19	1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as	
20	the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs.	
21	2. On or about May 14, 1996, the Board issued Pharmacy Technician Registration	
22 23	Number TCH 19116 to Ronald Allen Faria (Respondent). The Pharmacy Technician Registration	
24	was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on	
25	October 31, 2015, unless renewed. JURISDICTION	
26	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following laws	
27	All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.	
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- 4. Code section 4300 states:
- "(a) Every license issued may be suspended or revoked.
- "(b) The board shall discipline the holder of any license issued by the board, whose default has been entered or whose case has been heard by the board and found guilty, by any of the following methods:
 - "(1) Suspending judgment.
 - "(2) Placing him or her upon probation.
 - "(3) Suspending his or her right to practice for a period not exceeding one year.
 - "(4) Revoking his or her license.
- "(5) Taking any other action in relation to disciplining him or her as the board in its discretion may deem proper.

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- "(e) The proceedings under this article shall be conducted in accordance with Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of the Government Code, and the board shall have all the powers granted therein. The action shall be final, except that the propriety of the action is subject to review by the superior court pursuant to Section 1094.5 of the Code of Civil Procedure."
 - 5. Code section 4300.1 states:

"The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license."

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

6. Code section 4060 states:

"A person shall not possess any controlled substance, except that furnished to a person upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7, or furnished pursuant to a drug order issued by a certified nurse-

midwife pursuant to Section 2746.51, a nurse practitioner pursuant to Section 2836.1, a physician assistant pursuant to Section 3502.1, a naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.5, or a pharmacist pursuant to Section 4052.1, 4052.2, or 4052.6. This section does not apply to the possession of any controlled substance by a manufacturer, wholesaler, pharmacy, pharmacist, physician, podiatrist, dentist, optometrist, veterinarian, naturopathic doctor, certified nurse-midwife, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant, if in stock in containers correctly labeled with the name and address of the supplier or producer.

"This section does not authorize a certified nurse-midwife, a nurse practitioner, a physician assistant, or a naturopathic doctor, to order his or her own stock of dangerous drugs and devices.

7. Code section 4301 of the Code states:

"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake.

Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

"...

"(h) The administering to oneself, of any controlled substance, or the use of any dangerous drug or of alcoholic beverages to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to oneself, to a person holding a license under this chapter, or to any other person or to the public, or to the extent that the use impairs the ability of the person to conduct with safety to the public the practice authorized by the license.

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"(j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, or any other state, or of the United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.

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"(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency.

8. Code section 4327 states:

" Any person who, while on duty, sells, dispenses or compounds any drug while under the influence of any dangerous drug or alcoholic beverages shall be guilty of a misdemeanor."

9. Health and Safety Code section 11170 states, "No person shall prescribe, administer, or furnish a controlled substance for himself."

DANGEROUS DRUGS/CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

10. Code section 4022 states:

"Dangerous drug" or "dangerous device" means any drug or device unsafe for self-use in humans or animals, and includes the following:

- "(a) Any drug that bears the legend: "Caution: federal law prohibits dispensing without prescription," "Rx only," or words of similar import.
- "(b) Any device that bears the statement: "Caution: federal law restricts this device to sale by or on the order of a ______," "Rx only," or words of similar import, the blank to be filled in with the designation of the practitioner licensed to use or order use of the device.
- "(c) Any other drug or device that by federal or state law can be lawfully dispensed only on prescription or furnished pursuant to Section 4006."
- 11. Marijuana is a Schedule I controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11054, subdivision (d) (13), and a dangerous drug as designated by Code section 4022.
- 12. Oxazepam is a Schedule IV controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11057, subdivision (d)(23), and a dangerous drug as designated by Code section 4022, used to treat alcohol withdrawal and anxiety.
- 13. Temazepam is a Schedule IV controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11057, subdivision (d)(29), and a dangerous drug as designated by Code section 4022, used to treat insomnia.

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COST RECOVERY

14. Code section 125.3 states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

<u>FACTS</u>

- 15. On or about October 2, 2013, Respondent was under the influence of a controlled substance and dangerous drugs while on duty as a pharmacy technician for Clayworth Healthcare Pharmacy in Castro Valley, California.
- 16. On or about October 7, 2013, Respondent submitted to a blood drug test at work and tested positive for marijuana, oxazepam, and temazepam. Respondent did not have valid prescriptions for these drugs or a medical marijuana card.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Compounding While Under the Influence of Drugs or Alcohol)

17. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subdivisions (j) and/or (o), and/or section 4327 in that he compounded drugs while under the influence of a dangerous drug and/or alcohol, as set forth in paragraph 15, above.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Self-Administration of Controlled Substance)

18. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subdivision (h), and/or Health and Safety Code section 11170, in that Respondent administered to himself controlled substances, as set forth in paragraphs 15 and 16, above.

THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unlawful Possession of Controlled Substance)

19. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subdivisions (j) and/or (o), and/or section 4060, in that he tested positive for marijuana, oxazepam, and temazepam without possessing valid prescriptions, as set forth in paragraph 16, above.

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FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 1 (Unprofessional Conduct) 2 Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, in that he acted 20. 3 unprofessionally, as set forth in paragraphs 15 and 16, above. 4 PRAYER 5 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, 6 and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision: 7 Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 19116, 1. 8 issued to Ronald Allen Faria; 9 Ordering Ronald Allen Faria to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the 10 investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 11 125.3; 12 Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper. 3. 13 14 15 7/26/14 16 17 Executive Officer 18 Board of Pharmacy Department of Consumer Affairs 19 State of California Complainant 20 21 SF2014408172 40972173.doc 22 23 24 25 26 27

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
