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	l	DEFAULT DECISION AND ORDER

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1	Discovery, and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7) at
2	Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4100,
3	is required to be reported and maintained with the Board. Respondent's address of record was

6	4. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of
7	Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c) and/or Business & Professions Code section
8	124.
9	5. Government Code section 11506 states, in pertinent part:
10	(c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent
11	files a notice of defense, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense shall
12	constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.
13	6. Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon him
14	of the Accusation, and therefore waived his right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No.
15	4313.
16 17	7. California Government Code section 11520 states, in pertinent part:
18	(a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense or to appear at the barring, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's surrous admissions.
19	hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent.

21	8. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds
22	Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the
23	relevant evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this matter, as well as
24	taking official notice of all the investigatory reports, exhibits and statements contained therein on
25	file at the Board's offices regarding the allegations contained in Accusation No. 4313, finds that
26	the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 4313, are separately and severally, found to be true
27	and correct by clear and convincing evidence.
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1	9. Taking official notice of its own internal records, pursuant to Business and
2	Professions Code section 125.3, it is hereby determined that the reasonable costs for Investigation
3	and Enforcement is \$1,965.00 as of August 23, 2012.
4	DETERMINATION OF ISSUES
5	1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Thomas Anthony Delmore has
6	subjected his Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 90953 to discipline.
7	2. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.
8	3. The Board of Pharmacy is authorized to revoke Respondent's Pharmacy Technician
9	Registration based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation which are supported
10	by the evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this case.:
11	a. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301(h) of the code in that
12	Respondent used drugs in a manner that was dangerous or injurious to himself and/or others. On
13	or about July 7, 2011, Respondent used methamphetamine.
14	b. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301(j) of the code in that
15	Respondent violated the statutes of California that regulate controlled substances and dangerous
16	drugs. The circumstances are as follows:
17	i. On or about July 7, 2011, Respondent was under the influence of methamphetamine
18	in violation of California Health and Safety Code § 11550.
19	ii. On or about July 7, 2011, Respondent possessed drug paraphernalia (a
20	methamphetamine pipe) in violation of California Health and Safety Code §
21	11364.
22	
23	ORDER
24	IT IS SO ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 90953, heretofore
25	issued to Respondent Thomas Anthony Delmore, is revoked.
26	Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a
27	written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within

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1	seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion may
2	vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute.
3	This Decision shall become effective on November 26, 2012.
