19	IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties in this
20	proceeding that the following matters are true:
21	PARTIES
22	1. Virginia K. Herold (Complainant) is the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy.
23	She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this matter by Kamala
24	D. Harris, Attorney General of the State of California, by Sterling A. Smith, Deputy Attorney
25	General.
26	2. Stevi Elizabeth Ramirez (Respondent) is representing herself in this proceeding and
27	has chosen not to exercise her right to be represented by counsel.

3. On or about December 16, 2003, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician 1 2 License No. TCH 51354 to Stevi Elizabeth Ramirez (Respondent). The license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 3828 and will expire on 3 4 February 28, 2011, unless renewed. JURISDICTION 5 Accusation No. 3828 was filed before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of 4. 6 Consumer Affairs, and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other 7 8 statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on January 5, 2011. Respondent timely filed her Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation 9 No. 3828 is attached as exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference. 10 ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS 11 5.÷ Respondent has carefully read, and understands the charges and allegations in 12 Accusation No. 3828. Respondent also has carefully read, and understands the effects of this 13 Stipulated Surrender of License and Order. 14 6. Respondent is fully aware of her legal rights in this matter, including the right to a 15 hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at 16 her own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against her; the right to 17 present evidence and to testify on her own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to 18 19 compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California 20 21 Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and 7. 22 23 every right set forth above. CULPABILITY 24 Respondent admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation of Accusation 8. 25 No. 3828. 26 9. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation she enables the Board to issue 27 an order accepting the surrender of her Pharmacy Technician License without further process. 28 2

10. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board of Pharmacy. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondent. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that she may not withdraw her agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.

11. The parties understand and agree that facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.

14 12. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an
15 integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement.
16 It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions,
17 negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order
18 may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing
19 executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

13. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

#### **ORDER**

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician License No. TCH 51354, issued to
 Respondent Stevi Elizabeth Ramirez is surrendered and accepted by the Board of Pharmacy.

14. The surrender of Respondent's Pharmacy Technician License and the acceptance of
the surrendered license by the Board, shall constitute the imposition of discipline against
Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of
Respondent's license history with the Board.

15. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a pharmacy technician in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.

16. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board both her wall license certificate and, if one was issued, pocket license on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.

17. Respondent may not apply for issuance of a new pharmacy technician license or petition for reinstatement of her license for a period of three (3) years from and after the effective date of the Decision and Order. If she ever applies for licensure or petitions for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a new application for licensure. Respondent must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for licensure in effect at the time the application or petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 3828 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the application or petition.

18. Should Respondent ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation, No. 3828 shall be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

18 19. Respondent shall pay the Board its costs of investigation and enforcement in the
amount of \$5,000.00 prior to issuance of a new or reinstated license.

#### ACCEPTANCE

I have carefully read the Stipulated Surrender of License and Order. I understand the
stipulation and the effect it will have on my Pharmacy Technician License. I enter into this
Stipulated Surrender of License and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to

· 2	3. Under Business & Professions Code section 4300, the Board may discipline any
3	license, for any reason provided in the Pharmacy Law (i.e., Business & Professions Code sections
4	4000 et. seq.).
5	4. Business & Professions Code section 4301 states, in pertinent part:
6	"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional
7	conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake.
8	Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:
· 9	••••
10	(f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud,
11	deceit, or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or
12	otherwise, and whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor.
13	• • • •
14	(h) The administering to oneself, of any controlled substance, or the use of any
. 15	dangerous drug or of alcoholic beverages to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or
16	injurios to oneself, to a person holding a license under this chapter, or to any other person or to
17	the public, or to the extent that the use impairs the ability of the person to conduct with safety to
18	the public the practice authorized by the license.

20	(j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state or of the United States
21	regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.

23	(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or
24	abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the
25	applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations
26	established by the board.

5. Business & Professions Code section 4060 provides, in pertinent part, that "no person shall possess any controlled substance, except that furnished to a person upon the prescription of 2 a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7..." 4

6. Business & Professions Code section 4059, subdivision (a), provides, in pertinent part, that "a person may not furnish any dangerous drug, except upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7."

