26	2. Rita Jeanine Garibaldi (Respondent) is re	presenting herself in this proceeding and has	
27	chosen not to exercise her right to be represented by a	counsel.	
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Stipulated Surrender of License (Case No. 3605)

3. On or about March 18, 2003, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician 1 License No. TCH 48059 to Rita Jeanine Garibaldi (Respondent). The Pharmacy Technician 2 License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 3 3605 and will expire on August 31, 2012, unless renewed. 4 5 JURISDICTION 6 4. Accusation No. 3605 was filed before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of 7 Consumer Affairs, and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other 8 statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on October 1, 2010. 9 Respondent timely filed her Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation 10 No. 3605 is attached as exhibit A and incorporated by reference. 11 12 ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS 13 5. Respondent has carefully read, and understands, the charges and allegations in 14 Accusation No. 3605. Respondent has also carefully read, and understands, the effects of this 15 Stipulated Surrender of License and Order. 16 6. Respondent is fully aware of her legal rights in this matter, including the right to a 17 hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at 18 her own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against her; the right to 19 present evidence and to testify on her own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to 20 compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration 21 and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California 22 Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws. 23 7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and 24 every right set forth above. 25 111 26 /// 27 /// 28 2

Stimulated Surrender of License (Case No. 3605)

8. Respondent admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation
No. 3605, agrees that cause exists for discipline, and hereby surrenders her Pharmacy Technician
License No. TCH 48059 for the Board's formal acceptance.

CULPABILITY

9. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation she enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of her Pharmacy Technician License without further process.

CONTINGENCY

This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board of Pharmacy. Respondent 10. 9 understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board of Pharmacy may 10 communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or 11 participation by Respondent. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that 12 she may not withdraw her agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board 13 considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, 14 the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this 15 paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not 16 be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter. 17

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11. The parties understand and agree that facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including facsimile signatures, have the same force and effect as the originals.

12. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an
integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement.
It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions,
negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order
may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing
executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

13. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that
the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

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ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician License No: TCH 48059, issued to Respondent Rita Jeanine Garibaldi, is surrendered and accepted by the Board of Pharmacy.

The surrender of Respondent's Pharmacy Technician Registration and the acceptance 14. of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of Respondent's license history with the Board.

Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a Pharmacy Technician in California 15. as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.

16. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board her wall license certificate and, if one was issued, her pocket license, on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.

17. Respondent may not apply, reapply, or petition for any licensure or registration of the Board for three (3) years from the effective date of the Decision and Order.

18. If Respondent ever applies for licensure or petitions for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a new application for licensure. Respondent must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for licensure in effect at the time the application or petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 3605 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the application or petition.

If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or 20 19. 21 petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation, No. 3605 shall be deemed 22 23 to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure. 24

Respondent shall pay the Board its costs of investigation and enforcement in the 20. amount of \$3,687.50 prior to issuance of a new or reinstated license. 26

-18	PARTIES	
19	1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity	
20	as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.	
21	2. On or about March 18, 2003, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician	
22	License No. TCH 48059 to Rita Jeanine Garibaldi (Respondent). The Pharmacy Technician	
23	License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will	
24	expire on August 31, 2012, unless renewed.	
25	JURISDICTION	
26	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of	
27	Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the	
28	Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.	
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4. Section 4011 of the Code provides that the Board shall administer and enforce both the Pharmacy Law [Bus. & Prof. Code, § 4000 et seq.] and the Uniform Controlled Substances Act [Health & Safety Code, § 11000 et seq.].

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5. Section 4300(a) of the Code provides that every license issued by the Board may be suspended or revoked.

