STIPULATED SETTLEMENT AND
DISCIPLINARY ORDER

26
27 In the interest of a prompt and speedy settlement of this matter, consistent with the public
28 interest and the responsibility of the Board of Pharmacy of the Department of Consumer Affairs,

1 the parties hereby agree to the following Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order which will
2 be submitted to the Board for approval and adoption as the final disposition of the Accusation
3 solely with respect to The Best Pharmacy and Medical Supply, Inc. and Sofik Nazarian. It does
4 not apply to Farah Homa Monempour

5 PARTIES

6 1. Patricia F. Harris (Complainant) is the Executive Officer of the Board of
7 Pharmacy. She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this matter
8 by Bill Lockyer, Attorney General of the State of California, by Desiree A. O'Brien, Deputy
9 Attorney General.

10 2. Respondents The Best Pharmacy and Medical Supply, Inc. and Sofik
11 Nazarian (Respondents) are represented in this proceeding by attorney Herbert L. Weinberg,
12 whose address is Van Etten Suzumoto & Becket, LLP, 1620 26th Street, Suite 6000-N, Santa
13 Monica, CA 90404.

14 3. On or about August 27, 1998, the Board of Pharmacy issued Original
15 Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 43638 to The Best Pharmacy and Medical Supply, Inc.
16 (Respondent "Best Pharmacy"). The license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to
17 the charges brought in Accusation No. 2420, and will expire on June 30, 2003, unless renewed.

18 4. On or about December 19, 2000, the Board of Pharmacy issued Original
19 Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 35534 to Sofik Nazarian ("Respondent
20 Nazarian"). The license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in
21 Accusation No. 2420, and will expire on November 30, 2003, unless renewed.

22 JURISDICTION

23 5. Accusation No. 2420 was filed before the Board of Pharmacy (Board),
24 Department of Consumer Affairs, and is currently pending against Respondents. The Accusation
25 and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondents on February
26 13, 2002. Respondents timely filed their Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy
27 of Accusation No. 2420 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

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1 the Board, or its designee, that Sofik Nazarian has divested herself of all of her rights, interests,
2 ownership, shares, and control of The Best Pharmacy & Medical Supply, Inc. to other part(ies).
3 Failure to provide such proof of divestiture within the 90 days shall cause the immediate
4 revocation of Original Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 43638 issued to The Best Pharmacy and
5 Medical Supply, Inc. without further process.

6 **2. Actual Suspension - Pharmacy Premises.**

7 As part of probation, respondent pharmacy is suspended from the operation of
8 pharmacy for fourteen (14) days beginning the effective date of the Decision adopting this order.

9 During suspension, respondent pharmacy may not order, maintain or dispose of
10 any dangerous drugs and devices or controlled substances. The pharmacy may not make demand
11 or bill for any drugs or services during the period of suspension and may not process any claims
12 for pharmacy services during the period of suspension, except as to services rendered prior to the
13 effective date of the suspension period. The pharmacy shall not receive or transmit any
14 prescription, new or refill, during the period of suspension. Where the pharmacy does not
15 maintain dangerous drugs and devices or controlled substances in an area which can be closed off
16 from the rest of the pharmacy and locked, the entire pharmacy must be closed during the period
17 of suspension.

18 **3. Posted Notice of Suspension.**

19 Respondent Best Pharmacy shall prominently post a suspension notice provided
20 by the Board in a place conspicuous and readable to the public. The suspension notice shall
21 remain posted during the entire period of actual suspension.

22 Respondent Best Pharmacy, or any of its owner(s), personnel, or employees, shall
23 not, directly, or indirectly, engage in any conduct or make any statement, orally, electronically,
24 or in writing, which is intended to mislead or is likely to have the effect of misleading any
25 patient, customer, member of the public, or other person as to the nature of, and reason for, the
26 closure of the licensed entity.

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4. Obey All Laws.

Respondent Best Pharmacy shall obey all state and federal laws and regulations substantially related to or governing the practice of pharmacy.

