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19	IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-		
20	entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:		
21	PARTIES		
22	1. Virginia Herold ("Complainant") is the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy		
23	("Board"), Department of Consumer Affairs. She brought this action solely in her official		
24	capacity and is represented in this matter by Kamala D. Harris, Attorney General of the State of		
25	California, by Stephanie Alamo-Latif, Deputy Attorney General.		
26	2. Lauren Danielle Frediani ("Respondent") is representing herself in this proceeding		
27	and has chosen not to exercise her right to be represented by counsel.		
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3. On or about February 8, 2010, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician Registration No. 98833 to Lauren Danielle Frediani. The Pharmacy Technician Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 4821. The Pharmacy Technician Registration expired on August 31, 2013, and has not been renewed.

#### **JURISDICTION**

4. Accusation No. 4821 was filed before the Board and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on September 20, 2013. Respondent timely filed her Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 4821 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

#### ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

12 5. Respondent has carefully read, and understands the charges and allegations in
13 Accusation No. 4821. Respondent also has carefully read, and understands the effects of this
14 Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.

6. Respondent is fully aware of her legal rights in this matter, including the right to a
hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at
her own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against her; the right to
present evidence and to testify on her own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to
compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration
and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California
Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

## **CULPABILITY**

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8. Respondent admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation
 No. 4821, and agrees that cause exists for discipline and hereby surrenders her Pharmacy
 Technician Registration No. 98833 for the Board's formal acceptance.

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Stipulated Surrender of License (Case No. 4821)

9. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation she enables the Board to issue
 an order accepting the surrender of her Pharmacy Technician Registration without further
 process.

## **CONTINGENCY**

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10. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board of Pharmacy. Respondent 5 understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board of Pharmacy may 6 communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or 7 participation by Respondent. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that 8 she may not withdraw her agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board 9 considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, 10 the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this 11 paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not 12 13 be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.

14 11. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF), facsimile,
15 and/or electronic copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including PDF,
16 facsimile, and/or electronic signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the
17 originals.

18 12. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an
integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement.
It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions,
negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order
may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing
executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

13. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that
the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

### <u>ORDER</u>

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. 98833, issued to Respondent Lauren Danielle Frediani, is surrendered and accepted by the Board of Pharmacy.

Respondent surrenders Pharmacy Technician Registration No. 98833 as of the 1. effective date of this decision. Respondent shall relinquish her Pharmacy Technician Registration to the Board within ten (10) days of the effective date of this decision.

1. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a Pharmacy Technician in 4 California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order. 5

2. The surrender of Respondent's Pharmacy Technician Registration and the acceptance 6 of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against 7 Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of 8 Respondent's license history with the Board of Pharmacy. 9

3. Respondent understands and agrees that if she ever files an application for licensure 10 or a petition for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a new 11 application for licensure. Respondent may not apply for any license, permit, or registration from 12 the Board for three (3) years from the effective date of the Board of Pharmacy's Decision and 13 Order. Respondent stipulates that should she ever apply or reapply for a any license or 14 certification, or petition for reinstatement of a license, from the Board on or after the effective 15 date of this decision, all allegations set forth in Accusation No. 4821 shall be deemed to be true, 16 correct, and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the 17 application. Respondent shall satisfy all requirements applicable to that license as of the date the 18 application is submitted to the Board, including, but not limited to certification by a nationally 19 recognized body prior to the issuance of a new license. Respondent is required to report this 20 surrender as disciplinary action. 21

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Respondent further stipulates that should she every apply for any license from the 4. Board on or after the effective date of this decision, investigation and prosecution costs in the amount of \$2,865 shall be paid to the Board prior to issuance the license. 24

21	1. Complainant brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as the Executive		
22	Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.		
23	2. On or about February 8, 2010, the B	oard of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician	
24	Registration Number TCH 98833 to Lauren Dan	ielle Frediani ("Respondent"). The Pharmacy	
25	Technician Registration was in full force and effe	ct at all times relevant to the charges brought	
26	herein and will expire on August 31, 2013, unless	s renewed.	
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ì1	JURISDICTION		
2	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of		
3	Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the		
4	Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.		
5	4. Code Section 4300 provides, in pertinent part:		
6	(a) Every license issued may be suspended or revoked.		
7	5. Code Section 4300.1 provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration, cancellation,		
8	forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of		
9	the board or a court of law, shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed		
10	with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a		
11	decision suspending or revoking the license.		
12	STATUTORY PROVISIONS		
13	6. Code Section 4060 states:		
14 15	"No person shall possess any controlled substance, except that furnished to a person upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7, or furnished pursuant to a drug order issued		
16 17	by a certified nurse-midwife pursuant to Section 2746.51, a nurse practitioner pursuant to Section 2836.1, a physician assistant pursuant to Section 3502.1, a naturopathic doctor		
18	pursuant to Section 3640.5, or a pharmacist pursuant to either Section 4052.1 or 4052.2. This section shall not apply to the possession of any controlled substance by a manufacturer, wholesaler, pharmacy, pharmacist, physician, podiatrist, dentist, optometrist, veterinarian,		
19	naturopathic doctor, certified nurse-midwife, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant, when in stock in containers correctly labeled with the name and address of the supplier or		
20	producer.		
21	Nothing in this section authorizes a certified nurse-midwife, a nurse practitioner, a physician assistant, or a naturopathic doctor, to order his or her own stock of dangerous		
22	drugs and devices."		
23	7. Code Section 4306 states, in pertinent part, that it shall constitute unprofessional		
24	conduct and a violation of this chapter ("Pharmacy Law") for any person licensed under this		
25	chapter to violate, attempt to violate, directly or indirectly, any provision or terms of this article or		
26	any regulations duly adopted under those laws.		
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`1	8. Code Section 4301 states, in pertinent part:
2	The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional
3	conduct. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:
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5	(f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or
6	corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and
7	whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.
8	
9	(j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, or any other state, or of the United
10	States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.
11	
12	(l) The conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties
13	of a licensee under this chapter.
14	
15	(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the
16	violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable
17	federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by the
18	board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency.
19	9. Health and Safety Code Section 11173, subdivision (a) provides that "no person shall
20	obtain or attempt to obtain controlled substances, or procure or attempt to procure the
21	administration of or prescription for controlled substances, (1) by fraud, deceit, misrepresentation,
22	or subterfuge; or (2) by the concealment of a material fact."
23	10. Health and Safety Code Section 11350, subdivision (a) provides, that "except as
24	otherwise provided in this division, every person who possesses (1) any controlled substance as
25	specified in subdivision (b) or (c), or paragraph (14), (15), or (20) of subdivision (d) of Section
26	11054, or specified in subdivision (b) or (c) of Section 11055, or specified in subdivision (h) of
27	Section 11056, or (2) any controlled substances classified in Schedule III, IV, or V which is a
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narcotic drug, unless upon the written prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, or
 veterinarian licensed to practice in this state, shall be punished by imprisonment pursuant to
 subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code."