Section 118(b) of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the suspension, expiration, 6. 6 surrender, or cancellation of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with a 7 disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued 8 or reinstated. Section 4402(a) of the Code provides that any pharmacist license that is not 9 renewed within three years following its expiration may not be renewed, restored, or reinstated 10 and shall be canceled by operation of law at the end of the three-year period. Section 4402(e) of 11 the Code provides that any other license issued by the Board may be canceled by the Board if not 12 renewed within 60 days after its expiration, and will require a new application. 13

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STATUTORY AND REGULATORY PROVISIONS

7. Section 4301 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board shall take action
against any holder of a license who is guilty of "unprofessional conduct," defined to include, but
not be limited to, any of the following:

(f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or
corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and
whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.

(j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, of any other state, or of the United
States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.

(1) The conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties
of a licensee under this chapter.

(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the
violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable
federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by
the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency.

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California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, states:

"For the purpose of denial, suspension, or revocation of a personal or facility license pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and Professions Code, a crime or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or registrant if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of a licensee or registrant to perform the functions authorized by her license or registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare."

9. Section 4059 of the Code, in pertinent part, prohibits furnishing of any dangerous drug or dangerous device except upon the prescription of an authorized prescriber.

10. Section 4060 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that no person shall possess any controlled substance, except that furnished upon a valid prescription/drug order.

11. Health and Safety Code section 11170 provides that no person shall prescribe, administer, or furnish a controlled substance for himself or herself.

12. Health and Safety Code section 11173, subdivision (a), provides that no person shall obtain or attempt to obtain controlled substances, or procure or attempt to procure the administration of or prescription for controlled substances, (1) by fraud, deceit, misrepresentation, or subterfuge; or (2) by the concealment of a material fact.

18 13. Health and Safety Code section 11350, in pertinent part, makes it unlawful to possess
any controlled substance listed in Schedule II (Health and Safety Code section 11055),
subdivision (b) or (c), or any narcotic drug in Schedules III-V, absent a valid prescription.

14. Health and Safety Code section 11351, in pertinent part, makes it unlawful to possess
for sale or purchase for sale any controlled substance classified in Schedule III, IV, or V (Health
and Safety Code sections 11056, 11057, or 11058) which is a narcotic drug.

COST RECOVERY

15. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the
administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation of the licensing
act to pay a sum not to exceed its reasonable costs of investigation and enforcement.