7. Health & Safety Code section 11350, subdivision (a), provides in pertinent part that 9 "...every person who possesses...(2) any controlled substance classified in Schedule III, IV, or V 10 which is a narcotic drug, unless upon the written prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, or 11 veterinarian licensed to practice in this state, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state 12 prison". 13

Health & Safety Code section 11173, subdivision (a) provides that "no person shall 8. 14 obtain or attempt to obtain controlled substances, or procure or attempt to procure the 15 administration of or prescription for controlled substances, (1) by fraud, deceit, misrepresentation, 16 17 or subterfuge; or (2) by the concealment of a material fact".

9: Business & Professions Code section 118 (b), states: The suspension, expiration, or 18 19 forfeiture by operation of law of a license issued by a board in the department, or its suspension, forfeiture, or cancellation by order of the board or by order of a court of law, or its surrender 20 without the written consent of the board, shall not, during any period in which it may be renewed, 21 restored, reissued, or reinstated, deprive the board of its authority to institute or continue a 22 23 disciplinary proceeding against the licensee upon any ground provided by law or to enter an order suspending or revoking the license or otherwise taking disciplinary action against the licensee on 24 any such ground. 25

Business & Professions Code section 125.3 states, in pertinent part, that the Board 26 10. may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed 27

## CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES/DANGEROUS DRUGS AT ISSUE

11. Hydrocodone with acetaminophen is a dangerous drug, a narcotic drug and a
Schedule III controlled substance as designated by Health & Safety Code section 11056(e)(4).
Hydrocodone with acetaminophen is dispensed as HC/AP 5/500 mg tablets and also as HC/AP
10/325 mg tablets.

12. At all relevant times from and after March 21, 2004, Respondent Stevi Elizabeth Ramirez was employed as a pharmacy technician by Bel Air Pharmacy # 510, 1540 West El Camino, Sacramento, California 95833.

13. From time to time during the period of from in or about the end of 2006 through in or about the end of 2009, Respondent stole approximately 3,000 HC/AP 10/325 mg tablets from the inventory of Bel Air Pharmacy #510 during the performance of her duties as a pharmacy technician employed by Bel Air Pharmacy #510. During said period of time, Respondent administered said HC/AP 10/325 mg tablets to herself at the rate of approximately 7-8 tablets/day and became addicted to said medication and other painkilling medications.

#### FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct: Violation of Drug Laws)

Paragraphs 1 through 13 above are incorporated by reference. Respondent Stevi
 Elizabeth Ramirez is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct under Business &
 Professions Code sections 4301(j) and 4301(o), by her violations of:

(a) Business and Professions Code section 4059(a) by furnishing HC/AP 10/325 mg
tablets to herself without a prescription;

(b) Business and Professions Code section 4060 and Health & Safety Code section
11350(a) by her possession of HC/AP 10/325 mg tablets without a prescription;

26 (c) Health & Safety Code section 11173(a) by her acts of obtaining HC/AP 10/325
27 mg tablets by fraud, deceit or subterfuge.

3	15. Paragraphs 1 through 13 above are incorporated by reference. Respondent is subject
4	to disciplinary action under Business & Professions Code section 4301(f) in that she committed
5	acts of moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption. As alleged in Paragraph 13, while
6 :	working as a pharmacy technician for employer Bel Air Pharmacy #510, Respondent stole
7	approximately 3,000 HC/AP 10/325 mg tablets from the inventory of Bel Air Pharmacy #510.

9	(Unprofessional Conduct: Self-Administration of Controlled Substances to an Extent or in a
10	Manner Dangerous or Injurious.)
11	16. Paragraphs 1 through 13 above are incorporated by reference. Respondent Stevi
12	Elizabeth Ramirez is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct under Business &
13	Professions Code section 4301(h) in that Respondent administered HC/AP 10/325 mg tablets to
14	herself to an extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to herself, to others or the
15	public, and to the extent that the use impaired her ability to conduct with safety to the public the
16	practice authorized by the license. As alleged in Paragraph 13, Respondent became addicted to
17	said controlled substance and other painkillers, self-administering HC/AP 10/325 mg tablets
18	daily.
19	PRAYER
20	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
21	and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:
22	1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician License No. TCH 51354 issued to
23	Respondent Stevi Elizabeth Ramirez;
24	2. Ordering Respondent to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the
25	investigation and enforcement pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and
