## FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

# (Self-Administration of Controlled Substances)

8. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (h) of the Code in that she self-administered controlled substances/dangerous drugs, without a prescription. Specifically, on August 17, 2015, Ventura County Sheriff's Department deputies responded to a report of people drinking and being loud in a parking lot. Upon arrival, the deputies contacted four subjects, one of which was Respondent. The deputies observed that Respondent displayed signs and symptoms of being under the influence of a controlled substance. Respondent admitted to taking prescription medication and to drinking alcohol all day. Respondent also admitted that there was methamphetamine<sup>1</sup> in the drink being shared among the group and that she felt the effects of methamphetamine.<sup>2</sup>

### SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

## (Violation of Statutes Regulating Controlled Substances and Dangerous Drugs)

9. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivisions (j) and (o) of the Code in that Respondent violated Health and Safety Code section 11550, subdivision (a), a pharmacy law of the State of California regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs. The conduct is described in more particularity in paragraph 8 above, inclusive, and hereby incorporated by reference.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> On or about August 30, 2016, Respondent pled guilty to one misdemeanor count of violating Health and Safety Code section 11550(a) [under the influence of a controlled substance] in the criminal proceeding entitled *The People of the State of California v. Yvonne Armas* (Super. Ct., County of Venutra, Case No. 2015026245). Respondent was placed on a deferred entry of judgment program for a period of 24 months, with terms and conditions.

- 1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 27203, issued to Yvonne Armas;
- 2. Ordering Yvonne Armas to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3;
  - 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
