On or about November 8, 1995, in a criminal proceeding titled *People of* 7 the State of California v. Josie Solano, Case No. 95HM09076 in Orange County Superior Court, 8 Respondent was convicted of violating Penal Code section 488 (petty theft), a misdemeanor. 9 21. On or about February 21, 1997, in a criminal proceeding titled *People of* the State of California v. Josie Solano, Case No. 97CM01430 in Orange County Superior Court, 10 11 Respondent was convicted of violating Penal Code section 488 (petty theft), a misdemeanor. 12 22. On or about June 5, 1997, the Board of Pharmacy received an application 13 from Respondent for licensure as a Pharmacy Technician. The application was completed and 14 signed by Respondent, under penalty of perjury, on May 15, 1997. Question seven thereof asked if Respondent had ever been convicted of or pleaded no contest to a violation of any law of the 15 16 United States, a foreign country, or any state laws or local ordinances, and instructed Respondent 17 to include all misdemeanor or felony convictions, regardless of their age, including those set 18 aside under Penal Code section 1203.4. Respondent checked the box for "No." That was false. 19 23. On or about March 11, 2004, Respondent was arrested by the Fountain 20 Valley (California) Police Department for violating Penal Code section 487(a) (grand theft) and 21 Penal Code section(s) 666/484(a)/488 (theft with prior theft conviction). On or about April 8, 22 2004, in a criminal proceeding titled *People of the State of California v. Josie Solano*, Case No. 23 04WM03407 in Orange County Superior Court, Respondent was convicted of violating Penal 24 Code 487(a) (grand theft), a misdemeanor, and of violating Penal Code section(s) 666/484(a)/488 25 (theft with prior theft conviction), also a misdemeanor. The circumstances were as follows: 26 a. On or about March 11, 2004, Respondent shoplifted/took without 27 paying several electronics items from a Fry's Electronics store in or near Fountain Valley, CA. 28 The items taken totaled nearly \$500.00 in value. Respondent was apprehended by store security.

On 24 or about September 14, 2005, in a criminal proceeding titled *People of the State of California v*. 25 Josie Solano, Case No. 05HF1537 in Orange County Superior Court, Respondent was convicted 26 of one count of violating Penal Code section(s) 459-460(b) (commercial burglary) and one count 27 of violating Health and Safety Code section 11173(a) (obtaining controlled substance by fraud, deceit, misrepresentation, etc.), both felonies. 15	time served, three (3) years formal probation, registration pursuant to Health and Safety Code
16	section 11590 (controlled substance offender), DNA testing, search conditions, fines and fees.

17	A. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician License No. TCH 25665,
18	issued to Josie Solano aka Josie Salano aka Josie Ruiz (Respondent);
19	B. Ordering Respondent to pay the Board reasonable costs of investigation
20	and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3;
21	C. Taking such other and further action as is deemed necessary and proper.
