Code, §11520] 14 89567 15 Respondent. 16 FINDINGS OF FACT 17 On or about October 3, 2013, Complainant Virginia Herold, in her official capacity as 18 the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs, filed 19 Accusation No. 4730 against Michelle Gordon (Respondent) before the Board of Pharmacy. 20 (Accusation attached as exhibit A.) 21 On or about April 14, 2009, the Board of Pharmacy (Board) issued Pharmacy 2. 22 Technician Registration No. TCH 89567 to Respondent. The Pharmacy Technician Registration 23 was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 4730 24 and will expire on May 31, 2014, unless renewed. 25 On or about January 13, 2014, Respondent was served by Certified Mail copies of the 26 Accusation No. 4730, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for Discovery, and 27 Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7) at Respondent's 28

address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4100, is required to be reported and maintained with the Board. Respondent's address of record was and is:

Michelle Gordon 27816 Crowne Point Drive Salinas, CA 93908.

- 4. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c) and/or Business & Professions Code section 124.
- 5. On or about January 29, 2014, the aforementioned documents were delivered to Respondent's address of record, as set forth in paragraph 3, above.
 - 6. Government Code section 11506 states, in pertinent part:
 - (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.
- 7. Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon her of the Accusation, and therefore waived her right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 4730.
 - 8. California Government Code section 11520 states, in pertinent part:
 - (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent.
- 9. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the relevant evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this matter, as well as taking official notice of all the investigatory reports, exhibits and statements contained therein on file at the Board's offices regarding the allegations contained in Accusation No. 4730, finds that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 4730, are separately and severally, found to be true and correct by clear and convincing evidence.
- 10. Taking official notice of its own internal records, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3, it is hereby determined that the reasonable costs for Investigation

and Enforcement is \$6,087.00 as of March 12, 2014.

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DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

- 1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Michelle Gordon has subjected her Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 89567 to discipline.
 - 2. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.
- 3. The Board of Pharmacy is authorized to revoke Respondent's Pharmacy Technician Registration based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation which are supported by the evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this case:
- a. Respondent's license is subject to revocation pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4301, subdivision (f) in that without authorization and in violation of the law, she obtained and possessed controlled substances and/or dangerous drugs as follows:
- 1. Between April of 2012 until June 15, 2012, while employed as a pharmacy technician at CVS Pharmacy #9802 in Monterey, California, Respondent admitted to stealing for her personal use approximately 210 tablets of Hydrocodone, 7 tablets of Suboxone, and 15 tablets of Soma from the pharmacy.
- 2. Between October 12, 2011 and February 10, 2012, while employed at Dr. Fisher's office in San Jose, California, Respondent admitted to calling in fraudulent prescriptions and obtained 60 dosage units of Diazepam (RX242670) and 120 dosage units of Lorazepam (RX235945 and RX249922) from CVS Pharmacy 9808.
- 3. Between August 2011 and February 2012, while employed at Dr. Fisher's office in San Jose, California, Respondent admitted to obtaining 60 dosage units of Hydrocodone/Acetaminophen (RX4409736 and RX4409785) and 180 dosage units of Alprazolam (RX4410465 and RX4411076) from Target Store #T-1927, after "Rachel" and/or "Michelle" called in fraudulent prescriptions.
- 4. In November, 2011, while employed at Dr. Fisher's office in San Jose, California, Respondent admitted to obtaining 60 dosage units of Diazepam (RX4607744) from Lucky #763 after "Rachel" called in a fraudulent prescription.

7. Section 4060 of the Code states:

"No person shall possess any controlled substance, except that furnished to a person upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7, or furnished pursuant to a drug order issued by a certified nurse-midwife pursuant to Section 2746.51, a nurse practitioner pursuant to Section 2836.1, or a physician assistant pursuant to Section 3502.1, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.5, or a pharmacist pursuant to either subparagraph (D) of paragraph (4) of, or clause (iv) of subparagraph (A) of paragraph (5) of, subdivision (a) of Section 4052. This section shall not apply to the possession of any controlled substance by a manufacturer, wholesaler, pharmacy, pharmacist, physician, podiatrist, dentist, optometrist, veterinarian, naturopathic doctor, certified nurse-midwife, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant, when in stock in containers correctly labeled with the name and address of the supplier or producer.

"Nothing in this section authorizes a certified nurse-midwife, a nurse practitioner, a physician assistant, or a naturopathic doctor, to order his or her own stock of dangerous drugs and devices."

COST RECOVERY

8. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be included in a stipulated settlement.

DRUGS

9. "Lorcet", "Lortab", "Norco", and "Vicodin" each contain the generic named narcotic Hydrocodone/Acetaminophen, and are used to relieve pain. It is a Schedule III controlled substance, as designated by health and Safety Code section 11056, subdivision (e)(4), and a dangerous drug pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4022.

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- 10. "Suboxone" (generic name "Buprenorphine/Naloxone) is used to treat opiod dependence. It is a Schedule III controlled substance, as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11056 and a dangerous drug pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4022.
- 11. "Soma" (generic name "Carisoprodol") is used as a muscle relaxer. It is a Schedule IV controlled substance, as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11057, and a dangerous drug pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4022.
- 12. "Valium" (generic name "Diazepam") is used to treat anxiety, panic attacks, insomnia and seizures. It is a Schedule IV controlled substance, as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11057, subdivision (d)(9), and a dangerous drug pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4022.
- 13. "Ativan" (generic name "Lorazepam") is used to treat anxiety. It is a Schedule IV controlled substance, as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11057, subdivision (d)(16), and a dangerous drug pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4022.
- 14. "Bontril" (generic name "Phendimetrazine") is used to treat obesity. It is a Schedule III controlled substance, as designated by health and Safety Code section 11056, subdivision (b) (6), and a dangerous drug pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4022.
- 15. "Xanax" (generic name "Alprazolam") is a benzodiazepam derivative that is used to treat anxiety and panic disorder. It is a Schedule IV controlled substance, as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11057, subdivision (d)(1), and a dangerous drug pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4022.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct: Theft of Controlled Substances)

- 16. Respondent has subjected her license to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subdivision (f) in that without authorization and in violation of the law she obtained and possessed controlled substances and/or dangerous drugs as follows:
- A. Between April of 2012 until June 15, 2012, while employed as a pharmacy technician at CVS/Pharmacy #9802 in Monterey, California, Respondent admitted stealing for her

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PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters alleged in this Accusation, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 89567, issued to Michelle Gordon;
- Ordering Michelle Gordon to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3;