Respondent Best Pharmacy shall report any of the following occurrences to the Board, in writing, within 72 hours of such occurrence:

- an arrest or issuance of a criminal complaint for violation of any provision of the Pharmacy Law, state and federal food and drug laws, or state and federal controlled substances laws
- a plea of guilty or nolo contendere in any state or federal criminal proceeding to any criminal complaint, information or indictment
- a conviction of any crime
- discipline, citation, or other administrative action filed by any state and federal agency which involves Respondent's license or which is related to the practice of pharmacy or the manufacturing, obtaining, handling or distribution or billing or charging for any drug, device or controlled substance.

5. Reporting to the Board.

Respondent Best Pharmacy shall report to the Board quarterly. The report shall be made either in person or in writing, as directed. Respondent shall state under penalty of perjury whether there has been compliance with all the terms and conditions of probation. If the final probation report is **not** made as directed, probation shall be extended automatically until such time as the final report is made and accepted by the Board.

6. Interview with the Board.

Upon receipt of reasonable notice, Respondent Best Pharmacy shall appear in person for interviews with the Board upon request at various intervals at a location to be determined by the Board. Failure to appear for a scheduled interview without prior notification to Board staff shall be considered a violation of probation.

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1 7. **Cooperation with Board Staff.**

2 Respondent Best Pharmacy shall cooperate with the Board's inspectional
3 program and in the Board's monitoring and investigation of Respondent's compliance with the
4 terms and conditions of Entity probation. Failure to comply shall be considered a violation of
5 probation.

6 8. **Reimbursement of Board Costs.**

7 Respondent Best Pharmacy shall pay to the Board its costs of investigation and
8 prosecution in the amount of six thousand dollars (\$6,000.00) within 24 months of the
9 effective date of the Decision adopting this order. Respondent shall make said payments as
10 follows:

11 An initial payment in the amount of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00)
12 shall be due and paid to the Board of Pharmacy within 30 days of the effective date of the
13 Decision. The payment shall be mailed to the Board of Pharmacy, 400 "R" Street, Suite 4070,
14 Sacramento, California 95814, and shall reference Accusation Number 2420. Thereafter, by
15 the same date as that assigned as the effective date for each consecutive month, Respondent
16 Best Pharmacy shall make consecutive payments in the amount of \$250.00 each for a period
17 of 23 months. There shall be no penalty for early repayment of the entire costs amount. If
18 Respondent Best Pharmacy fails to make any payment in accordance with this schedule, it
19 may be considered a violation of probation subjecting the license to the revocation of the stay
20 and imposition of the discipline of revocation of the permit.

21 The filing of bankruptcy by Respondent shall not relieve Respondent Best
22 Pharmacy of its responsibility to reimburse the Board its costs of investigation and
23 prosecution.

24 9. **Probation Monitoring Costs.**

25 Respondent Best Pharmacy shall pay the costs associated with probation
26 monitoring as determined by the Board each and every year of probation. Such costs shall be
27 payable to the Board at the end of each year of probation. Failure to pay such costs shall be
28 considered a violation of probation.

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10. Status of License.

Respondent Best Pharmacy shall, at all times while on probation, maintain an active current license with the Board. If respondent submits an application to the Board, and the application is approved, for a change of location, change of permit, or change of ownership, the Board shall retain continuing jurisdiction over the license, and the respondent shall remain on probation as determined by the Board.

11. License Surrender while on Probation/Suspension.

Following the effective date of this decision, should Respondent cease practice for any reason, or be otherwise unable to satisfy the terms and conditions of probation, Respondent may tender the pharmacy license to the Board for surrender. The Board shall have the discretion whether to grant the request for surrender or take any other action it deems appropriate and reasonable. Upon formal acceptance of the surrender of the license, Respondent will no longer be subject to the terms and conditions of probation.

Upon acceptance of the surrender, Respondent shall relinquish the pharmacy pocket license to the Board within 10 days of notification by the Board that the surrender is accepted. Respondent may not reapply for any license from the Board for three years from the effective date of the surrender. Respondent shall meet all requirements applicable to the license sought as of the date the application for that license is submitted to the Board.

