18	<u>PARTIES</u>		
19	1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity		
20	as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.		
21	2. On or about February 16, 2007, the Board of Pharmacy (Board) issued Pharmacy		
22	Technician Registration No. TCH 74159 to Nelson Grodoaldo Portillo, also known as Nelson		
23	Groaldo Portillo (Respondent). The Pharmacy Technician Registration was in full force and		
24	effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on May 31, 2012, unless		
25	renewed.		
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JURISDICTION

- 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.
- 4. Section 118, subdivision (b) provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration of a license shall not deprive the Board jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued or reinstated.

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

5. Section 492 states:

"Notwithstanding any other provision of law, successful completion of any diversion program under the Penal Code, or successful completion of an alcohol and drug problem assessment program under Article 5 (commencing with section 23249.50) of Chapter 12 of Division 11 of the Vehicle Code, shall not prohibit any agency established under Division 2 ([Healing Arts] commencing with Section 500) of this code, or any initiative act referred to in that division, from taking disciplinary action against a licensee or from denying a license for professional misconduct, notwithstanding that evidence of that misconduct may be recorded in a record pertaining to an arrest.

"This section shall not be construed to apply to any drug diversion program operated by any agency established under Division 2 (commencing with Section 500) of this code, or any initiative act referred to in that division."

6. Section 4060 states, in pertinent part:

"No person shall possess any controlled substance, except that furnished to a person upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7, or furnished pursuant to a drug order issued by a certified nurse-midwife pursuant to Section 2746.51, a nurse practitioner pursuant to Section 2836.1, or a physician assistant pursuant to Section 3502.1, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.5, or a pharmacist pursuant to either subparagraph (D) of paragraph (4) of, or clause (iv) of subparagraph (A) of paragraph (5) of, subdivision (a) of Section 4052. This section shall not apply to the possession of any controlled substance by a manufacturer, wholesaler, pharmacy,

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FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Possession of a Controlled Substance)

Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivisions (j) and 11. (o), in conjunction with Health and Safety Code section 11054, subdivision (d)(13), for violating section 4060, in that Respondent was found to be in possession of marijuana, a controlled substance. The underlying circumstances thereof are as follows: On or about January 27, 2010, Respondent was sitting in the front passenger seat of a vehicle that was parked behind a shopping complex. Another male individual ("J.S.") was sitting in the driver's seat of that same vehicle. While on routine patrol in a black and white marked police vehicle, two officers from the Los Angeles Police Department stopped and asked Respondent and J.S. what they were doing. J.S. responded by admitting that he and Respondent were "about to smoke some weed". The officers then exited their squad car and proceeded to walk over to J.S. and Respondent, who were still seated in their vehicle. At such time, one of the officers detected a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the interior of J.S. and Respondent's vehicle. One of the officers then observed what turned out to be a considerable amount of marijuana stored in a clear plastic container and a black digital scale lying on the passenger-side floorboard next to Respondent's feet. Thereafter, Respondent admitted to the officers that the marijuana and the black digital scale belonged to him. Respondent was then arrested for violating Health and Safety Code section 11359 (possession of marijuana for sale) and Health and Safety Code section 11357, subdivision (b) (possession of marijuana, less than one ounce).

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board issue a decision:

1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 74159, issued to Nelson Grodoaldo Portillo;

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1	2. Ordering Nelson Grodoaldo Portillo to pay the Board the reasonable costs of the	
2	investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section	
3	125.3; and	
4	3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
