18	IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-
19	entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:
20	<u>PARTIES</u>
21	1. Virginia Herold ("Complainant") is the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy,
22	Department of Consumer Affairs. She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is
23	represented in this matter by Kamala D. Harris, Attorney General of the State of California, by
24	Leslie A. Burgermyer, Deputy Attorney General.
25	2. Jill Marie Onstad ("Respondent") is representing herself in this proceeding and has
26	chosen not to exercise her right to be represented by counsel.
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3. On or about September 15, 2010, the Board issued Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 106058 to Respondent. The Pharmacy Technician Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 5114, expired on February 28, 2014, and canceled on July 14, 2014.

JURISDICTION

4. Accusation No. 5114 was filed before the Board and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on July 17, 2014. Respondent timely filed her Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 5114 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- Respondent has carefully read, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 5114. Respondent also has carefully read, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.
- 6. Respondent is fully aware of her legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at her own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against her; the right to present evidence and to testify on her own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- 7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

CULPABILITY

8. Respondent admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation No. 5114, agrees that cause exists for discipline and hereby surrenders her Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 106058 for the Board's formal acceptance.

9. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation she enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of her Pharmacy Technician Registration without further process.

RESERVATION

10. The admissions made by Respondent herein are only for the purposes of this proceeding, or any other proceedings in which the Board of Pharmacy or other professional licensing agency is involved, and shall not be admissible in any other criminal or civil proceeding.

CONTINGENCY

- 11. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board of Pharmacy. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board of Pharmacy may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondent. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that she may not withdraw her agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.
- 12. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including PDF and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 13. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement. It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions, negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

14. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 106058, issued to Respondent Jill Marie Onstad ("Respondent") is surrendered and accepted by the Board of Pharmacy.

- 1. Respondent surrenders Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 16058 as of the effective date of this decision. Respondent shall relinquish her Pharmacy Technician Registration to the Board within ten (10) days of the effective date of this decision.
- 2. The surrender of Respondent's Pharmacy Technician Registration and the acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against Respondent. This decision constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of Respondent's license history with the Board of Pharmacy.
- 3. Respondent understands that if she ever files an application for licensure or petition for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat is as a new application for licensure. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a Pharmacy Technician in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
- 4. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board her pocket license and, if one was issued, her wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.
- 5. Respondent may not apply for any license, permit, or registration from the Board for three (3) years from the effective date of this decision. Respondent stipulates that should she apply for any license from the Board on or after the effective ate of this decision, all allegations set forth in the Accusation shall be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the application. Respondent shall satisfy all requirements applicable to that license as of the date the application is submitted to the Board including, but not limited to, certification by a nationally recognized body prior to the issuance of a new license. Respondent is required to report this surrender as a disciplinary action.

1	6. Respondent stipulates that should she apply for any license from the Board on or after
2	the effective date of this decision, investigation and prosecution costs in the amount of \$3,752.00
3	shall be paid to the Board prior to issuance of the license.
4	<u>ACCEPTANCE</u>
5	I have carefully read the Stipulated Surrender of License and Order. I understand the
6	stipulation and the effect it will have on my Pharmacy Technician Registration. I enter into this
7	Stipulated Surrender of License and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to

- 11. Between on or about November 14, 2012, and January 16, 2013, CVS Pharmacy #09539 conducted an investigation of its supply of hydrocodone 7.5-500, 10-500, and 10-325. After determining a loss, CVS notified the Board and the Board's subsequent audit of CVS's inventory indicated CVS had a loss of approximately 2073 tablets of hydrocodone-containing drugs.
- On or about January 16, 2013, Respondent was interviewed by staff of CVS Pharmacy #09539 staff during its investigation. Respondent admitted she had stolen approximately 30 tablets of Lortab 7.5/500 between the Fall of 2012 and the week before Thanksgiving 2012 while working her shifts at CVS. She also admitted to ingesting the stolen Lortab tablets during her shifts at CVS. Respondent was terminated from her employment on January 18, 2013.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Acts Involving Moral Turpitude, Dishonesty, Fraud, Deceit, or Corruption)

13. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to Code section 4301, subdivision (f), for unprofessional conduct, in that while employed and on duty as a registered pharmacy technician at CVS Pharmacy #09539, Respondent committed acts involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption, as set forth in paragraph 12, above, incorporated herein by reference.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Self-Administration of Controlled Substances)

14. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to Code section 4301, subdivision (h), for unprofessional conduct, in that in and between the Fall of 2012 and the week before Thanksgiving 2012, Respondent self-administered approximately 30 tablets of Lortab 7.5/500, wile working her shifts at CVS Pharmacy #09539, which she admittedly stole from CVS.

THIRD CAUSE FOR DENIAL

(Violations of State Laws Regulating Controlled Substances)

15. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to Code section 4301, subdivision (j), for unprofessional conduct, in that in and between the Fall of 2012 and the week

before Thanksgiving 2012, Respondent possessed approximately 30 tablets of Lortab 7.5/500, as set forth in paragraph 12, above, incorporated herein by reference, without a valid prescription 2 from a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor, in violation 3 of Code section 4060 and Health and Safety Code section 11350, subdivision (a). 4 FOURTH CAUSE FOR DENIAL 5 (Violations of the Pharmacy Law) 6 Respondent is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to Code section 4301, 16. 7 subdivision (o), for unprofessional conduct, in that in and between the Fall of 2012 and the week 8 9 before Thanksgiving 2012, Respondent violated or attempted to violate, directly or indirectly, a provision or term of the Pharmacy Law (Bus. & Prof. Code § 4300, et seq.), specifically, Code :10 section 4060, as set forth in paragraph 15, above, incorporated herein by reference. 11 PRAYER 12 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, 13 and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision: 14 Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 106058, 15 issued to Jill Marie Onstad; 16 2.
