16	In the interest of a prompt and speedy resolution of this matter, consistent with the public							
17	interest and the responsibility of the Board of Pharmacy of the Department of Consumer Affairs							
18	the parties hereby agree to the following Stipulated Surrender of License and Order which will be							
19	submitted to the Board for approval and adoption as the final disposition of the Accusation.							
20	<u>PARTIES</u>							
21	1. Virginia Herold (Complainant), Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, brough							
22	this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this matter by Kamala D. Harris,							
23	Attorney General of the State of California, by Joshua A. Room, Deputy Attorney General.							
24	2. Wayne Buencamino Cuayu (Respondent) is representing himself in this proceeding							
25	and has chosen not to exercise his right to be represented by counsel.							
26	3. On or about July 19, 2007, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician							
27	License No. TCH 77398 to Respondent. The License was in full force and effect at all times							

relevant to the charges in Accusation No. 3658 and will expire on June 30, 2011, unless renewed.

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#### JURISDICTION

Accusation No. 3658 was filed before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of 4. Consumer Affairs, and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on October 1, 2010. Respondent timely filed his Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 3658 is attached as exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

#### ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- Respondent has carefully read, and understands, the charges and allegations in 5. Accusation No. 3658. Respondent also has carefully read, and understands, the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.
- Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a 6. hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at his own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and 7. every right set forth above.

#### **CULPABILITY**

- 8. Respondent admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation No. 3658, agrees that cause exists for discipline, and hereby surrenders his Pharmacy Technician License No. TCH 77398 for the Board's formal acceptance.
- 9. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of his Pharmacy Technician Registration without further process.

#### CONTINGENCY

This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board of Pharmacy. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board of Pharmacy may

communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondent. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.

- 11. The parties understand and agree that facsimile copies of this stipulation, including facsimile signatures, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 12. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement. It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions, negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.
- 13. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

#### **ORDER**

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician License No. TCH 77398, issued to Respondent Wayne Buencamino Cuayu, is surrendered and accepted by the Board of Pharmacy.

- 14. The surrender of Respondent's Pharmacy Technician License and the acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of Respondent's license history with the Board.
- 15. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a Pharmacy Technician in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
- 16. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was issued, his wall certificate, on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.

- Respondent may not apply, reapply, or petition for any licensure or registration of the Board for three (3) years from the effective date of the Decision and Order.
- If Respondent ever applies for licensure or petitions for reinstatement in the State of 18. California, the Board shall treat it as a new application for licensure. Respondent must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for licensure in effect at the time the application or petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 3658 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the application or petition.
- If Respondent ever applies or reapplies for a new license or certification, or petitions for reinstatement of a license, from or by any other health care licensing agency in the State of California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation, No. 3658 shall be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.
- Respondent shall pay the Board its costs of investigation and enforcement in the amount of \$1,757.50 prior to issuance of a new or reinstated license.

### ACCEPTANCE

I have carefully read the Stipulated Surrender of License and Order. I understand the stipulation and the effect it will have on my Pharmacy Technician License. I enter into this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Decision and Order of the Board of Pharmacy.

21	2. On or about July 19, 2007, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician						
22	License No. TCH 77398 to Wayne Buencamino Cuayu (Respondent). The Pharmacy Technician						
23	License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will						
24	expire on June 30, 2011, unless renewed.						
25	JURISDIC	<u>JURISDICTION</u>					
26	3. This Accusation is brought before the B	oard of Pharmacy (Board), Department o	of				
27	Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the						
28	Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.						

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- 4. Section 4011 of the Code provides that the Board shall administer and enforce both the Pharmacy Law [Bus. & Prof. Code, § 4000 et seq.] and the Uniform Controlled Substances Act [Health & Safety Code, § 11000 et seq.].
- 5. Section 4300(a) of the Code provides that every license issued by the Board may be suspended or revoked.
- 6. Section 118(b) of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the suspension, expiration, surrender, or cancellation of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued or reinstated. Section 4402(a) of the Code provides that any pharmacist license that is not renewed within three years following its expiration may not be renewed, restored, or reinstated and shall be canceled by operation of law at the end of the three-year period. Section 4402(e) of the Code provides that any other license issued by the Board may be canceled by the Board if not renewed within 60 days after its expiration, and any license canceled in this fashion may not be reissued but will instead require a new application to seek reissuance.