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1	CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES / DANGEROUS DRUGS
2	16. Section 4021 of the Code states:
3	"Controlled substance' means any substance listed in Chapter 2 (commencing with Section
4	11053) of Division 10 of the Health and Safety Code."
5	17. Section 4022 of the Code states, in pertinent part:
6	"Dangerous drug' or 'dangerous device' means any drug or device unsafe for self use,
7	except veterinary drugs that are labeled as such, and includes the following:
8	"(a) Any drug that bears the legend: 'Caution: federal law prohibits dispensing without
9	prescription,' 'Rx only,' or words of similar import.
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11	"(c) Any other drug or device that by federal or state law can be lawfully dispensed only on
12	prescription or furnished pursuant to Section 4006."
13	18. Norco, Vicodin, Vicodin ES, Lortab, and Lorcet are among the brand names for
14 ·	compounds of varying dosages of acetaminophen (aka APAP) and hydrocodone, a Schedule III
15	controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11056(e)(4) and dangerous
16	drug as designated by Business and Professions Code section 4022. The varying compounds are
17	also known generically as Hydrocodone with APAP. These are all narcotic drugs.
18	FACTUAL BACKGROUND
19	19. Between in or about October 2006 and in or about October 2008, Respondent was
20	employed as a pharmacy technician at Owens Pharmacy No. 7 (PHY 46024) in Napa, CA, where
21	by virtue of her employment she had access to controlled substances and dangerous drugs.
22	20. During the tenure of her employment by Owens Pharmacy No. 7, Respondent used
23	her access to divert/steal controlled substances and dangerous drugs, including Norco and/or
24	other Hydrocodone with APAP controlled substance/dangerous drug products.
25	21. The exact number of instances of diversion/theft by Respondent, and the full quantity
26	of controlled substances or dangerous drugs diverted/stolen by Respondent, are not known, but in
27	the course of investigations conducted by the pharmacy and by police, the following were among
28	the observations, admissions, and revelations reported:
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After pharmacy auditors/investigators identified what they believed were thefts a 1 by one or more employees between in or about May 2008 and in or about September 2008 of 2 approximately sixty (60) 500-tablet bottles of Norco (and/or generic Hydrocodone-containing 3 equivalents), they installed surveillance cameras in the pharmacy in late September 2008. The 4 cameras showed Respondent engaged in suspicious behavior with regard to Hydrocodone drugs. 5 Respondent subsequently admitted to police investigators that sometime during b. 6 her employment by Owens Pharmacy No. 7, she began taking un-opened bottles (containing 500 7 tablets) of Norco (and/or its generic equivalents) and selling them to an individual for a price of 8 \$900.00 per bottle. She said that she did this repeatedly, though did not identify a total number. 9 She said that she was motivated by the money she made in these transactions. 10 Subsequent audit(s) of the controlled substances stock of Owens Pharmacy No. c. 11 7 revealed a shortage of approximately 35,237 tablets of Norco and/or Hydrocodone with APAP 12 10/325 (generic Norco) for the period from May 2008 through September 2008, and an additional 13 shortage of approximately 70,900 tablets of Norco and/or its generic equivalents from April 2007 14 to May 2008, for a total documented shortage/loss of approximately 106,137 tablets. 15 16 17 FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 18 19 (Acts Involving Moral Turpitude, Dishonesty, Fraud, Deceit or Corruption) Respondent is subject to discipline under section 4301(f) of the Code, in that 22. 20 Respondent, as described in paragraphs 19 to 21 above, committed numerous acts involving 21 moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption. 22 SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 23 (Furnishing of Controlled Substance(s)) 24 23. Respondent is subject to discipline under section 4301(j) and/or (o) and/or section 25 4059 of the Code, and/or Health and Safety Code section 11170, in that Respondent, as described 26 in paragraphs 19 to 21 above, furnished to herself or another without a valid prescription, and/or 27 conspired to furnish, and/or assisted or abetted furnishing of, a controlled substance. 28 5

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3	24. Respondent is subject to discipline under section 4301(j) and/or (o) and/or section
4	4060 of the Code, and/or Health and Safety Code section 11350, in that Respondent, as described
5	in paragraphs 19 to 21 above, possessed, conspired to possess, and/or assisted in or abetted
6	possession of, a controlled substance, without a prescription.
7	FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
8	(Obtaining Controlled Substance by Fraud, Deceit or Subterfuge)
9	25. Respondent is subject to discipline under section 4301(j) and/or (o) of the Code,
10	and/or Health and Safety Code section 11173(a), in that Respondent, as described in paragraphs
11	19 to 21 above, obtained, conspired to obtain, and/or assisted in or abetted the obtaining of a
12	controlled substance, by fraud, deceit, subterfuge, or concealment of material fact.

14	(Possession or Purchase of Controlled Substance(s) for Sale)
15	26. Respondent is subject to discipline under section 4301(j) and/or (o) of the Code,
16	and/or Health and Safety Code section 11351, in that Respondent, as described in paragraphs 19
17	to 21 above, possessed or purchased for sale, conspired to possess or purchase for sale, and/or
18	assisted in or abetted the possession or purchase for sale, of a controlled substance.
19	SIXTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
20	(Conviction of Substantially Related Crime(s))
21	27. Respondent is subject to discipline under section 4301(1) and/or section 490 of the
.22	Code, by reference to California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, for the conviction of
23	substantially related crime(s), in that on or about January 29, 2010, in the criminal case People v.
24	Rita Jeanine Garibaldi, Case No. CR146087 in Napa County Superior Court, Respondent was
25	convicted on the basis of the conduct described in paragraphs 19 to 21 above of violating Penal
26	Code section 487(a) (Grand theft of personal property over \$400.00), a felony, as follows:
