23	2. On or about October 17, 2011, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician	
24	Registration Number 116216 to Amber Nicole Denna (Respondent). The Pharmacy Technician	
25	Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and	
26	will expire on December 31, 2016, unless renewed.	
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(AMBER NICOLE DENNA) ACCUSATION

JURISDICTION

- 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws: All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.
 - 4. Section 4300 of the Code states, in pertinent part:
 - "(a) Every license issued may be suspended or revoked. . . . "
 - 5. Section 4300.1 of the Code states:

"The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license."

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

6. Section 4022 of the Code states:

"Dangerous drug" or "dangerous device" means any drug or device unsafe for self use in humans or animals, and includes the following:

- "(a) Any drug that bears the legend: "Caution: federal law prohibits dispensing without prescription," "Rx only," or words of similar import.
- "(b) Any device that bears the statement: "Caution: federal law restricts this device to sale by or on the order of a ______," "Rx only," or words of similar import, the blank to be filled in with the designation of the practitioner licensed to use or order use of the device.
- "(c) Any other drug or device that by federal or state law can be lawfully dispensed only on prescription or furnished pursuant to Section 4006."
 - 7. Section 4301 of the Code states, in pertinent part:

"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake.

Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

··..

- "(h) The administering to oneself, of any controlled substance, or the use of any dangerous drug or of alcoholic beverages to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to oneself, to a person holding a license under this chapter, or to any other person or to the public, or to the extent that the use impairs the ability of the person to conduct with safety to the public the practice authorized by the license. . . . "
- 8. Section 4327 of the Code states, "Any person who, while on duty, sells, dispenses or compounds any drug while under the influence of any dangerous drug or alcoholic beverages shall be guilty of a misdemeanor."

COST RECOVERY

9. Section 125.3 of the Code states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

- 10. "Carisoprodol" is a muscle-relaxant and sedative. It is a dangerous drug as defined in Code section 4022 and a schedule IV controlled substance as defined by section 1308.14(c)(6) of Title 21 of the Code of Federal Regulations, and Health and Safety Code section 11057(d)(18).
- 11. "Xanax," a trade name for "Alprazolam," is a dangerous drug as defined in Code section 4022 and a schedule IV controlled substance as defined by section 1308.14(c)(2) of Title 21 of the Code of Federal Regulations, and Health and Safety Code section 11057(d)(2). Alprazolam is a psychotropic triazolo analogue of the 1,4 benzodiazepine class of central nervous system-active compounds.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Working While Under the Influence of Controlled Substances)

12. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4327 of the Code in that on or about January 2015 and March 10, 2015, while on duty as a pharmacy technician at Paradise Drug, located in Paradise, California, Respondent sold and dispensed drugs while under the influence of dangerous drugs. The circumstances are as follows:

- 13. In or about January 2015, the Pharmacist-in-Charge at Paradise Drug observed Respondent as being shaky and rigid with enlarged pupils and a look of stupor, and needing to lean against the counter to support herself while performing her duties as a pharmacy technician. The Pharmacist-in-Charge instructed another employee to take Respondent home. A few days later, Respondent told the Pharmacist-in-Charge that she took two tablets of Carisoprodol on the day of the incident and she attributed her symptoms to the ingestion of the Carisoprodol.
- 14. On or about March 10, 2015, the Pharmacist-in-Charge at Paradise Drug noticed Respondent slur her speech when answering the telephone. The Pharmacist-in-Charge observed Respondent as being dazed, unable to walk straight, and needing to support herself against the wall. The Pharmacist-in-Charge immediately relieved Respondent from work. The next day, Respondent told the Pharmacist-in-Charge that she took a tablet of Alprazolam.
- 15. On or about April 2, 2015, Respondent informed Inspector H. N. that when she took the Alprazolam on March 10, 2015, it "hit" her hard and made her "felt drunk" for about fifteen minutes.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct—Self-Administration of Controlled Substances in a Dangerous or Injurious Manner)

16. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301(h) of the Code in that on or about January 2015 and March 10, 2015, Respondent self-administered controlled substances to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to herself, to a person holding a license under this chapter, or to any other person or to the public, or to the extent that the use impaired the ability of Respondent to conduct with safety to the public the practice authorized by the license. The circumstances are described with more particularity in paragraphs 13-15.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number 116216, issued o Amber Nicole Denna;
- 2. Ordering Amber Nicole Denna to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and
 - 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