# STATUTORY AND REGULATORY PROVISIONS

- 7. Section 4301 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of "unprofessional conduct," defined to include, but not be limited to, any of the following:
- (h) The administering to oneself, of any controlled substance, or the use of any dangerous drug or of alcoholic beverages to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to oneself, to a person holding a license under this chapter, or to any other person or to the public, or to the extent that the use impairs the ability of the person to conduct with safety to the public the practice authorized by the license.
- (l) The conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a licensee under this chapter.
- 8. Section 490 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may suspend or revoke a license when it finds that the licensee has been convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of the license.

9. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, states:

"For the purpose of denial, suspension, or revocation of a personal or facility license pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and Professions Code, a crime or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or registrant if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of a licensee or registrant to perform the functions authorized by her license or registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare."

#### COST RECOVERY

10. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed its reasonable costs of investigation and enforcement.

#### FACTUAL BACKGROUND

11. On or about August 18, 2008, Respondent and a female companion were traveling in an automobile, and they stopped at a gas station in Milpitas, CA. Respondent had been drinking, and was under the influence of alcohol. Respondent and his companion got into an argument that soon turned physical. According to statements from witnesses and/or Respondent's companion (the victim), during the succeeding altercation Respondent: punched, kicked, restrained, and bit the neck and ear of the victim; threatened the victim; and drove the vehicle out of the gas station, and back into the gas station, while threatening to use the vehicle to run over the victim.

#### FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Conviction of Substantially Related Crime(s))

12. Respondent is subject to discipline under section 4301(1) and/or section 490 of the Code, by reference to California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, for the conviction of substantially related crime(s), in that on or about April 8, 2009, in *People v. Wayne Buencamino Cuayu*, Case No. CC815671 in Santa Clara County Superior Court, Respondent was convicted on the basis of the conduct described in paragraph 11 of violating (1) Vehicle Code section 23152(b) (Driving with blood alcohol of 0.08% or more), a misdemeanor, and (2) Penal Code section 245(a)(1) (Assault likely to cause great bodily injury), a felony, as follows::

- a. On or about August 20, 2008, based on the conduct described in paragraph 11, Respondent was charged by criminal Complaint in Case No. CC815671 with violating (1) Penal Code section 203 (Mayhem damage/disabling of ear), a felony, with a special allegation for the infliction of great bodily injury pursuant to Penal Code sections 667 and 1192.7, (2) Penal Code section(s) 242-243(d) (Battery causing serious bodily injury), a felony, with a special allegation for the infliction of great bodily injury pursuant to Penal Code sections 667 and 1192.7, (3) Vehicle Code section 23152(a) (Driving under influence of alcohol), a misdemeanor, and (4) Vehicle Code section 23152(b) (Driving with blood alcohol of 0.08% or more), a misdemeanor.
- b. On or about April 8, 2009, an amendment was made to add another charge for violating (5) Penal Code section 245(a)(1) (Assault likely to cause great bodily injury), a felony with a special allegation for the infliction of great bodily injury pursuant to Penal Code sections 667 and 1192.7. Respondent pleaded nolo contendere to counts (4) and (5) and was convicted of violating Vehicle Code section 23152(b) (Driving with blood alcohol of 0.08% or more), a misdemeanor, and Penal Code section 245(a)(1) (Assault likely to cause great bodily injury), a felony, with a special allegation for the infliction of great bodily injury pursuant to Penal Code sections 667 and 1192.7. Counts one to three were dismissed pursuant to the plea
- b. On or about June 9, 2009, imposition of sentence was suspended in favor of a period of formal probation of three (3) years on terms and conditions including ten (10) months in county jail (3 days CTS), a treatment program, driver's license suspension, and fines and fees.

## SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Dangerous or Injurious Use of Alcohol)

13. Respondent is subject to discipline under section 4301(h) of the Code, in that as described in paragraphs 11 and 12, Respondent used alcohol in a dangerous or injurious manner.

#### THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct)

14. Respondent is subject to discipline under section 4301 of the Code in that, as described in paragraphs 11 to 13, Respondent engaged in unprofessional conduct.

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#### PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician License No. TCH 77398, issued to Wayne Buencamino Cuayu (Respondent);
- 2. Ordering Respondent to pay the Board the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3;
  - 3. Taking such other and further action as is deemed necessary and proper.
