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Accusation Against Eric Soria (Case No. 4868)

3. This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.

- 4. Code section 4300 provides that every license issued by the Board may be revoked or suspended and that proceedings to discipline a license are to be conducted according to the Administrative Procedure Act (Gov. Code, §§ 11370, et seq.).
- 5. Code section 4300.1 provides that the "expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license."

## **STATUTES**

6. Section 4301 of the Code states, in pertinent part:

The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

- (f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.
- (j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, or any other state, or of the United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.
- (o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency.
  - (p) Actions or conduct that would have warranted denial of a license.

## **DRUG STATUTES**

## 7. Section 4059 states, in pertinent part:

(a) A person may not furnish any dangerous drug, except upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7. A person may not furnish any dangerous device, except upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7.

## 8. Section 4060 of the Code states:

No person shall possess any controlled substance, except that furnished to a person upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7, or furnished pursuant to a drug order issued by a certified nurse-midwife pursuant to Section 2746.51, a nurse practitioner pursuant to Section 2836.1, or a physician assistant pursuant to Section 3502.1, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.5, or a pharmacist pursuant to either subparagraph (D) of paragraph (4) of, or clause (iv) of subparagraph (A) of paragraph (5) of, subdivision (a) of Section 4052. This section shall not apply to the possession of any controlled substance by a manufacturer, wholesaler, pharmacy, pharmacist, physician, podiatrist, dentist, optometrist, veterinarian, naturopathic doctor, certified nurse-midwife, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant, when in stock in containers correctly labeled with the name and address of the supplier or producer.

Nothing in this section authorizes a certified nurse-midwife, a nurse practitioner, a physician assistant, or a naturopathic doctor, to order his or her own stock of dangerous drugs and devices.

## 9. Health and Safety Code section 11173 states, in pertinent part:

(a) No person shall obtain or attempt to obtain controlled substances, or procure or attempt to procure the administration of or prescription for controlled substances, (1) by fraud, deceit, misrepresentation, or subterfuge; or (2) by the concealment of a material fact.

## 10. Health and Safety Code section 11350 states, in pertinent part:

(a) Except as otherwise provided in this division, every person who possesses (1) any controlled substance specified in subdivision (b), (c), (e), or paragraph (1) of subdivision (f) of Section 11054, specified in paragraph (14), (15), or (20) of subdivision (d) of Section 11054, or specified in subdivision (b) or (c) of Section 11055, or specified in subdivision (h) of Section 11056, or (2) any controlled substance classified in Schedule III, IV, or V which is a narcotic drug, unless upon the written prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, or veterinarian licensed to practice in this state, shall be punished by imprisonment in a county jail for not more than one year, except that such person shall instead be punished pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code if that person has one or more prior convictions for an offense specified in clause (iv) of subparagraph (C) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (e) of Section 667 of the Penal Code or for an offense requiring registration pursuant to subdivision (c) of Section 290 of the Penal Code.

15. Vicodin is a brand name for acetaminophen and hydrocodone. The drug operates as a pain reliever and is indicated for moderate to severe pain. Vicodin is considered a dangerous drug and a narcotic drug. It is classified as a Schedule III controlled substance. (Bus. & Prof. Code, § 4022; Health & Saf. Code, § 11056, subd. (e)(7).)

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 16. From approximately February 2010 to September 20, 2011, CVS Pharmacy employed Respondent as a Pharmacy Technician at one of its stores in Lynwood.
- 17. On or about September 16, 2010, police served a search warrant on Respondent's home in Paramount. In a converted garage Respondent used as a bedroom, police found a bottle of 13 Vicodin pills and another bottle containing 16 pills of acetaminophen and codeine. The bottle of Vicodin carried a label that indicated the prescription was not Respondent's. The other bottle's label was peeled away so that the patient's name was not visible. A Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department deputy asked Respondent if the two prescription bottles belonged to him. Respondent said, "yeah, they are mine." He admitted that he did not have a prescription for either drug.
- 18. On or about May 4, 2011, Respondent was driving his car in Paramount when he was stopped for having modified lights and tinted windows. During the enforcement stop, police found a bottle of 24 Soma pills in the glove box. Respondent did not have a prescription for Soma.
- 19. On or about September 4, 2011, Respondent stole a bottle of promethazine with codeine from the CVS Pharmacy where he worked. He then passed the promethazine with codeine through the drive-through window to another CVS employee. The employee did not have a prescription for the substance and did not pay for it. Respondent knew that the drug's recipient did not have a prescription for the drug.
- 20. Between February 2010 and September 20, 2011, Respondent conspired with pharmacy technician Juan Luis Alarcón (TCH 82087) and another coworker to divert dangerous drugs and controlled substances from CVS Pharmacy in Lynwood. Respondent diverted dangerous drugs and controlled substances approximately seven times during the life of the

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## THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

## (Violate Pharmacy Act)

23. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subdivision (o), for unprofessional conduct in that he violated and aided and abetted another in violating provisions of the Pharmacy Act and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy. Complainant realleges paragraphs 13–22.

## FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

## (Conduct Warranting Denial)

24. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subdivision (p), for unprofessional conduct in that Respondent committed acts that would have warranted denial of a license. Complainant realleges paragraphs 13–23.

## **PRAYER**

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 102812, issued to Eric Soria;
- 2. Ordering Eric Soria to pay the Board the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to section 125.3; and,
  - 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
