### JURISDICTION

- 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.
  - 4. Section 4300 of the Code states:
    - "(a) Every license issued may be suspended or revoked.
  - "(b) The board shall discipline the holder of any license issued by the board, whose default has been entered or whose case has been heard by the board and found guilty, by any of the following methods:
    - "(1) Suspending judgment.
    - "(2) Placing him or her upon probation.
  - "(3) Suspending his or her right to practice for a period not exceeding one year.
    - "(4) Revoking his or her license.
  - "(5) Taking any other action in relation to disciplining him or her as the board in its discretion may deem proper.
  - "(c) The board may refuse a license to any applicant guilty of unprofessional conduct. The board may, in its sole discretion, issue a probationary license to any applicant for a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct and who has met all other requirements for licensure. The board may issue the license subject to any terms or conditions not contrary to public policy, including, but not limited to, the following:
    - "(1) Medical or psychiatric evaluation.
    - "(2) Continuing medical or psychiatric treatment.
    - "(3) Restriction of type or circumstances of practice.
    - "(4) Continuing participation in a board-approved rehabilitation program.
    - "(5) Abstention from the use of alcohol or drugs.
    - "(6) Random fluid testing for alcohol or drugs.
  - "(7) Compliance with laws and regulations governing the practice of pharmacy.
  - "(d) The board may initiate disciplinary proceedings to revoke or suspend any probationary certificate of licensure for any violation of the terms and conditions of probation. Upon satisfactory completion of probation, the board shall convert the probationary certificate to a regular certificate, free of conditions.

### 10. Section 118 of the Code states:

"(a) The withdrawal of an application for a license after it has been filed with a board in the department shall not, unless the board has consented in writing to such withdrawal, deprive the board of its authority to institute or continue a proceeding against the applicant for the denial of the license upon any ground provided by law or to enter an order denying the license upon any such ground.

- "(b) The suspension, expiration, or forfeiture by operation of law of a license issued by a board in the department, or its suspension, forfeiture, or cancellation by order of the board or by order of a court of law, or its surrender without the written consent of the board, shall not, during any period in which it may be renewed, restored, reissued, or reinstated, deprive the board of its authority to institute or continue a disciplinary proceeding against the licensee upon any ground provided by law or to enter an order suspending or revoking the license or otherwise taking disciplinary action against the licensee on any such ground.
- "(c) As used in this section, 'board' includes an individual who is authorized by any provision of this code to issue, suspend, or revoke a license, and 'license' includes 'certificate,' 'registration,' and 'permit.'"

# FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE (Dishonest Act) .

- 11. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301 (f) and (j) in that while working as pharmacy technician at Mercy Community Hospital in Merced, respondent was observed taking Soma, aka Carisprodil 350 mg. tablets from the pharmacy without a prescription. The circumstances are as follows:
- a. Between April and June of 2009, large quantities of Soma were missing from the pharmacy stock at Mercy Community Hospital. On or about July 31, 2009, a video surveilance was set up in the pharmacy area.
- b. On or about August 4, 2009, Respondent was observed removing a handful of loose tablets of Soma from the pharmacy bin. There were no prescriptions filled for Soma on that date.
- c. On or about August 5, 2009, Respondent was observed removing a unit dose of Soma from the pharmacy bin. A unit dose consists of ten tablets. There were no prescriptions filled for Soma on that date.

## SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE (Possession)

12. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4060 in that she possessed Soma without a prescription therefor, as set forth above in paragraphs 11 (a) through (c).

### PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 64537, issued to Angela Marie Ridge
- 2. Ordering Angela Marie Ridge to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3;
  - 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