12. Notice to Employees

Respondent shall, upon or before the effective date of this Decision, ensure that all employees involved in permit operations are made aware of all the terms and conditions of probation, either by posting a notice of the terms and conditions, circulating such notice, or both. If the notice required by this provision is posted, it shall be posted in a prominent place and shall remain posted throughout the probation period. Respondent Best Pharmacy shall ensure that any employees hired or used after the effective date of this Decision are made aware of the terms and conditions by posting a notice, circulating a notice, or both.

“Employees” as used in this provision includes all full-time, part-time, temporary and relief employees, and independent contractors employed or hired at any time

1 during probation.

2 **13. Owners and Officers: Knowledge of the Law**

3 Respondent shall provide, within 30 days after the effective date of this
4 Decision, signed and dated statements from its owners, including any owner or holder of 10%
5 or more of the interest of respondent or respondent's stock, and any officer, stating said
6 individuals have read and are familiar with state and federal laws and regulations governing
7 the practice of pharmacy.

8 **14. Violation of Probation.**

9 If Respondent violates probation in any respect, the Board, after giving
10 Respondent notice and an opportunity to be heard, may revoke probation and carry out the
11 disciplinary order which was stayed. If a petition to revoke probation or an accusation is filed
12 against Respondent during probation, the Board shall have continuing jurisdiction and the
13 period of probation shall be extended, until the petition to revoke probation or accusation is
14 heard and decided.

15 If Respondent has not complied with any term or condition of probation, the
16 Board shall have continuing jurisdiction over Respondent, and probation shall automatically
17 be extended until all terms and conditions have been satisfied or the Board has taken other
18 action as deemed appropriate to treat the failure to comply as a violation of probation, to
19 terminate probation, and to impose the penalty which was stayed.

20 **15. Completion of Probation.**

21 Upon successful completion of probation, Respondent's license will be fully
22 restored.

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

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



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1 Complainant alleges:

2 **PARTIES**

3 1. Patricia F. Harris ("Complainant") brings this Accusation solely in
4 her official capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of
5 Consumer Affairs.

6 2. On or about August 27, 1998, the Board of Pharmacy issued
7 Original Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 43638 to The Best Pharmacy and Medical
8 Supply Inc. ("Respondent Best Pharmacy"). The address of record is: 401 S.
9 Glenoaks Blvd., #102, Burbank, CA 91502. The corporate officers are listed as Vrej
10 Oganessian, President, since August 27, 1998; Sofik Nazarian, Secretary, since August
11 27, 1998; and Razmik Eustachian Namagardi, Vice President since August 27, 1998.
12 The Pharmacist-in Charge listed from August 27, 1998 through November 1, 1999, was
13 shown as Robert Allen Brown, RPH 184226. The Pharmacist-in-Charge since
14 November 1, 1999 is Timothy Carson Helm, RPH 48927. The Original Pharmacy
15 Permit Number was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought
16 herein, until there was a discontinuance of business filed on June 12, 2000.

17 3. On or about September 9, 1993, the Board of Pharmacy issued
18 Original Pharmacist License Number RPH 46452 to Farah Homa Monempour
19 ("Respondent Monempour"). The Original Pharmacist License Number was in full force
20 and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on June 30,
21 2003, if not renewed.

22 4. On or about December 19, 2000, the Board of Pharmacy issued
23 Original Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 35534 to Sofik Nazarian
24 ("Respondent Nazarian"). The Original Pharmacy Technician Registration Number was
25 in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire
26 on November 30, 2002, if not renewed.

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1 or of the applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy,
2 including the regulations established by the Board.

3 (o) Actions or conduct that would have warranted denial of a license.

4 (p) Actions or conduct that would have warranted denial of a license.

5 8. Section 4051 of the Code states, in pertinent part, that it is unlawful
6 for any person to manufacture, compound, furnish, sell, or dispense any dangerous
7 drugs or dangerous device, or to dispense or compound any prescription pursuant to
8 Section 4040 of a prescriber unless he or she is a pharmacist under this chapter.

