17	IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties in the		
18	proceeding that the following matters are true:		
19	PARTIES		
20	1. Patricia F. Harris (Complainant) is the Executive Officer of the Board of		
21	Pharmacy. She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this matter		
22	by Bill Lockyer, Attorney General of the State of California, by Jana L. Tuton, Deputy Attorney		
23	General.		
24	2. Marcella L. Berk (Respondent) is representing herself in this proceeding		
25	and has chosen not to exercise her right to be represented by counsel.		
26	3. On or about January 5, 2001, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy		
27	Technician Registration No. TCH 35695 to Marcella L. Berk. The Registration was in full force

and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 2004-144 and will expire on May 31, 2006, unless renewed.

# JURISDICTION

4. Accusation No. 2004-144 was filed before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on January 6, 2005. Respondent timely filed her Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 2004-144 is attached as exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

# ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- 5. Respondent has carefully read, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 2004-144. Respondent also has carefully read, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.
- 6. Respondent is fully aware of her legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at her own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against her; the right to present evidence and to testify on her own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- 7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

# **CULPABILITY**

- 8. Respondent understands that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 2004-144, if proven at a hearing, constitute cause for imposing discipline upon her Pharmacy Technician Registration.
- 9. For the purpose of resolving the Accusation without the expense and uncertainty of further proceedings, Respondent agrees that, at a hearing, Complainant could establish a factual basis for the charges in the Accusation and that those charges constitute cause

for discipline. Respondent hereby gives up her right to contest that cause for discipline exists based on those charges.

10. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation she enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of her Pharmacy Technician Registration without further process.

# **RESERVATION**

11. The admissions made by Respondent herein are only for the purposes of this proceeding, or any other proceedings in which the Board of Pharmacy or other professional licensing agency is involved, and shall not be admissible in any other criminal or civil proceeding.

# **CONTINGENCY**

- Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board of Pharmacy may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and settlement, without notice to or participation by Respondent. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that she may not withdraw her agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.
- 13. The parties understand and agree that facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 14. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the (Board) may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

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# <u>ORDER</u>

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 35695, issued to Respondent Marcella L. Berk is surrendered and accepted by the Board of Pharmacy.

- 15. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a pharmacy technician in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
- 16. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board both her wall and pocket certificates on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.
- application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a petition for reinstatement. Respondent must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a revoked license in effect at the time the petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 2004-144 shall be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the petition.
- 18. Respondent shall pay the Board its costs of investigation and enforcement in the amount of \$2,500.00 prior to issuance of a new or reinstated license.

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6. Health and Safety Code section 11173, subdivision (a) provides:

"(a) No person shall obtain or attempt to obtain controlled substances, or procure or attempt to procure the administration of or prescription for controlled substances, (1) by fraud, deceit, misrepresentation, or subterfuge; or (2) by the concealment of a material fact."

7. Health and Safety Code section 11368 provides:

"Every person who forges or alters a prescription or who issues or utters an altered prescription, or who issues or utters a prescription bearing a forged or fictitious signature for any narcotic drug, or who obtains any narcotic drug by any forged, fictitious, or altered prescription, or who has in possession any narcotic drug secured by a forged, fictitious, or altered prescription, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for not less than six months nor more than one year, or in the state prison."

8. Section 125.3 of the Code provides that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

## **DRUGS**

- 9. Section 4022 of the Code provides that the term "dangerous drug" means any drug unsafe for self-use in that under federal or state law the drug can be lawfully dispensed only on prescription or furnished pursuant to section 4006 of the Code.
- 10. "Hydrocodone" with Acetaminophen (Lortab) is a Schedule III controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11056, subdivision (e)(4), and a dangerous drug within the meaning of section 4022 of the Code, in that under federal or state law Hydrocodone can be lawfully dispensed only on prescription or furnished pursuant to section 4006 of the Code.

# FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Dishonest and Fraudulent Acts)

11. Respondent's license is subject to discipline under section 4301, subdivisions (f), and (j) of the Code, for obtaining controlled substances by fraud, deceit,

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and misrepresentation and in violation of Health & Safety Code sec. 11173(a) and 11368, as more particularly set forth below:

#### Sav On Pharmacy, Sacramento, California: a.

On or about November 20, 2002, Respondent knowingly presented a fraudulent prescription written by Leonard Magnani, M.D., for 100-tablets of Hydrocodone/ APAP 7.5/500 (Lortab) to Sav On Pharmacy located in Sacramento, California. After the prescription was filled, Respondent gave the drugs to Dr. Magnani.

#### Bel Air Pharmacy, Sacramento, California: b.

On or about October 19, 2001, November 15, 2001,

December 10, 2001, February 23, 2002, April 16, 2002, July 15, 2002, October 30, 2002, and November 25, 2002, Respondent knowingly presented eight fraudulent prescriptions written by Leonard Magnani, M.D., to Bel Air Pharmacy located in Sacramento, California, for Hydrocodone/APAP 7.5/500 (Lortab). Each prescription was for 100 tablets. After the prescriptions were filled, Respondent gave the drugs to Dr. Magnani.

# Safeway Pharmacy, Sacramento, California:

On or about April 20, 2001, June 6, 2001, July 12, 2001,

December 7, 2001, March 14, 2002, September 3, 2002, October 2, 2002, and

November 7, 2002, Respondent knowingly presented nine fraudulent prescriptions written by

Leonard Magnani, M.D., to Safeway Pharmacy located in Sacramento, California, for

Hydrocodone/APAP 7.5/500 (Lortab) in a total dosage of 900-tablets. Each prescription was for

100 tablets. After the prescriptions were filled, Respondent gave the drugs to Dr. Magnani.

### d. Raley's Pharmacy, Sacramento, California:

On or about December 27, 2001, February 12, 2002, April 2, 2002, and October 23, 2002, Respondent knowingly presented four fraudulent prescriptions for Hydrocodone/APAP 7.5/500 (Lortab) written by Leonard Magnani, M.D., to Raley's Pharmacy located in Sacramento, California. Each prescription was for 100 tablets. After the prescriptions were filled, Respondent gave the drugs to Dr. Magnani.

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# **PRAYER**

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing the Board issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Original Pharmacy Technician Registration

  Number TCH 35695 issued to Marcella L. Berk;
- 2. Ordering Marcella L. Berk to pay the reasonable costs incurred by the Board in the investigation and enforcement of this case pursuant to section 125.3 of the Code; and,
  - 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
