27	3. On or about January 26, 1993, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician			
28	Registration No. TCH 3639 to Richard M. Antor	niano (Respondent). The Pharmacy Technician		

 Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 5052 and will expire on March 31, 2016, unless renewed.

#### **JURISDICTION**

- 4. Accusation No. 5052 was filed before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on November 24, 2014.

  Respondent timely filed his Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation.
- 5. A First Amended Accusation No. 5052 was filed on March 24, 2015. It was deemed controverted by the original Notice of Defense. It is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

## ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- 6. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the charges and allegations in First Amended Accusation No. 5052. Respondent also has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.
- 7. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the First Amended Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at his own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- 8. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

#### **CULPABILITY**

9. Respondent admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in First
Amended Accusation No. 5052, agrees that cause exists for discipline and hereby surrenders his
Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 3639 for the Board's formal acceptance.

10. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of his Pharmacy Technician Registration without further process.

#### **CONTINGENCY**

- 11. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board of Pharmacy. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board of Pharmacy may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondent or his counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.
- 12. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 13. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement. It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions, negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.
- 14. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

#### ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 3639, issued to Respondent Richard M. Antoniano, is surrendered and accepted by the Board of Pharmacy.

1. The surrender of Respondent's Pharmacy Technician Registration and the acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against

Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of Respondent's license history with the Board of Pharmacy.

- 2. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a pharmacy technician in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
- 3. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.
- 4. If he ever applies for licensure or petitions for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a new application for licensure. Respondent may not apply for any license, permit, or registration from the Board for three (3) years from the effective date of this decision. Respondent stipulates that should he or she apply for any license from the Board on or after the effective date of this decision, all allegations set forth in the First Amended Accusation shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the application.

Respondent shall satisfy all requirements applicable to that license as of the date the application is submitted to the board, including, but not limited to certification by a nationally recognized body prior to the issuance of a new license. Respondent is required to report this surrender as disciplinary action.


5. Respondent shall pay the agency its costs of investigation and enforcement in the amount of \$2,077.50 prior to issuance of a new or reinstated license.

FIRST AMENDED ACCUSATION

Complainant alleges:

#### PARTIES

- Complainant Virginia Herold brings this First Amended Accusation solely in her
  official capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer
  Affairs.
- 2. On January 26, 1993, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 3639 to Respondent Richard M. Antoniano. This Registration has been active at all times relevant to this pleading and expires on March 31, 2016, unless renewed.

#### **JURISDICTION**

- 3. This First Amended Accusation is brought before the Board under the following laws.

  All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.
- 4. Section 4300 provides, in pertinent part, that every license issued by the Board is subject to discipline, including suspension or revocation.

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First Amended Accusation

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4. Section 490 provides that a board, including this one, may suspend or revoke a license or registration on the ground that the registrant has been convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the profession for which the registration was issued.

- 5. Section 4060 prohibits people from possessing any controlled substance without a prescription from a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or other authorized prescriber.
- 6. Section 4301 authorizes the Board to discipline any licensee who is guilty of unprofessional conduct and lists categories of unprofessional conduct:

"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

(j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, or any other state, or of the United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.

(l) The conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a licensee under this chapter. The record of conviction of a violation of Chapter 13 (commencing with Section 801) of Title 21 of the United States Code regulating controlled substances or of a violation of the statutes of this state regulating controlled substances or dangerous drugs shall be conclusive evidence of unprofessional conduct. In all other cases, the record of conviction shall be conclusive evidence only of the fact that the conviction occurred. The board may inquire into the circumstances surrounding the commission of the crime, in order to fix the degree of discipline or, in the case of a conviction not involving controlled substances or dangerous drugs, to determine if the conviction is of an offense substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a licensee under this chapter. A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of this provision. The board may take action when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal or when an order granting probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code allowing the person to withdraw his or her plea of guilty and to enter a plea of not guilty, or setting aside the verdict of guilty, or dismissing the First Amended Accusation, information, or indictment.'

#### BOARD REGULATIONS

7. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770 specifies when a criminal conviction is substantially related to a registrant's qualifications, functions or duties:

"For the purpose of denial, suspension, or revocation of a personal or facility license pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and Professions Code, a crime or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or registrant if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of a licensee or registrant to perform the functions authorized by his license or registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare."

## COST RECOVERY

8. Section 125.3 authorizes the Board to an administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have violated the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the case's reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement.

## CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

- 9. Cocaine is a Schedule II controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11055 subdivision (b)(6) and is categorized as a dangerous drug pursuant to section 4022.
- 10. Vicodin is the brand name for a combination of hydrocodone and acetaminophen. Hydrocodone is a Schedule II narcotic and an opiate as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11055, and Vicodin is a Schedule III controlled substance under Health and Safety Code section 11056, subdivision (e)(7) because it contains "[n]ot more than 500 milligrams of opium per 100 milliliters or per 100 grams or not more than 25 milligrams per dosage unit, with one or more active, nonnarcotic ingredients in recognized therapeutic amounts." As a prescription medication it is also categorized as a dangerous drug pursuant to section 4022.

#### FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Conviction of a Substantially Related Crime: Possession of a Controlled Substance for Sale)

- 11. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under sections 4301, subdivision (I) and 490, in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, because he was convicted of felony possession of a controlled substance, a crime substantially related to a pharmacy technician's qualifications, functions or duties.
- 12. On January 10, 2014, Respondent pled noto contendere to and was convicted of one felony count of violating Health and Safety Code section 11351 [possession of a controlled substance for sale] in the criminal proceeding entitled *People v. Richard Antoniano* (Super. Ct.

L.A. County, 2014, No. VA125383). The Court sentenced Respondent to serve 1 day in Los Angeles County Jail and placed him on 3 years' probation.

- Angeles County Sheriff's deputies responded to a call of a man with a gun at a business on Paramount Boulevard in Lakewood, California. They found two men who matched the suspect's description, one of whom was Respondent. They searched Respondent for weapons, but did not find a gun. They asked Respondent if his vehicle was there. He said yes, and consented to let them search his nearby Honda Accord. In his car, they found in plain view two orange unlabeled pill bottles containing 173 500 mg Vicodin pills, a bag containing six 750 mg Vicodin pills, a pack of small clear baggies, and a plastic bag containing an off white powdery substance that resembled and was later determined to be powder cocaine.
- 14. At the time he was arrested, Respondent did not have a prescription for Vicodin or for cocaine.

## SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

## (Possessing Controlled Substance Without a Prescription)

- 15. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301 subdivision (j) because he violated California statutes regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs, including (a) violating Business and Professions Code section 4040 by possessing Vicodin and cocaine without a prescription; and (b) violating Health and Safety Code section 11351 by his conviction for possession and sale of a controlled substance.
  - 16. Paragraphs 12 to 14 are realleged and incorporated into this cause for discipline.

#### THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

#### (Conviction of a Substantially Related Crime: Driving Under the Influence)

17. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under sections 4301, subdivision (l) and 490, in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, because he was convicted of misdemeanor driving under the influence, a crime substantially related to a pharmacy technician's qualifications, functions or duties.
