23 24	2. On or about March 24, 2003, the Board issued Pharmacist License No. RPH 54335 to Nader Nagy George (Respondent). The Pharmacist License was in full force and effect at all times
25	relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on May 31, 2018, unless renewed.
26	JURISDICTION
27	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following
28	laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.
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"For the purpose of denial, suspension, or revocation of a personal or facility license pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and Professions Code, a crime or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or registrant if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of a licensee or registrant to perform the functions authorized by his license or registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare."

COST RECOVERY

8. Section 125.3 provides that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be included in a stipulated settlement.

CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct - Act Involving Moral Turpitude)

- 9. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (f), on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that he engaged in an act involving moral turpitude. The circumstances are as follows:
- a) On or about September 21, 2015, Respondent's neighbor arrived home and spoke with his wife outside their home, where the neighbor stated that she was going inside to take a shower. Soon thereafter, Respondent was observed standing on a ladder looking into the neighbor's bathroom window that is 10 feet from the ground. When confronted by another, Respondent got off the ladder, folded it up and walked away. Respondent was identified and arrested.
- b) On or about September 22, 2016, in the criminal matter entitled *The People of the State of California v. Nader Nagy George* (Super. Ct. L.A. County, No. 5BR03329), the Court issued a protective order for the victim and ordered the case to be held open for one year with
