19	<u>PARTIES</u>			
20	1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity			
21	as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.			
22	2. On or about August 29, 2000, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacist License			
23	Number RPH 51731 to Patrick Andrew Hackett (Respondent). The Pharmacist License was in			
24	full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on February			
25	28, 2018, unless renewed.			
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(PATRICK ANDREW HACKETT) ACCUSATION

JURISDICTION

- 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.
- 4. Code section 4011 provides, in pertinent part, that the Board shall administer and enforce both the Pharmacy Law [Code, § 4000 et seq.] and the Uniform Controlled Substances Act [Health & Safety Code, § 11000 et seq.].
- 5. Code section 4300 states, in pertinent part, that every license issued may be suspended or revoked.
 - 6. Code section 4300.1 states:

The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license.

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

7. Section 4301 of the Code states, in pertinent part:

The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

- (f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.
- (h) The administering to oneself, of any controlled substance, or the use of any dangerous drug or of alcoholic beverages to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to oneself, to a person holding a license under this chapter, or to any other person or to the public, or to the extent that the use impairs the ability of the person to conduct with safety to the public the practice authorized by the license.
 - (j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, of any other state, or of the United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.

CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES/DANGEROUS DRUGS

- 12. Phentermine is a Schedule IV controlled substance as defined in Health and Safety Code section 11057, and is categorized as a dangerous drug pursuant to Code section 4022.
- 13. Buprenorphine and Naloxone sublingual is a Schedule V¹ controlled substance as defined in Health and Safety Code section 11058, and is categorized as a dangerous drug pursuant to Code section 4022.
 - 14. Sildenafil is categorized as a dangerous drug pursuant to Code section 4022.
- 15. Promethazine with codeine is a Schedule V controlled substance as defined in Health and Safety Code section 11058, and is categorized as a dangerous drug pursuant to Code section 4022.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- 16. At all times alleged herein, Respondent was a Registered Pharmacist and employed in his licensed capacity by Rite Aid #5863 (Rite Aid), in Fresno, California.
- 17. On or about September 26, 2016, during the course of an investigation by Rite Aid, Respondent admitted that shortly after he started working for Rite Aid in February 2016, he began stealing Phentermine 37.5 mg caps from the pharmacy for self-use in an effort to lose weight. He stated that to avoid detection, he took the small amounts at a time 2-3 times a week, and estimated taking a total of approximately 100-140 capsules tablets over several months. Respondent also admitted to stealing 3-4 Sildenafil tablets between June-July 2016, and 7-8 Suboxone 8mg film tablets on one occasion in or around July 2016.
- 18. Rite Aid video surveillance was obtained during Rite Aid's investigation. The video surveillance shows Respondent selecting medication from pharmacy stock and placing medication into his hand. Respondent signed a statement admitting to taking phentermine capsules and tablets, Sildenafil, and Suboxone for self-use.

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¹ In October 2002, the Federal Government (Drug Enforcement Administration), placed buprenorphine and all products containing buprenorphine into the Federal Schedule III controlled substance classification.

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1	19. Following Rite Aid's investigation, it was determined that Respondent stole the			
2	following controlled substances:			
3	a. 137 Phentermine 37.5 mg capsules			
4	b. 186 Phentermine 37.5 mg tablets			
5	c. 305 Phentermine 15 mg capsules			
6	d. 9 Suboxone 8 mg/2 mg film tabs			
7.	e. 531 ml of Promethazine/Codeine 10 mg/5 ml syrup.			
8	Respondent was terminated by Rite Aid effective October 4, 2016.			
9	FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE			
10	(Acts Involving Dishonesty, Fraud, Deceit, or Corruption)			
11	20. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to Code section 4301(f), for			
12	unprofessional conduct, in that between in or around February 2016 and September 2016, while			
13	on duty as a registered pharmacist at Rite Aid, he committed acts of dishonesty, fraud, or deceit,			
14	as more fully set forth in paragraphs 16-19, above.			
15	SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE			
16	(Self-Administration of Controlled Substances)			
17	21. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to Code section 4301(h), for			
18	unprofessional conduct, in that between in or around February 2016 and September 2016, while			
19	on duty as a registered pharmacist at Rite Aid, he self-administered controlled substances, as more			
20	fully set forth in paragraphs 16-19, above.			
21	THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE			
22	(Violation of State Statutes Regulating Dangerous Drugs)			
23	22. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to Code section 4301(j), for			
24	unprofessional conduct, in that between in or around February 2016 and September 2016,			
25	Respondent violated state statutes regulating dangerous drugs, as follows:			
26	a. Respondent possessed dangerous drugs without a valid prescription from a physician,			
27	dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor in violation of Code section			
28	4060, as more fully set forth in paragraphs 16-19, above.

1	b.	Respondent furnished to himself dangerous drugs without a valid prescription from a		
2	physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian or naturopathic doctor in violation of Code			
3	section 4059(a), as more fully set forth in paragraphs 16-19, above.

5	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged			
6	and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:			
7	1.	Revoking or suspending Pharmacist License Number RPH 51731, issued to Patrick

9	2.	Ordering Patrick Andrew Hackett to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs		
10	of the inve	estigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code		
11	section 125.3; and,			
12	3.	Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
