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21	FINDINGS OF FACT		
22.	1. On or about May 3, 2014, Complainant Virginia K. Herold, in her official capacity as		
23	the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs, filed		
24	Accusation No. 4673 against Antoinette Latrece Blue (Respondent) before the Board of		
25	Pharmacy. (Accusation attached as Exhibit A.)		
26	2. On or about November 14, 2008, the Board of Pharmacy (Board) issued Pharmacy		
27	Technician Registration No. TCH 85892 to Respondent. The Pharmacy Technician Registration		
28	was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 4673		

and expired on April 30, 2014 and has not been renewed. This lapse in licensure, however, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 118(b) and/or agency-specific statute does not deprive the [Board] of its authority to institute or continue this disciplinary proceeding.

- 3. On or about May 13, 2014, Respondent was served by Certified and First Class Mail copies of the Accusation No. 4673, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for Discovery, and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7) at Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4100, is required to be reported and maintained with the Board. Respondent's address of record was and is:
- 1503 W. 111th Pl. Los Angeles, CA 90047.
- 4. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c) and/or Business & Professions Code section 124.
 - 5. Government Code section 11506 states, in pertinent part:
 - (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.
- 6. Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon her of the Accusation, and therefore waived her right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 4673.
 - 7. California Government Code section 11520 states, in pertinent part:
 - (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent.
- 8. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds
 Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the
 relevant evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this matter, as well as
 taking official notice of all the investigatory reports, exhibits and statements contained therein on

file at the Board's offices regarding the allegations contained in Accusation No. 4673, finds that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 4673, are separately and severally, found to be true and correct by clear and convincing evidence.

9. Taking official notice of its own internal records, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3, it is hereby determined that the reasonable costs for Investigation and Enforcement is \$3,200.00 as of September 11, 2014.

DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

- 1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Antoinette Latrece Blue has subjected her Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 85892 to discipline.
 - 2. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.
- 3. The Board of Pharmacy is authorized to revoke Respondent's Pharmacy Technician Registration based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation which are supported by the evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this case.:
- a. Respondent violated Business and Professions Code sections 490, 4300 and 4301, subdivision (l), in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that Respondent was convicted of a substantially related crime.
- b. Respondent violated Business and Professions Code section 4301, subdivision (o), in that Respondent committed acts of unprofessional conduct and/ or violated provisions of the licensing chapter.
- c. Respondent violated Business and Professions Code sections 4300 and 4301, subdivision (f), on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that Respondent committed acts involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption.

ORDER

IT IS SO ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 85892, heretofore issued to Respondent Antoinette Latrece Blue, is revoked.

Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within

1	seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion may		
2	vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute.		
3	This Decision shall become effective on November 10, 2014.

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STATUTORY PROVISIONS

- 4. Section 118, subdivision (b), provides that the suspension, expiration, surrender or cancellation of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued or reinstated.
 - 5. Section 490 states, in pertinent part:
- "(a) In addition to any other action that a board is permitted to take against a licensee, a board may suspend or revoke a license on the ground that the licensee has been convicted of a crime, if the crime is substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the business or profession for which the license was issued.
- "(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a board may exercise any authority to discipline a licensee for conviction of a crime that is independent of the authority granted under subdivision (a) only if the crime is substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the business or profession for which the licensee's license was issued.
- "(c) A conviction within the meaning of this section means a plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere. Any action that a board is permitted to take following the establishment of a conviction may be taken when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal, or when an order granting probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under the provisions of Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code. . . ."
- 6. Section 4300, subdivision (a), states that "[e]very license issued may be suspended or revoked."
 - 7. Section 4301 states, in pertinent part:

"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake.

Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

"(f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and

whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.

"(g) Knowingly making or signing any certificate or other document that falsely represents the existence or nonexistence of a state of facts.

"(1) The conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a licensee under this chapter. . . ."

REGULATORY PROVISION

8. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770 states:

"For the purpose of denial, suspension, or revocation of a personal or facility license pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and Professions Code, a crime or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or registrant if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of a licensee or registrant to perform the functions authorized by his license or registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare."

COST RECOVERY

9. Section 125.3 provides that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Conviction of a Substantially Related Crime)

- 10. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under sections 490, 4300 and 4301, subdivision (1), in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that Respondent was convicted of a substantially related crime, as follows:
- a. On or about February 19, 2014, after pleading guilty, Respondent was convicted of one felony count of violating Penal Code sections 459-460, subdivision (d) [Second Degree Commercial Burglary] in the criminal proceeding entitled *The People of the State of California v. Antonette Latrece Blue* (Super. Ct. Orange County, No. IPD 12-07092). The Court sentenced

Respondent to 90 days in jail, placed her on three (3) years probation, ordered her to pay full restitution and additional fees and costs.

b. The circumstances underlying the conviction are that on or about May 27, 2012, Respondent entered a Target in Irvine, CA and made a purchase using fake American Express Cashier's checks. Respondent was subsequently arrested by the Irvine Police Department for violating Penal Code section 459 [burglary: second degree], Penal code section 475, subdivision (c) [possessing completed check with intent to defraud].

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct/ Violation of Licensing Chapter)

11. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (o), in that Respondent committed acts of unprofessional conduct and/ or violated provisions of the licensing chapter. Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates, the allegations set forth above in paragraph 9, as though set forth fully.

THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Acts Involving Moral Turpitude, Dishonesty, Fraud, Deceit, or Corruption)

12. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under sections 4300 and 4301, subdivision (f), on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that Respondent committed acts involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption. Complainant refers to and by this reference incorporates the allegations set forth above in paragraphs 9, as though set forth fully.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board issue a decision:

- Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 85892, issued to
 Antoinette Latrece Blue;
- 2. Ordering Antoinette Latrece Blue to pay the Board the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to section 125.3; and