9 9. Section 4328(a) of the Code states, in pertinent part, that any
10 person who permits the compounding or dispensing of prescriptions, or the furnishing of
11 dangerous drugs in his or her pharmacy, except by a pharmacist, is guilty of a
12 misdemeanor.

13 10. Section 4329 of the Code states, in pertinent part, any non-
14 pharmacist who takes charge of or acts as manager of any pharmacy or who
15 compounds or dispenses a prescription or furnishes dangerous drugs except as
16 otherwise provided in this chapter is guilty of a misdemeanor.

17 11. Section 4330(a) of the Code states, in pertinent part, any person
18 who has obtained a license to conduct a pharmacy, who fails to place in charge of the
19 pharmacy a pharmacist, or any person, who by himself or herself, or by any other
20 person, permits the compounding or dispensing of prescriptions, or the furnishing of
21 dangerous drugs, in his or her pharmacy, except by a pharmacist, or as otherwise
22 provided in this chapter, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

23 12. Title 16, California Code of Regulations, section 1714(d) states that
24 each pharmacist while on duty shall be responsible for the security of the prescription
25 department, including provisions for effective control against theft or diversion of
26 dangerous drugs and devices, and records for such drugs and devices.

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1 Possession of a key to the pharmacy where dangerous drugs and controlled
2 substances are stored shall be restricted to a pharmacist.

3 13. Section 11164(c) of the Health and Safety Code states, in pertinent
4 part, that any controlled substance classified in Schedule III, IV or V may be dispensed
5 upon an oral or electronically transmitted prescription, which shall be reduced to writing
6 by the pharmacist filling the prescription or by any other person expressly authorized by
7 provisions of the Business and Professions Code.

8 14. Section 11207 of the Health and Safety Code states that no person
9 other than a registered pharmacist under the laws of this state or an intern pharmacist,
10 as defined in Section 4038.1 of the Business and Professions Code, who is under the
11 personal supervision of a pharmacist, shall compound, prepare, fill or dispense a
12 prescription for a controlled substance.

13 15. Title 22, Medi-Cal Regulations, article 3, sections 51226 and 51227
14 states, in pertinent part, that service providers to Medi-Cal must have a valid certificate
15 issued by the Board of Pharmacy.

16 16. Title 16, California Code of Regulations, section 1793.1, states that
17 only a registered pharmacist, or an intern pharmacist acting under the supervision of a
18 registered pharmacist, may:

19 (a) Receive a new prescription order orally from a prescriber authorized by
20 the law.

21 (c) Identify, evaluate and interpret a prescription.

22 (h) Perform any other duty which federal or state laws or regulation
23 authorizes only as a registered pharmacist.

24 (i) Perform all functions which require professional judgment.

25 17. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in part, that the Board may
26 request the administrative law judge to direct any licentiate found to have committed a
27 violation or violations of the Licensing Act, to pay the Board a sum not to exceed the

1 reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

2 **CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES**

3 18. "Promethazine with codeine" is a brand name combination of
4 antihistamine with narcotic analgesic. It is a Schedule V narcotic controlled substance
5 as defined by Health and Safety Code section 111058(c)(1) and is categorized as a
6 "dangerous drug" pursuant to section 4022 of the Code.

7 19. "Vicodin" is a brand name combination of Hydrocodone 5 mg. with
8 Acetaminophen 500 mg. It is a Schedule III narcotic controlled substance as defined by
9 Health and Safety Code section 11056(e)(4) and is categorized as a "dangerous drug"
10 pursuant to section 4022 of the Code.

11 20. "Klonopin" is a brand name for Clonazepam. It is a Schedule IV
12 narcotic controlled substance as defined by Health and Safety Code section
13 11057(d)(6) and is categorized as a "dangerous drug" pursuant to section 4022 of the
14 Code.

