17	1. On or about July 17, 2008, Complainant Virginia Herold, in her official		
18	capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs,		
19	filed Accusation No. 3143 against Sandra Dee Parish (Respondent) before the Board of		
20	Pharmacy.		
21	2. On or about January 11, 2005, the Board of Pharmacy (Board) issued		
22	Pharmacy Technician No. TCH 60425 to Respondent.		
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25	Department of Justice, served by Certified and First Class Mail a copy of the Accusation No.		
-26	3143, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for Discovery, and Government		
27	Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7 to Respondent's address of record with the Board,		
	which was and is: 5979 Devecchi Ave #23, Citrus Heights, CA 95621.		
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1	A copy of the Accusation is attached as exhibit A, and is incorporated herein by reference.	
2	4. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the	
3 -	provisions of Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c).	
4	5. No documents were returned.	
5	6. Government Code section 11506 states, in pertinent part:	
6 7 8	(c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.	
9	7. Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service	
10	upon her of the Accusation, and therefore waived her right to a hearing on the merits of	
11	Accusation No. 3143.	
• 12	8. California Government Code section 11520 states, in pertinent part:	
13	(a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent.	
15	9. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board	•
16	finds Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on	
17	the evidence on file herein, finds that the allegations in Accusation No. 3143 are true.	
18	10. The total cost for investigation and enforcement in connection with the	
19	Accusation are \$1,430.00 as of October 30, 2008.	
20	DETERMINATION OF ISSUES	
21	1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Sandra Dee Parish	
22	has subjected her Pharmacy Technician No. TCH 60425 to discipline.	
23	2. A copy of the Accusation is attached.	
24	3. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.	
25	4. The Board of Pharmacy is authorized to revoke Respondent's Pharmacy	
26	Technician based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation:	
27 28	a. Respondent used alcohol which was dangerous to herself or others	
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1	in violation of Business and Professions Code Section 4301 subds. (h), (j), and (o), in			
2	that on or about February 8, 2007, respondent was impaired and under the influence of			
3	alcohol when she worked as a pharmacy technician at Long's Drugs Store located at 4785			
4	Granite Drive, Rocklin, California. The circumstances are as follows:			
5	1 On or about February 8, 2007, respondent was observed by co-			
6	workers at Longs Drugs in Rocklin visibly shaking and trembling with a smell of alcohol.			
. 7	She was taken by ambulance to the emergency room at Sutter Roseville Hospital.			
· 8	Respondent tested positive for alcohol.			
9	2. On or about June 27, 2007, respondent was interviewed by Board			
10	Inspector Rick Icknoian. Respondent admitted to drinking alcohol prior to going to work			
11	on February 8, 2007. Respondent admitted that she had a long-term problem with alcohol			
12	consumption.			
13	ORDER			
14	IT IS SO ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician No. TCH 60425, heretofore			
15	issued to Respondent Sandra Dee Parish, is revoked.			
16	Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may			
17	serve a written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on			
18	within seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion			
19	may vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the			
20	statute.			
21	This Decision shall become effective on <u>January 22</u> , 2009

19 1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official	•
20 capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.	
2. On or about January 11, 2005, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy	
22 Technician Registration No. TCH 60425 to Sandra Dee Parish (Respondent). Said Registration	
will expire March 31, 2010.	
24 JURISDICTION	
25 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board),	
26 Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section	•
27 references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.	
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4. Section 4300 of the Code states:

"(a) Every license issued may be suspended or revoked.

"(b) The board shall discipline the holder of any license issued by the board, whose default has been entered or whose case has been heard by the board and found guilty, by any of the following methods:

"(1) Suspending judgment.

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"(2) Placing him or her upon probation.

"(3) Suspending his or her right to practice for a period not exceeding one year.

"(4) Revoking his or her license.

10 "(5) Taking any other action in relation to disciplining him or her as the board in
11 its discretion may deem proper.

"(c) The board may refuse a license to any applicant guilty of unprofessional
conduct. The board may, in its sole discretion, issue a probationary license to any applicant for a
license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct and who has met all other requirements for
licensure. The board may issue the license subject to any terms or conditions not contrary to
public policy, including, but not limited to, the following:

"(1) Medical or psychiatric evaluation.

"(2) Continuing medical or psychiatric treatment.

"(3) Restriction of type or circumstances of practice.

"(4) Continuing participation in a board-approved rehabilitation program.

"(5) Abstention from the use of alcohol or drugs.

"(6) Random fluid testing for alcohol or drugs.

"(7) Compliance with laws and regulations governing the practice of pharmacy.

"(d) The board may initiate disciplinary proceedings to revoke or suspend any
probationary certificate of licensure for any violation of the terms and conditions of probation.
Upon satisfactory completion of probation, the board shall convert the probationary certificate to
a regular certificate, free of conditions.

"(e) The proceedings under this article shall be conducted in accordance with

Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of the Government Code, and the board shall have all the powers granted therein. The action shall be final, except that the propriety of the action is subject to review by the superior court pursuant to Section 1094.5 of the Code of Civil Procedure."

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5. Section 4301 of the Code states in pertinent part:

"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of 6 7 unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

"(f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud. 10 deceit, or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or 11 otherwise, and whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not. 12

"(h) The administering to oneself, of any controlled substance, or the use of any 13 14 dangerous drug or of alcoholic beverages to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to oneself, to a person holding a license under this chapter, or to any other person or to 15 the public, or to the extent that the use impairs the ability of the person to conduct with safety to 16 the public the practice authorized by the license. 17

18 (i) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, or any other state, or of the 19 United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.

"(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or 20 abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the 21 22 applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations 23 established by the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency."

24 6. Section 125.3 of the Code states, in pertinent part, that the Board may 25 request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or 26 violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case. 27

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7. Section 118 of the Code states:

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"(a) The withdrawal of an application for a license after it has been filed with a board in the department shall not, unless the board has consented in writing to such withdrawal, deprive the board of its authority to institute or continue a proceeding against the applicant for the denial of the license upon any ground provided by law or to enter an order denying the license upon any such ground.

7 "(b) The suspension, expiration, or forfeiture by operation of law of a license issued by a 8 board in the department, or its suspension, forfeiture, or cancellation by order of the board or by 9 order of a court of law, or its surrender without the written consent of the board, shall not, during 10 any period in which it may be renewed, restored, reissued, or reinstated, deprive the board of its 11 authority to institute or continue a disciplinary proceeding against the licensee upon any ground 12 provided by law or to enter an order suspending or revoking the license or otherwise taking 13 disciplinary action against the licensee on any such ground.

"(c) As used in this section, 'board' includes an individual who is authorized by any
provision of this code to issue, suspend, or revoke a license, and 'license' includes 'certificate,'
'registration,' and 'permit.'"

CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Use of Alcohol in a Manner Dangerous to Self or Others)

8. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301 subds. (h),
 (j), and (o), in that on or about February 8, 2007, respondent was impaired and under the
 influence of alcohol when she worked as a pharmacy technician at Long's Drugs Store located at

8	B. Ordering Sandra Dee Parish to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable
9	costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions
10	Code section 125.3;
11	C. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