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11. Health and Safety Code Section 11368 states that "every person who forges or alters a prescription or who issues or utters an altered prescription, or who issues or utters a prescription bearing a forged or fictitious signature for any narcotic drug, or who obtains any narcotic drug by any forged, fictitious, or altered prescription, or who has in possession any narcotic drug secured by a forged, fictitious, or altered prescription, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for not less than six months nor more than one year, or in the state prison."

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## COST RECOVERY

11 12. Code Section 125.3 provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the 12 administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of 13 the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and 14 enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being 15 renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be 16 included in a stipulated settlement.

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#### <u>DRUGS</u>

18 13. Norco, a brand of hydrocodone bitartrate and acetaminophen, is a Schedule III
19 controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11056, subdivision (e)(4).
20 14. Morphine is a Schedule II Controlled Substance as defined in Health and Safety Code
21 section 11055, subdivision (b)(1)(L).

15. Vicodin, a compound consisting of 5 mg hydrocodone bitartrate, also known as
dihydrocodeinone, and 500 mg acetaminophen per tablet, and is a Schedule III controlled
substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11056, subdivision (e)(4).

16. Hydrocodone with Acetominphen, or "Hydrocodone Bitartrate APAP" is a Schedule
III controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11056(e)(4).
Hydrocodone Bitartrate, the generic name, is also known as dihydrocodeinone.

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#### FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE `1 (Conviction of Crime) 2 Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (1), on the 17. 3 grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that, she was convicted of the following crime that is 4 substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensed pharmacy technician. On 5 or about October 9, 2012, in the case of People v. Lauren Danielle Frediani (Super, Ct. Placer 6 7 County, Case No. 62-11610), Respondent was convicted by the Court on her plea of guilty of violating Health and Safety Code section 11368 (Uttering a Forged Prescription), a felony. The 8 circumstances of the crime were as follows: 9 (A) On or about June 5, 2012, Respondent called the Target Pharmacy in Auburn, 10 California, and fraudulently authorized a verbal prescription for a controlled substance (Norco) for 11 herself by misrepresenting herself as an employee of a doctor's office. Respondent arrived at the 12 Target Pharmacy on or about June 5, 2012, attempting to obtain prescription drugs (Norco), and 13 was arrested for violating Health and Safety Code section 11173, subdivision (a) (Attempting to 14 Obtain Prescription Drugs by Fraud). 15 (B) On or about June 5, 2012, a search incident to arrest of Respondent's purse 16 revealed that Respondent was in possession of one pill of Morphine, one pill of Hydrocodone with 17 Acetominphen, and one-half of a pill of Vicodin. Respondent admitted that she did not have a 18 prescription for the controlled substances found in her purse and that she had stolen the Morphine 19 from her boyfriend. 20 SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 21 (Dishonest/Corrupt Acts) 22 Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (f), on the 23 18. grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that, on or about June 5, 2012, Respondent committed 24 dishonest and corrupt acts, as more fully set forth above in paragraph 17. 25 /// 26 /// 27 /// 28 5

2	(Unlawful Possession of Controlled Substances)		
3	19. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4060 in that Respondent had		
4	possession of controlled substances without authorization or a valid prescription therefor, as more		
5	fully set forth in paragraphs 17 and 18 above.		
6	FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE		
7	(Violation of Statutes Regulating Controlled Substances and Dangerous Drugs)		
8	20. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (j), on the		
9	grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that, on or about June 5, 2012, Respondent violated statutes		
10	regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs, including Business and Professions Code		
11	section 4060, and Health and Safety Code sections 11173, 11350, and 11368, as more fully set		
12	forth in paragraphs 17 through 19.		
13	FIFTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE		
14	(Violating Laws and Regulations Governing Pharmacy)		
15	21. Respondent is subject to discipline under Code sections 4306 and 4301, subdivision		
16	(o), on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that, on or about June 5, 2012, Respondent		
17	violated the laws and regulations governing pharmacy, as set forth in paragraphs 17 through 20		
18	above.		
19	<u>PRAYER</u>		
20	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,		
21	and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:		
22	1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 98833,		
23	issued to Lauren Danielle Frediani;		
24	2. Ordering Lauren Danielle Frediani to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs		
25	of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code		
26	section 125.3;		
27	3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
