Complainant alleges:

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PARTIES

2 Virginia Herold (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity 1. 3 as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs. 4 2. On or about June 8, 1992, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Permit Number 5 PHY 37949 to Brighton Way Pharmacy Inc. and Lucena Holdings LLC dba West Wilshire 6 Pharmacy (Respondent Pharmacy). The Board's records reflect that West Wilshire Pharmacy is 7 under corporate ownership with the majority (90%) held by Brighton Way Pharmacy, Inc. and the 8 minority (10%) by Lucena Holdings LLC. Brighton Way Pharmacy, Inc. is a California 9 corporation and Lucena Holdings LLC is a Delaware limited liability company. The Board's 10records reflect that Shahrokh Makhani was the President of Brighton Way Pharmacy, Inc. from 11 June 8, 1992 to January 29, 2016.¹ Shahrokh Makhani, RPH 35054, was the Pharmacist-in-12 Charge from June 8, 1992 to December 8, 2014. Aisan Khalilian fka Aisan Zargarian, RPH 13 70509, was the Pharmacist-in-Charge from December 2, 2014 to January 29, 2016. The 14 Pharmacy Permit expired on January 29, 2016, and was cancelled on April 7, 2016. 15 3. On or about December 11, 1979, the Board of Pharmacy issued Original Pharmacist 16 License Number RPH 35054 to Shahrokh Makhani (Respondent Makhani). The Pharmacist 17 License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will 18 expire on September 30, 2018, unless renewed. 19 4. On or about March 14, 2014, the Board of Pharmacy issued Original Pharmacist 20License Number RPH 70509 to Aisan Khalilian fka Aisan Zargarian (Respondent Zargarian). 21 The Pharmacist License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought 2.2herein and will expire on May 31, 2019, unless renewed. 23 /// 24 /// 25 26 ¹ On January 6, 2015, Brighton Way Pharmacy, Inc. filed an Amended Statement of Information, which listed Sherri D. Leon as the Chief Executive Officer, Secretary and Financial 27 Officer and listed Sherri D. Leon, Gregory Blaszczynski, and James Fleming as the only directors. Shahrokh Makhani was not listed as an officer or as a director of Brighton Way Pharmacy. Inc. 28 2 (WEST WILSHIRE PHARMACY, ET AL.) ACCUSATION

1	JURISDICTION		
2	5. This Accusation is brought before the California State Board of Pharmacy (Board),		
3	Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section		
4	references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.		
5	6. Section 4300 of the Code provides, in part, that every license issued by the Board is		
6	subject to discipline, including suspension or revocation.		
7	7. Section 4300.1 of the Code states:		
8	"The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by		
9	operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license		
10	on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board		
11	of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary		
12	proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license."		
13	8. Section 4302 of the Code states:		
14	"The board may deny, suspend, or revoke any license of a corporation where conditions		
15	exist in relation to any person holding 10 percent or more of the corporate stock of the		
16	corporation, or where conditions exist in relation to any officer or director of the corporation that		
17	would constitute grounds for disciplinary action against a licensee."		
18	9. Section 4113 of the Code states, in part:		
19	"(c) The pharmacist-in-charge shall be responsible for a pharmacy's compliance with all		
20	state and federal laws and regulations pertaining to the practice of pharmacy."		
21	STATUTORY AND REGULATORY AUTHORITY		
22	10. Section 4301 of the Code states:		
23	"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional		
24	conduct or whose license has been issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is		
25	not limited to, any of the following:		
26	(a) Procurement of a license by fraud or misrepresentation.		
27	• • •		
28	(f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or

corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and
 whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.

3 (g) Knowingly making or signing any certificate or other document that falsely represents
4 the existence or nonexistence of a state of facts.

(j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, of any other state, or of the UnitedStates regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.

9 (o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the
10 violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable
11 federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by
12 the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency."

