FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On or about October 21, 2013, Complainant Virginia Herold, in her official capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy ("Board"), Department of Consumer Affairs, filed Accusation No. 4741 against Krystle Amber Mobley ("Respondent") before the Board of Pharmacy. (Accusation attached as Exhibit A.)

2. On or about June 28, 2006, the Board issued Pharmacy Technician License No. 69734 to Respondent. The Pharmacy Technician License was in full force and effect at all times

1 relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 4741, and will expire on September 30, 2015,
2 unless renewed.

3 3. On or about November 7, 2013, Respondent was served by Certified and First Class
4 Mail copies of the Accusation No. 4741, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request
5 for Discovery, and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and
6 11507.7) at Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code
7 section 4100, is required to be reported and maintained with the Board. Respondent's address of
8 record was:

11 4. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of
12 Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c) and/or Business & Professions Code section
13 124.

14 5. On or about December 2, 2013, the aforementioned documents were returned by the
15 U.S. Postal Service marked "Not Deliverable as Addressed - Unable to Forward." The address on
16 the documents was the same as the address on file with the Board.

17 6. On or about December 12, 2013, the Board received a notice of change of address
18 from Respondent.

19 7. On or about February 14, 2014, Respondent was served by Certified and First Class
20 Mail copies of the Accusation No. 4741, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request
21 for Discovery, and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and
22 11507.7) at Respondent's new address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions
23 Code section 4100, is required to be reported and maintained with the Board. Respondent's
24 address of record is:

26 Escalon, CA 95320.

1 8. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of
2 Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c) and/or Business & Professions Code section
3 124.

4 9. Government Code section 11506 states, in pertinent part:

5 (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent
6 files a notice of defense, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts
7 of the accusation not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense shall
8 constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion
9 may nevertheless grant a hearing.

10 10. Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon her of
11 the Accusation, and therefore waived her right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 4741.

12 11. California Government Code section 11520 states, in pertinent part:

13 (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense or to appear at the
14 hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions
15 or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to
16 respondent.

17 12. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds
18 Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the
19 relevant evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this matter, as well as
20 taking official notice of all the investigatory reports, exhibits and statements contained therein on
21 file at the Board's offices regarding the allegations contained in Accusation No. 4741, finds that
22 the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 4741, are separately and severally, found to be true
23 and correct by clear and convincing evidence.

24 13. Taking official notice of its own internal records, pursuant to Business and
25 Professions Code section 125.3, it is hereby determined that the reasonable costs for Investigation
26 and Enforcement is \$2,695 as of March 27, 2014.

27 **DETERMINATION OF ISSUES**

28 1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Krystle Amber Mobley has
subjected her Pharmacy Technician Registration No. 69734 to discipline.

 2. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.

1 3. The Board of Pharmacy is authorized to revoke Respondent's Pharmacy Technician
2 Registration based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation which are supported
3 by the evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this case.:

4 a. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (l), in that
5 on or about October 2, 2012, in the case of *People v. Krystle Amber Mobley* (Superior Court, San
6 Joaquin County Case No. MF035146A), Respondent was convicted on her plea of guilty of
7 violating Business and Professions Code 4060 (Possession of Dangerous Drug without a
8 Prescription- Flexeril), a misdemeanor. The circumstances are as follows: On or about August 2,
9 2012, a Police Officer with the Escalon Police Department observed Respondent driving a vehicle
10 without a front license plate. The Officer followed Respondent into a gas station parking lot and
11 initiated a traffic stop. The Officer discovered that Respondent's license was suspended on April
12 25, 2012, for failure to appear and not having insurance. In preparation for towing, the Officer
13 conducted an inventory search of Respondent's vehicle and recovered various items, including:
14 (1) a plastic bag retrieved from the driver side door storage compartment which contained 14
15 white pills imprinted with L374 and 21 yellow pills imprinted with TL177; (2) a clear plastic
16 baggie with marijuana leafs imprinted which contained residue of an off white powdery substance
17 was retrieved from Respondent's purse; (3) Aluminum foil with charred residue; (4) a small blue
18 pill imprinted with 10 DAN 5620; and (5) a glass pipe with burnt residue. The Officer learned
19 that the 14 white pills were over the counter medication to treat migraines and the 21 yellow pills
20 were Flexeril, a muscle relaxer. Respondent admitted that she found the pills inside a drawer at
21 her grandfather's house and that she did not have a prescription to possess the Flexeril.
22 Respondent also admitted that the residue found inside the clear plastic baggie was
23 Methamphetamine and that she used the aluminum foil to smoke Heroin. Respondent admitted to
24 the Officer that she was addicted to Heroin and had to smoke it at least once a day to avoid
25 getting sick and to avoid having any withdrawal symptoms, and that she only smokes
26 Methamphetamine to avoid getting sick when she can't get any Heroin.

27 b. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4060, in that Respondent was
28 in possession of a controlled substance without authorization or a valid prescription. The

1 circumstances are as follows: On or about July 11, 2013, Respondent was stopped by a Modesto
2 Police Officer for using her cellular phone while driving. A records check of respondent's license
3 confirmed Respondent's license was suspended since March of 2012. In preparation for towing,
4 the Officer conducted an inventory search of Respondent's vehicle. In conducting the inventory
5 search, the Officer found three square pieces of tin foil with blackened residue on them, two
6 square pieces of tin foil wrapped up that had a black tar-like substance inside of them located in
7 the driver's side door panel, and three plastic straws. Respondent admitted that she uses the
8 straws to smoke her Heroin. The Officer conducted a chemical test on the black tar like
9 substance found in the tin foil and it showed to be presumptive positive for Heroin. Respondent
10 admitted to using Heroin for at least a year, and said that she usually spends up to \$40-50 per day
11 on Heroin. On or about July 11, 2013, Respondent admitted to possessing and using crystal
12 methamphetamine.

13 c. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (f), in that
14 Respondent committed acts involving dishonesty, fraud, deceit or corruption. The circumstances
15 are as follows: On or about June 3, 2013, a Police Officer with the Modesto Police Department
16 was dispatched to Buckle (a clothing store) regarding a forgery investigation involving
17 Respondent. During the Officer's contact with Respondent, he asked if she had any identification
18 and she told him no. Upon a consent search of Respondent's purse, the officer found a driver's
19 license with Respondent's photograph as T.C. The Officer recognized the photograph in fact to
20 be Respondent, the person he was talking to. The Officer escorted Respondent to his office in the
21 mall and informed her that the manager and employee of Buckle suspected Respondent of using a
22 false drivers' license on separate occasions and the Buckle account she used was also found to be
23 fraudulent. On or about May 29, 2013, Respondent entered Buckle and made a purchase with a
24 gift card and a Buckle account, knowing the last four digits of the social security number on the
25 account. Respondent also provided the Buckle employee a drivers license with Respondent's
26 photograph as L.F., completed the transaction with her signature, and left the store with the
27 merchandise. On or about May 29, 2013, Respondent returned to the store for a second time and
28 purchased a \$200 gift card on the same Buckle account and completed the transaction with her

1 signature. Respondent admitted to knowing a J.L., who is able to provide her with a drivers
2 license with her actual photo, and the last four digits of a social security number which allows her
3 to go into Buckle and charge on an account. Respondent also admitted that she gets to keep the
4 purchased merchandise, however has to give the gift cards along with the fictitious licenses and
5 social security numbers to J.L. Respondent acknowledged that she is aware of another female
6 doing the same thing, however did not have any information about her. When asked why she was
7 committing these fraudulent acts, Respondent admitted that she has been addicted to Heroin for
8 approximately a year and a half.

9 d. On or about June 27, 2013, a criminal complaint was filed in the matter of People v.
10 Krystle Amber Mobley (Superior Court, Stanislaus County), charging violation of Penal Code
11 section 470, subdivision (a) (Forgery), a felony. The criminal complaint is currently pending.

12 e.. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (g), in that
13 on or about June 3, 2013, and May 29, 2013, Respondent knowingly signed for transaction
14 charges on a store charge account using the identification and social security number that was not
15 Respondent's. The facts and circumstances are more fully set forth above in subpart c.

16 f. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (o), in that
17 Respondent violated the laws and regulations governing pharmacy, as set forth more fully above
18 in subparts a through e.

19 *DISCIPLINE CONSIDERATIONS*

20 g. On or about March 17, 2010, the Board issued a Letter of Admonishment, Citation
21 Number CI 2008 39003, to Respondent, for violations of Code section 4301, subdivision (h) (use
22 of alcoholic beverage in a manner dangerous or injurious to self or others), on or about July 29,
23 2008, and Code section 4301, subdivision (l) (conviction of crime), on or about July 14, 2009.

24 **ORDER**

25 IT IS SO ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. 69734, heretofore issued
26 to Respondent Krystle Amber Mobley, is revoked.

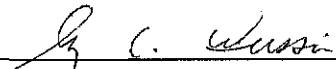
27 Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a
28 written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within

1 seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion may
2 vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute.

3 This Decision shall become effective on May 30, 2014.

4 It is so ORDERED April 30, 2014.

19 Virginia Herold ("Complainant") alleges:

20 **PARTIES**

21 1. Complainant brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as the Executive
22 Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.

23 2. On or about June 28, 2006, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician
24 Registration Number 69734 to Krystle Amber Mobley ("Respondent"). The Pharmacy Technician
25 Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will
26 expire on September 30, 2013, unless renewed.

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1 "(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the
2 violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable
3 federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by the
4 board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency."

5 **COST RECOVERY**

6 8. Code section 125.3 provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the
7 administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of
8 the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and
9 enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being
10 renewed or reinstated.

11 **DRUGS**

12 9. "Flexeril," a brand of cyclobenzaprine HCL, is a dangerous drug within the meaning of
13 Business and Professions Code section 4022 in that it requires a prescription under federal law.

14 10. "Heroin" is a Schedule I controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code
15 section 11054(c)(11).

16 11. "Methamphetamine" is a Schedule II controlled substance as designated by Health and
17 Safety Code section 11055(d)(2).