15 21. "Tylenol #3 with ½ gram of Codeine" is a brand name combination
16 of Acetaminophen with Codeine. It is a Schedule III narcotic controlled substance as
17 defined by Health and Safety Code section 11056(e)(2) and is categorized as a
18 "dangerous drug" pursuant to section 4022 of the Code.

19 **FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION**

20 **DISPENSING PRESCRIPTIONS**

21 **WITHOUT A PHARMACIST PRESENT**

22 22. Respondents Best Pharmacy, Nazarian and each of them, are
23 subject to discipline pursuant to Business and Professions Code sections 4300, 4301,
24 4328, 4329, 4330, 4051 and Health and Safety Code Sections 11164(c) and 11207 for
25 unprofessional conduct within the meaning of Code sections 4301(j) and 4301(o), of the
26 Business and Professions Code and California Code of Regulations Section 1714 and
27 1793.1, for dispensing prescriptions without the supervision of a registered pharmacist,

1 by reasons of the following:

2 A. On or about January 9, 1999, Respondent Nazarian assumed the
3 duties of a pharmacist and processed prescription documents #688-691. Prescription
4 #690 was for Promethazine with Codeine. This was noted on the daily log for January
5 9, 1999, which did not show a signature of a pharmacist.

6 B. On or about January 23, 1999, Respondent Nazarian assumed the
7 duties of a pharmacist and processed prescription documents #997-999. This was
8 noted on the daily log for January 23, 1999.

9 C. On or about January 30, 1999, Respondent Nazarian assumed the
10 duties of a pharmacist and processed prescription documents #1171. This was noted
11 on the daily log for January 30, 1999.

12 D. On or about February 6, 1999, Respondent Nazarian assumed the
13 duties of a pharmacist and processed prescription documents #1374 -1375. This was
14 noted on the daily log for February 6, 1999.

15 E. On or about February 13, 1999, Respondent Nazarian assumed the
16 duties of a pharmacist and processed prescription document #1561-1564. This was
17 noted on the daily log for February 13, 1999.

18 F. On or about February 20, 1999, Respondent Nazarian assumed the
19 duties of a pharmacist and processed prescription documents #1721 -1722.
20 Prescription #1721 was for Klonopin, a Schedule IV controlled substance. This was
21 noted on the daily log for February 20, 1999.

22 G. On or about February 27, 1999, Respondent Nazarian assumed the
23 duties of a pharmacist and processed prescription documents #1903 and #1905. This
24 was noted on the daily log for February 27, 1999.

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1 **SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION**

2 FRAUDULENT BILLING

3 23. Respondents Best Pharmacy, Nazarian and each of them, are
4 subject to discipline pursuant to Business and Professions Code sections 4300,
5 4301(f), 4301(g), and 4301(p) for unprofessional conduct by reasons of violating Title
6 22, Medi-Cal Regulations, article 3, sections 51226 and 51227, in that on or about
7 December 5, 1998, December 19, 1998, January 9, 1999, January 23, 1999, January
8 30, 1999, February 6, 1999, February 13, 1999, February 20, 1999, and February 27,
9 1999, Respondent Nazarian assumed the duties of a pharmacist, processed
10 prescription documents for services provided, and billed Medi-Cal a total sum of
11 \$3,346.50.

12 **THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION**

13 ALLOWING A NON-PHARMACIST TO

14 TAKE AND RECEIVE TELEPHONIC PRESCRIPTIONS

15 24. Respondents Best Pharmacy, Monempour, Nazarian, and each of
16 them, are subject to discipline pursuant to Business and Professions Code sections
17 4300 and 4301(n) and 4301(o), for unprofessional conduct as it relates to California
18 Code of Regulations, Section 1793.1(a), 1793.1(c), 1793.1(h) and 1793.1(i), in that
19 Respondent Monempour allowed Respondent Nazarian, an unlicensed pharmacist, to
20 reduce telephonic prescriptions to writing. This was noted on the daily log for
21 December 19, 1998, which did not show a signature of a pharmacist, only the initials of
22 "BB" and on the daily log for January 12, 1999, which showed that Respondent
23 Monempour was the pharmacist on duty.

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
