19	1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) brings th	is Accusation solely in her official capacity	
20	as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, I	Department of Consumer Affairs (Board).	
21	2. On or about August 11, 2006, the Board issued Pharmacy Technician Registration		
22	No. TCH 71231 to Paul Wesley Moore (Respondent). The Pharmacy Technician Registration		
23	was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on		
24	August 31, 2014, unless renewed.

26	3. This Accusation is brought before the Be	oard under the authority of the following	
27	laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.		
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1	STATUTORY PROVISIONS	
2	4. Section 490 provides that a board may suspend or revoke a license on the ground that	
3	the licensee has been convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or	
4	duties of the business or profession for which the license was issued	
5	5. Section 4300, subdivision (a), states that [e]very license issued may be suspended or	
6	revoked."	
7	6. Section 4300.1 states:	
8	"The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by	
9	operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license	
10	on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board	
11	of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary	
12	proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license."	
13	7. Section 4301 states, in pertinent part	
14	"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional	
15	conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake.	
16	Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:	
17		
18	"(f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or	
19	corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and	
20	whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.	
21		
22	"(I) The conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and	
23	duties of a licensee under this chapter "	
24	REGULATORY PROVISION	
25	8. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, states:	
26	"For the purpose of denial, suspension, or revocation of a personal or facility license	
27	pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and Professions Code, a	
28	crime or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a	
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1	licensee or registrant if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of a	
2	licensee or registrant to perform the functions authorized by his license or registration in a manner	
3	consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare."	
4	COST RECOVERY	
5	9. Section 125.3 states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative	
6	law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing	
7	act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the	
8	case.	
9	FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
10	(Conviction of a Substantially Related Crime)	
11	10. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under sections 490, 4300, and 4301,	
12	subdivision (I), on conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, in that	
13	on or about March 12, 2013, Respondent was convicted of a crime substantially related to the	
14	qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or registrant which to a substantial degree	
15	evidences his present or potential unfitness to perform the functions authorized by his license or	
16	registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare. The circumstances	
17	of the conviction are as follows:	
18	a. On or about March 12, 2013, after pleading nolo contendere, Respondent was	
19	convicted of one felony count of violating Penal Code section 245(a)(1) [assault with a deadly	
20	weapon in association with Penal Code section 186.22(b)(1), criminal profiteering of a street	
21	gang] in the criminal proceeding entitled The People of the State of California v. Paul Wesley	
22	Moore (Super. Ct. Los Angeles County, 2012, No. BA382454). The Court sentenced Respondent	
23	to seven (7) years prison, and ordered him to register as a street gang member.	
24	b. The circumstances underlying the conviction are that on or about January 27, 2011,	
25	Respondent, also known as "Villen," with another male and two females left a night club and	
26	followed two other males (victims). Respondent engaged in an escalated verbal to physical	
27	altercation with the two male victims wherein he stabbed both victims, and left the scene holding	
28	a bloody knife. One victim received emergency medical treatment for 15 stab wounds (1 to the	
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1	head, 7 to his back left side, 3 to his left arm, 2 to his right hip, 1 to his buttocks and 1 to his back	
2	right side), the other victim received emergency medical treatment for a single stab wound to his	
3	left side of his stomach.	
4	c. After investigation for the above incident, on or about March 24, 2011, an arrest and	
5	search warrant was executed on Respondent and his residence; Respondent was arrested. On or	
6	about December 16, 2011, Respondent was arrested for the same incident on an arrest warrant.	
7	SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
8	(Acts of Moral Turpitude, Dishonesty, Fraud, Deceit or Corruption)	
9	11. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under sections 4300, 4301,	
10	subdivision (f), on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that on or about January 27, 2011,	
11	Respondent committed acts involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption.	
12	Complainant refers to and by this reference incorporates the allegations set forth above in	
13	paragraph 10, subparagraphs a, b and c, inclusive, as though set forth fully.	
14	THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
15	(Unprofessional Conduct)	
16	12. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, in that Respondent	
17	committed acts of unprofessional conduct. Complainant refers to and by this reference	
18	incorporates the allegations set forth above in paragraphs 10 and 11, inclusive, as though set forth	
19	fully.	
20	DISCIPLINE CONSIDERATIONS	
21	13. To determine the degree of discipline, Complainant alleges that:	
22	a. On or about September 27, 2010, the Board issued Respondent administrative	
23	Citation No. CI 2007 36987 alleging violations of section 4301, subdivisions (h) [dangerous use	
24	of alcohol], (f) [acts of moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit or corruption],	
25	and (1) [conviction of a substantially related crime] with \$800.00 in fines. That Citation is now	
26	final and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth.	
27	b. On or about March 13, 2008, after pleading nolo contendere, Respondent was	
28	convicted of one interlineated misdemeanor count of violating Vehicle ode section 12500(a)	
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1	[unlicensed driver] in the criminal proceeding entitled The People of the State of California v.	
2	Paul Wesley Moore (Super. Ct. Los Angeles County, 2008, No. 8MP02774). The Court	
3	sentenced Respondent to 10 days jail, and placed him on 36 months probation. The circumstances	
4	underlying the conviction occurred on or about July 12, 2007.	
5	c. On or about May 14, 2007, after pleading nolo contendere, Respondent was convicted	
6	of one misdemeanor count of violating Vehicle code section 23152(b) [drive with an equal to or	
7	greater than 0.08% BAC] in the criminal proceeding entitled The People of the State of California	
8	v. Paul Wesley Moore (Super. Ct. Los Angeles County, 2007, No. 7EA031020). The Court	
9	sentenced respondent to 13 days jail, placed him on 36 months probation, and ordered him to	
10	complete a Three-Month First-Offender Alcohol Program. The circumstances underlying the	
11	conviction occurred on or about February 2, 2007.	
12	PRAYER	
13	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,	
14	and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:	
15	1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 71231, issued to	
16	Paul Wesley Moore;	
17	2. Ordering Paul Wesley Moore to pay the Board the reasonable costs of the	
18	investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to section 125.3; and	
19	3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
