170 pursuant to Code section 4301(j) by furnishing controlled substances
21	and dangerous drugs to herself without a prescription, as more fully set forth above in paragraphs
22	26 through and including paragraph 30.
23	PRAYER
24	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
25	and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:
26	1. Revoking or suspending Original Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH
27	64864, issued to Heidi Sue Collins.
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2. Ordering Heidi Sue Collins to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and 3.