18 **FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

19 **(Conviction of Crime)**

20 12. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (1), in that on
21 or about October 2, 2012, in the case of *People v. Krystle Amber Mobley* (Superior Court, San
22 Joaquin County Case No. MF035146A), Respondent was convicted on her plea of guilty of
23 violating Business and Professions Code 4060 (Possession of Dangerous Drug without a
24 Prescription- Flexeril), a misdemeanor. The circumstances are as follows:

25 13. On or about August 2, 2012, a Police Officer with the Escalon Police Department
26 observed Respondent driving a vehicle without a front license plate. The Officer followed
27 Respondent into a gas station parking lot and initiated a traffic stop. The Officer discovered that
28 Respondent's license was suspended on April 25, 2012, for failure to appear and not having

1 insurance. In preparation for towing, the Officer conducted an inventory search of Respondent's
2 vehicle and recovered various items, including: (1) a plastic bag retrieved from the driver side door
3 storage compartment which contained 14 white pills imprinted with L374 and 21 yellow pills
4 imprinted with TL177; (2) a clear plastic baggie with marijuana leafs imprinted which contained

6 foil with charred residue; (4) a small blue pill imprinted with 10 DAN 5620; and (5) a glass pipe

15 **SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

16 **(Unlawful Possession of Controlled Substance)**

17 14. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4060, in that Respondent was
18 in possession of a controlled substance without authorization or a valid prescription. The
19 circumstances are as follows:

20 (a) On or about July 11, 2013, Respondent was stopped by a Modesto Police
21 Officer for using her cellular phone while driving. A records check of respondent's license
22 confirmed Respondent's license was suspended since March of 2012. In preparation for towing,
23 the Officer conducted an inventory search of Respondent's vehicle. In conducting the inventory
24 search, the Officer found three square pieces of tin foil with blackened residue on them, two
25 square pieces of tin foil wrapped up that had a black tar-like substance inside of them located in
26 the driver's side door panel, and three plastic straws. Respondent admitted that she uses the
27 straws to smoke her Heroin. The Officer conducted a chemical test on the black tar like substance

5 THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

6 (Acts Involving Dishonesty, Fraud, Deceit, or Corruption)

7 15. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (f), in that
8 Respondent committed acts involving dishonesty, fraud, deceit or corruption. The circumstances
9 are as follows:

10 (a) On or about June 3, 2013, a Police Officer with the Modesto Police Department
11 was dispatched to Buckle (a clothing store) regarding a forgery investigation involving
12 Respondent. During the Officer's contact with Respondent, he asked if she had any identification
13 and she told him no. Upon a consent search of Respondent's purse, the officer found a driver's
14 license with Respondent's photograph as T.C. The Officer recognized the photograph in fact to be
15 Respondent, the person he was talking to. The Officer escorted Respondent to his office in the
16 mall and informed her that the manager and employee of Buckle suspected Respondent of using a
17 false drivers' license on separate occasions and the Buckle account she used was also found to be
18 fraudulent.

19 (b) On or about May 29, 2013, Respondent entered Buckle and made a purchase

26 (c) Respondent admitted to knowing a J.L., who is able to provide her with a
27 drivers license with her actual photo, and the last four digits of a social security number which
28 allows her to go into Buckle and charge on an account. Respondent also admitted that she gets to

1 keep the purchased merchandise, however has to give the gift cards along with the fictitious
2 licenses and social security numbers to J.L. Respondent acknowledged that she is aware of
3 another female doing the same thing, however did not have any information about her. When
4 asked why she was committing these fraudulent acts, Respondent admitted that she has been
5 addicted to Heroin for approximately a year and a half.

6 16. On or about June 27, 2013, a criminal complaint was filed in the matter of *People v.*
7 *Krystle Amber Mobley* (Superior Court, Stanislaus County), charging violation of Penal Code
8 section 470, subdivision (a) (Forgery), a felony. The criminal complaint is currently pending.

9 **FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

10 **(Knowingly Signing a Document that Falsely Represents the Existence or Nonexistence of a**
11 **State of Facts)**

12 17. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (g), in that
13 on or about June 3, 2013, and May 29, 2013, Respondent knowingly signed for transaction
14 charges on a store charge account using the identification and social security number that was not
15 Respondent's. The facts and circumstances are more fully set forth above in paragraph 15 and its
16 subparts, and paragraph 16.

17 **FIFTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

18 **(Violating Laws Governing Pharmacy)**

19 18. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (o), in that
20 Respondent violated the laws and regulations governing pharmacy, as set forth more fully above in
21 paragraphs 11 through 17.

22 **DISCIPLINE CONSIDERATIONS**

23 19. On or about March 17, 2010, the Board issued a Letter of Admonishment, Citation
24 Number CI 2008 39003, to Respondent, for violations of Code section 4301, subdivision (h) (use
25 of alcoholic beverage in a manner dangerous or injurious to self or others), on or about July 29,
26 2008, and Code section 4301, subdivision (i) (conviction of crime), on or about July 14, 2009.

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1 PRAYER


2 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,

5 Krystle Amber Mobley;

6 2. Ordering Krystle Amber Mobley to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of
7 the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section
8 125.3;

9 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