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11. Section 4307 of the Code states, in pertinent part:

Any person who has been denied a license or whose license has been revoked or is "(a) 14 under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or 15 who has been a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or 16 any other person with management or control of any partnership, corporation, trust, firm, or 17 association whose application for a license has been denied or revoked, is under suspension or has 18 been placed on probation, and while acting as the manager, administrator, owner, member, 19 officer, director, associate, partner, or any other person with management or control had 20knowledge of or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the license was denied, 21revoked, suspended, or placed on probation, shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, 22 administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or in any other position with 23 management or control of a licensee as follows: 24

(1) Where a probationary license is issued or where an existing license is placed on
probation, this prohibition shall remain in effect for a period not to exceed five years.

(2) Where the license is denied or revoked, the prohibition shall continue until the license
is issued or reinstated."

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Section 4201 of the Code states: 12.

"(a) Each application to conduct a pharmacy, wholesaler, third-party logistics provider, 2 veterinary food-animal drug retailer, or outsourcing facility shall be made on a form furnished by 3 the board and shall state the name, address, usual occupation, and professional qualifications, if 4 any, of the applicant. If the applicant is other than a natural person, the application shall state the 5 information as to each person beneficially interested therein or any person with management or 6 control over the license. 7

"(b) As used in this section, and subject to subdivision (c), the term "person beneficially 8 9 interested" means and includes:

(1) If the applicant is a partnership or other unincorporated association, each partner or 10 member. 11

(2) If the applicant is a corporation, each of its officers, directors, and stockholders, 12 provided that a natural person shall not be deemed to be beneficially interested in a nonprofit 13 corporation. 14

(3) If the applicant is a limited liability company, each officer, manager, or member.

(c) If the applicant is a partnership or other unincorporated association, a limited liability 16 company, or a corporation, and the number of partners, members, or stockholders, as the case may 17 be, exceeds five, the application shall so state, and shall further state the information required by 18 subdivision (a) as to each of the five partners, members, or stockholders who own the five largest 19 interests in the applicant entity. Upon request by the executive officer, the applicant shall furnish 20 the board with the information required by subdivision (a) as to partners, members, or 21stockholders not named in the application, or shall refer the board to an appropriate source of that 22

information. 23

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(d) The application shall contain a statement to the effect that the applicant has not been convicted of a felony and has not violated any of the provisions of this chapter. If the applicant 25 cannot make this statement, the application shall contain a statement of the violation, if any, or 26 27reasons which will prevent the applicant from being able to comply with the requirements with respect to the statement. 28

(e) Upon the approval of the application by the board and payment of the fee required by 1 this chapter for each pharmacy, wholesaler, third-party logistics provider, or veterinary food-2 animal drug retailer, the executive officer of the board shall issue a license to conduct a pharmacy, 3 wholesaler, third-party logistics provider, veterinary food-animal drug retailer, or outsourcing 4 facility if all of the provisions of this chapter have been complied with. 5

(f) Notwithstanding any other law, the pharmacy license shall authorize the holder to 6 conduct a pharmacy. The license shall be renewed annually and shall not be transferable.

(i) For licenses referred to in subdivisions (f), (g), (h), and (i), any change in the proposed 9 beneficial ownership interest shall be reported to the board within 30 days thereafter upon a form 10to be furnished by the board." 11

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Section 4076 of the Code states, in part: 13.

"(a) A pharmacist shall not dispense any prescription except in a container that meets the 13 requirements of state and federal law and is correctly labeled with all of the following: 14

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(11)(A) Commencing January 1, 2006, the physical description of the dispensed 16 medication, including its color, shape, and any identification code that appears on the tablets or 17 capsules, except as follows: 18

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(i) Prescriptions dispensed by a veterinarian.

(ii) An exemption from the requirements of this paragraph shall be granted to a new drug 20for the first 120 days that the drug is on the market and for the 90 days during which the national 21 reference file has no description on file. 2.2

(iii) Dispensed medications for which no physical description exists in any commercially 23available database." 24

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Section 4112 of the Code 14.

"(a) Any pharmacy located outside this state that ships, mails, or delivers, in any manner, 26controlled substances, dangerous drugs, or dangerous devices into this state shall be considered a 27 nonresident pharmacy. 28

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"(b) A person may not act as a nonresident pharmacy unless he or she has obtained a license from the board. The board may register a nonresident pharmacy that is organized as a limited liability company in the state in which it is licensed."

