17	IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties in this		
18	proceeding that the following matters are true:

20	1. Patricia F. Harris (Complainant) is the Executive Officer of the Board of		
21	Pharmacy. She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this matter		
22	by Bill Lockyer, Attorney General of the State of California, by Jessica M. Amgwerd, Deputy		
23	Attorney General.		
24	2. JAMIE S. SIMPSON (Respondent) is represented by Robert F. Hahn.		
25	3. On or about July 17, 2000, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacist		
26	Technician License No. TCH 33920 to JAMIE S. SIMPSON.

28	4. Accusation No. 2714 was filed b	pefore the Board of Pharmacy (Board),

Department of Consumer Affairs, and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on April 22, 2004. Respondent filed a Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 2714 is attached as exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

### ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- 5. Respondent has carefully read, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 2714. Respondent also has carefully read, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.
- 6. Respondent is fully aware of her legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at her own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against her; the right to present evidence and to testify on her own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- 7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

#### **CULPABILITY**

- 8. Respondent admits to a violation of Business and Professions Code section 4301(f). More specifically, Respondent was involved in diverting approximately 2,000 Hydrocodone 5/500 mg over a four month period. Respondent agrees that cause exists for discipline and hereby surrenders her Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 33920 for the Board's formal acceptance.
- 9. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation, she enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of his pharmacy license without further process.

#### CONTINGENCY

10. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board of Pharmacy.

Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board of

Pharmacy may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and settlement, without notice to or participation by Respondent. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that she may not withdraw her agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.

- 11. The parties understand and agree that facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 12. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the (Board) may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

## <u>ORDER</u>

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 33920, issued to Respondent JAMIE S. SIMPSON is surrendered and accepted by the Board of Pharmacy.

- 1. Respondent shall relinquish his wall license and pocket renewal license to the Board within 10 days of the effective date of this decision.
- 2. Respondent may not reapply for any license, permit, or registration from the board for three years from the effective date of this decision. Respondent stipulates that should she apply for any license from the Board on or after the effective date of this decision, all allegations set forth in the Accusation shall be deemed to be true. Respondent shall satisfy all requirements applicable to that license as of the date the application is submitted to the board, prior to the issuance of a new license. Respondent is obligated to report this surrender as disciplinary action.
- 3. Respondent stipulates that should she apply for any license from the board on or after the effective date of this decision, the investigation and prosecution costs in the amount of

19	Complainant, Patricia F. Harris makes and files this Accusation in her official		
20	capacity as Executive Officer, Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs (hereinafter		
21	"Board").		
22	1. On July 17, 2000 the Board issued Original Pharmacy Technician		
23	Registration Number TCH 33920, to Jamie S. Simpson, to act as a pharmacy technician in		
24	California and that the address of record is 3708 W. Myrtle Court, Visalia, CA 93277. The		
25	registration is in full force and effect until August 31, 2004.		
26	2. Vicodin is a dangerous drug pursuant to Bus. & Prof. Code section 4022		
27	and a controlled substance pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 11056(e)(4). It's generic		
28	name is Hydrocodone/APAP and is used for pain relief.		

Unprofessional conduct includes:

3. Business and Professions Code section 4301 provides that the Board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct.

- (f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.
- (g) Knowingly making or signing any certificate or other document that falsely represents the existence or nonexistence of a state of facts.
- 4. Business and Professions Code section 4059(d) provides that a person may not furnish any dangerous drug except upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, or veterinarian.
- 5. Business and Professions Code section 4060 provides that no person shall possess any controlled substance, except that furnished to a person upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, or veterinarian.
- 6. Health and Safety Code section 11352(a) provides that except as otherwise provided in this division, every person who transports, imports into this state, sells, furnishes, administers, or gives away, or offers to transport, import into this state, sell, furnish, administer, or give away, or attempts to import into this state or transport (1) any controlled substance specified in subdivision (b), (c), or (e), or paragraph (1) of subdivision (f) of Section 11054, specified in paragraph (14), (15), or (20) of subdivision (d) of Section 11054, or specified in subdivision (b), (c), or (g) of Section 11055, or (2) any controlled substance classified in Schedule III, IV, or V which is a narcotic drug, unless upon the written prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, or veterinarian licensed to practice in this state, shall be punsiehd by imprisonment in the state prison for three, four, or five years.
- 7. Health and Safety Code section 11173(a) provides, that no person shall obtain or attempt to obtain controlled substances, or procure or attempt to procure the administration of or prescription for controlled substances, (1) by fraud, deceit, misrepresentation, or subterfuge; or (2) by the concealment of a material fact.

Respondent engaged in unprofessional conduct pursuant to Code sections 4301(f) 1 2 and (g), 4059(a) and 4060 and Health and Safety Code sections 11352(a) and 11173(a) as 3 follows: During the period July 2002 through October 2002, Respondent, pharmacy 4 5 technician Jamie Simpson, unlawfully appropriated approximately 2000 Vicodin tablets (4 bottles of 500) from her employer, Walgreens, store #3476, 100 W. Walnut Avenue, Visalia, 6 7 California. Respondent misfilled prescriptions for generic Vicodin by attaching labels with false 8 names and incorrect labeling prescription container labels listing the contents of the containers, 9 which contained Vicodin, as drugs other than Vicodin. Respondent then sold the Vicodin and 10 received between \$40.00 and \$45.00 per hundred tablets of Vicodin. The false prescriptions were filled under a false name and label contents in quantities of 100 tablets of Vicodin. 11 12 PRAYER WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein 13 14 alleged, and that following the hearing, the Pharmacy Board issue a decision: 15 Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration issued to 1. 16 Jamie S. Simpson; 17 2. Ordering Jamie S. Simpson to pay the Pharmacy Board the reasonable 18 costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions 19 Code section 125.3; and, 20 Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
