Complainant brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as the Executive 20 Officer of the Board of Pharmacy ("Board"), Department of Consumer Affairs. 21 2. On or about November 25, 2013, the Board issued Pharmacy Technician License 22 Number TCH 134139 to Destiny Hazewood Dorsey ("Respondent"). The license was in full 23 force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on 24 November 30, 2015, unless renewed. 25 /// 26 /// 27 111 28 1// 1

7. Code section 125.3 provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being

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renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be included in a stipulated settlement.

#### DRUGS

8. Cocaine is a Schedule II controlled substance as designated in Health and Safety Code section 11055, subdivision (b)(6), and a dangerous drug within the meaning of Code section 4022.

### **BACKGROUND**

9. On or about March 23, 2014, Respondent was a passenger in a vehicle that had been pulled over by a peace officer. The officer searched the vehicle and found Cocaine wrapped up inside of a ten dollar bill. Respondent admitted that the Cocaine belonged to her, and that she had snorted some of it the previous night at a party. Respondent also admitted that she uses Cocaine on occasion.

## FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

## (Unprofessional Conduct - Violation of State Laws Regulating Controlled Substances)

10. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4301(j), on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that on or about March 23, 2014, while a licensed pharmacy technician, Respondent violated Health & Safety Code section 11350(a) (possession of a controlled substance, to wit: Cocaine, a felony) and Health and Safety Code section 11170 (self-administered a controlled substance, to wit: Cocaine), as more particularly set forth above in paragraph 9.

#### SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

#### (Self-Administered a Controlled Substance)

11. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4301(h), on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that on or about March 22, 2014, while a licensed pharmacy technician, Respondent self-administered Cocaine, a controlled substance, to the extent or in a manner dangerous or injurious to oneself, as more particularly set forth above in paragraph 9.

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# **PRAYER** 1 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, 2 and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision: 3 1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 134139, 4 issued to Destiny Hazewood Dorsey; 5 2.