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15. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1709 states:

5 "(a) Each permit to operate a pharmacy shall show the name and address of the pharmacy,
6 the form of ownership (individual, partnership or corporation) and the pharmacist-in-charge. Each
7 pharmacy shall, in its initial application on the annual renewal form, report the name of the
8 pharmacist-in-charge, the names of all owners and the names of the corporate officers (if a
9 corporation). Any changes in the pharmacist-in-charge, or the owners, or corporate officers shall
10 be reported to the Board within 30 days.

"(b) Any transfer, in a single transaction or in a series of transactions, of 10 percent or more
of the beneficial interest in a business entity licensed by the board to a person or entity who did
not hold a beneficial interest at the time the original permit was issued, shall require written
notification to the board within 30 days.

"(c) The following shall constitute a transfer of permit and require application for a change
of ownership: any transfer of a beneficial interest in a business entity licensed by the board, in a
single transaction or in a series of transactions, to any person or entity, which transfer results in
the transferee's holding 50% or more of the beneficial interest in that license."

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FACTUAL SUMMARY

16. On or about August 16, 2013, the Board received an application for a Nonresident
 Pharmacy Permit from Philidor Rx Services, LLC., Matthew S. Davenport, CEO (Philidor Rx
 Services). Philidor Rx Services, LLC's address is 330 South Warminster Rd., Suite 350, Hatboro,
 PA 19040. The application provides that Philidor Rx Services was issued pharmacy permit
 number PP482370 on June 25, 2013, by the state of Pennsylvania. The Board denied Philidor Rx
 Services' application on or about May 14, 2014.

17. From as early as October 20, 2014, to date, Respondent Pharmacy allowed Philidor
Rx Services, a non-California licensed pharmacy, located in the state of Pennsylvania, to operate
West Wilshire Pharmacy as part of its corporation, store and dispense dangerous drugs purchased

by Philidor Rx Services, and share prescription information with Philidor Rx Services through a 1 common electronic file pharmacy computer system, despite the fact the Board had denied Philidor 2 Rx Services' Non-Resident Pharmacy Application on May 14, 2014. 3 On or about February 20, 2015, Respondents Pharmacy and Makhani filed a 18. 4 Community Pharmacy Permit Application with the Board to transfer the ownership of the 5 pharmacy permit issued to Respondent Pharmacy to Lucena Holdings LLC, and failed to disclose 6 that Philidor Rx Services was the parent corporation of Lucena Holdings LLC. Respondent 7 Pharmacy and Makhani falsely marked "No" in response to the question of "Is the parent 8 corporation or limited liability company a subsidiary?" In fact, Lucena Holdings LLC was a 9 subsidiary of Philidor Rx Services. 10 FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 11 (Obtaining License by Fraud or Misrepresentation) 12 Respondent Pharmacy is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, 19. 13 subdivisions (a), (g) and (o), in that Respondent Pharmacy obtained its license by fraud or 14 misrepresentation. Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates, the allegations set 15 forth above in paragraphs 16 through 18, as though set forth fully. 16 SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 17 (Providing False Information on Licensure Application) 18Respondent Pharmacy is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, 20. 19 subdivisions (f), (g) and (o), of the Code, for violating section 4201 of the Code and California 20Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1709, in that Respondent Pharmacy provided false 21 information on its licensure application. Complainant refers to, and by this reference 22 incorporates, the allegations set forth above in paragraphs 16 through 19, as though set forth fully. 23 THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 24 (Unlicensed Non-Resident Pharmacy) 25 Respondents Pharmacy, Makhani and Zargarian are subject to disciplinary action 21. 26 under section 4301, subdivision (o), of the Code, in that Respondent Pharmacy operated as an 27 unlicensed Non-Resident Pharmacy. The circumstances are as follows: 28 8

