18	<u>PARTIES</u>		
19	1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity		
20	as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.		
21	2. On or about May 24, 1983, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacist License		
22	Number RPH 37814 to Dorian Norse Lange (Respondent). The Pharmacist License was in full		
23	force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on November		
24	30, 2012, unless renewed.		
25	<u>JURISDICTION</u>		
26	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of		
27	Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the		
28	Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.		
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COST RECOVERY

10. Section 125.3 of the Code states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

DRUGS

11. Propecia, Zithromax, Medrol, and Gianvi are all dangerous drugs as designated by Code section 4022.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Acts Involving Moral Turpitude, Dishonesty Fraud, Deceit or Corruption)

- 12. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (f) in that he committed acts involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit or corruption. The circumstances are as follows:
- 13. During 2010, all the specific dates which are not known, Respondent removed drugs from the pharmacy stock at Pharmacy Advantage, without a prescription, while working as a licensed pharmacist. Respondent admitted verbally and in writing that he stole the following dangerous drugs: two tablets of Medrol, one hundred tablets of finasteride (the generic name for Propecia), and a package of Zithromax for his own use. In addition, Respondent admitting to stealing a container of Gianvi, a dangerous drug, which he provided to his daughter, and to stealing two bottles of over the counter eye drops.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Violation of State or Federal Statutes Regulating Dangerous Drugs)

- 14. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (j) in that he violated the statutes of this state regulating dangerous drugs. The circumstances are as follows:
- a. During 2010, all the specific dates which are not known, Respondent violated Code section 4059, subdivision (a), in that he furnished dangerous drugs to himself without a prescription, as set forth more fully in paragraph 13, above.

b. During 2010, all of the specific dates which are not known, Respondent violated Code section 4081 in that he failed to maintain required records for the dangerous drugs he stole from Pharmacy Advantage, which are set forth more fully in paragraph 13, above.

THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Acts or Omissions Constituting Unprofessional Conduct)

- 15. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4301, on the grounds of unprofessional conduct as defined in Code section 4306.5, in that during 2010, all of the specific dates which are not known, Respondent committed acts or omissions that constituted unprofessional conduct. The circumstances are as follows:
- a. Respondent committed acts or omissions that involve, in whole or in part, the inappropriate exercise of his education, training, or experience as a pharmacist, as set forth more fully in paragraphs 13 and 14, above.
- b. Respondent committed acts or omissions that involve, in whole or in part, the failure to exercise or implement his best professional judgment or corresponding responsibility with regard to the dispensing or furnishing of dangerous drugs, as forth more fully in paragraphs 13 and 14, above.
- c. Respondent committed acts or omissions that involve, in whole or in part, the failure to consult appropriate patient, prescription, and other records pertaining to the performance of any pharmacy function, as set forth more fully in paragraphs 13 and 14, above.
- d. Respondent committed acts or omissions that involve, in whole or in part, the failure to fully maintain and retain appropriate patient-specific information pertaining to the performance of any pharmacy function, as set forth more fully in paragraphs 13 and 14, above.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

Revoking or suspending Pharmacist License Number RPH 37814, issued to Dorian
 Norse Lange;

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1	2.	Ordering Dorian Norse Lange to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of
2	the investi	gation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section
3	125.3;