From as early as October 20, 2014, to date, while Respondent Makhani and 1 a. Respondent Zargarian served as the pharmacist-in-charge of Respondent Pharmacy, respectively, 2 Respondents Pharmacy, Makhani, and Zargarian allowed Philidor Rx Services, a non-California 3 licensed pharmacy, located in the state of Pennsylvania, to operate West Wilshire Pharmacy as 4 part of its corporation, store and dispense dangerous drugs purchased by Philidor Rx Services, and 5 share prescription information with Philidor Rx Services through a common electronic file 6 pharmacy computer system. Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates, the 7 allegations set forth above in paragraphs 16 through 20, as though set forth fully. 8 FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 9 (Unprofessional Conduct: 10 Violating or Attempting to Violate State or Federal Laws Governing Pharmacy) 11 22. Respondents Zargarian and Makhani are subject to disciplinary action under sections 12 4301, subdivision (o), and 4113, subdivision (c), of the Code, on the ground of unprofessional 13 conduct, in that invoices, prescription records, and pharmacy management documents obtained 14 from West Wilshire Pharmacy, demonstrate that from as early as October 20, 2014, to date, where 15 Respondent Makhani served as the pharmacist-in-charge from June 8, 1992, to December 2, 2014, 16 and Respondent Zargarian served as the pharmacist-in-charge from December 2, 2014 to January 17 29, 2016, the pharmacy allowed Philidor Rx Services, a non-California licensed pharmacy located 18in the state of Pennsylvania, to operate West Wilshire Pharmacy as part of its corporation, store 19 and dispensed dangerous medications purchased by Philidor Rx Services and share prescription 20information with Philidor Rx Services. Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates, 21 the allegations set forth above in paragraphs 16 through 21, as though set forth fully. 22FIFTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 23(Non-Conforming Prescription Labels) 24 23. Respondents Pharmacy and Zargarian are subject to disciplinary action under section 254301, subdivision (o), of the Code, for violating section 4076, subdivision (a)(1 l)(A) of the Code, 26 in that, while Respondent Zargarian was the Pharmacist-in-Charge, Respondent Pharmacy used 27 non-conforming prescription labels. The circumstances are as follows: 28 9 (WEST WILSHIRE PHARMACY, ET AL.) ACCUSATION a. On or about May 14, 2015, a Board inspection of Respondent Pharmacy's facility,
located at 6333 West Wilshire Blvd., Los Angeles, CA 90048, revealed that the pharmacy used
the pharmacy computer prescription processing software Carepoint to generate prescription labels
for the pharmacy's prescriptions, which were processed by Philidor Rx Services, a non-California
licensed pharmacy, located in the state of Pennsylvania. The prescription labels generated from
the Carepoint computer system did not include the physical description of the medication being
dispensed, as required.

OTHER MATTERS

9 24. Pursuant to section 4307 of the Code, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacy Permit
10 Number PHY 37949 issued to Brighton Way Pharmacy Inc. and Lucena Holdings LLC dba West
11 Wilshire Pharmacy, Brighton Way Pharmacy Inc. shall be prohibited from serving as a manager,
12 administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if
13 Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 37949 is placed on probation or until Pharmacy Permit Number
14 PHY 49140 is reinstated if it is revoked.

25. Pursuant to section 4307 of the Code, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacy Permit
Number PHY 37949 issued to Brighton Way Pharmacy Inc. and Lucena Holdings LLC dba West
Wilshire Pharmacy, Lucena Holdings LLC shall be prohibited from serving as a manager,
administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if
Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 37949 is placed on probation or until Pharmacy Permit Number
PHY 49140 is reinstated if it is revoked.

21 26. Pursuant to section 4307 of the Code, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacy Permit
22 Number PHY 37949 issued to Brighton Way Pharmacy Inc. and Lucena Holdings LLC dba West
23 Wilshire Pharmacy while Shahrokh Makhani was an officer and/or owner and had knowledge of
24 or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the licensee was disciplined, Shahrokh
25 Makhani shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer,
26 director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 37949
27 is placed on probation or until Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 37949 is reinstated if it is revoked.

- 11	owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacy		
12	Permit Number PHY 37949 is placed on probation or until Pharmacy Permit Number PHY xxxis		
13	reinstated if Pharmacy Permit Number 37949 issued to Brighton Way Pharmacy Inc. and Lucena		
14	Holdings LLC dba West Wilshire Pharmacy is revoked;		
15	5. Prohibiting Lucena Holdings LLC from serving as a manager, administrator, owner,
