24	2. On or about October 3, 2011, the Board of Pharmacy (Board) issued Pharmacy									
25	Technician Registration No. TCH 117407 to Respondent. The Pharmacy Technician Registration									
26	was in full force and effect at all times relevant t	o the charges brought in Accusation No. 5123								
27	and will expire on June 30, 2015, unless renewed	d.

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- 3. On or about August 25, 2014, Respondent was served by Certified and First Class Mail copies of the Accusation No. 5123, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for Discovery, and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7) at Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4100, is required to be reported and maintained with the Board. Respondent's address of record was and is: 35825 Rice Canyon Road, Fallbrook, CA 92028.
- 4. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c) and/or Business & Professions Code section 124.
- 5. On or about September 3, 2014, a signed certified mail return receipt was received from respondent through the United States Mail regarding the service of the aforementioned documents.
  - 6. Government Code section 11506 states, in pertinent part:
  - (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.
- 7. Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon him of the Accusation, and therefore waived his right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 5123.
  - 8. California Government Code section 11520 states, in pertinent part:
  - (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent.
- 9. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the relevant evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this matter, as well as taking official notice of all the investigatory reports, exhibits and statements contained therein on file at the Board's offices regarding the allegations contained in Accusation No. 5123, finds that

the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 5123, are separately and severally, found to be true and correct by clear and convincing evidence.

10. Taking official notice of its own internal records, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3, it is hereby determined that the reasonable costs for Investigation and Enforcement is \$4,378.30 as of September 29, 2014.

## DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

- 1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Robert T. Sommers has subjected his Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 117407 to discipline.
  - 2. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.
- 3. The Board of Pharmacy is authorized to revoke Respondent's Pharmacy Technician Registration based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation which are supported by the evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this case.:
- a. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Business and Professions Code (Code) section 4301(o) for possession of a controlled substance without a prescription in violation of Code section 4060 when Respondent stole approximately 18,515 tablets and cough syrup that are controlled substances from CVS Pharmacy while working there as a pharmacy technician.
- b. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301(h) for the self-administration of controlled substances. Respondent admitted that he self-medicated with the controlled substances that he stole from CVS Pharmacy while he worked there as a pharmacy technician.
- c. Respondent is subject to discipline for unprofessional conduct under Code section 4301(j) for obtaining controlled substances by fraud, deceit, or subterfuge in violation of Health and Safety Code section 11173, when he stole approximately 18,515 controlled substance tablets and cough syrup from CVS Pharmacy from approximately November 19, 2011 through October 31, 2013.

# ORDER.

IT IS SO ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 117407, heretofore issued to Respondent Robert T. Sommers, is revoked.

Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion may vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute. This decision shall become effective on December 22, 2014. #### JURISDICTION

- This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.
  - 4. Section 4300 of the Code states:

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- (a) Every license issued may be suspended or revoked.
- 5. Section 4300.1 of the Code states:

The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license.

## STATUTORY PROVISIONS

6. Section 4301 of the Code states:

The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

- (f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption, whether the acts is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.
- (h) The administering to oneself, of any controlled substance, or the use of any dangerous drug or of alcoholic beverages to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to oneself, to a person holding a license under this chapter, or to any other person or to the public, or to the extent that the use impairs the ability of the person to conduct with safety to the public the practice authorized by the license.
- (j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, or any other state, or of the United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.
- (o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, . . . any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable federal and state laws and

the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

### DRUGS

- 12. Alprazolam, generic for Xanax, is a Schedule IV controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11057(d)(1), and is a dangerous drug as designated by Code section 4022. It is used to treat anxiety.
- 13. Buprenorphine/naloxone, generic for Suboxone, is a Schedule III controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11056, and is a dangerous drug as designated by Code section 4022. It is used to treat opiate addiction.
- 14. Carisoprodol, generic for Soma, is a Schedule IV controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11057(d), and is a dangerous drug as designated by Code section 4022. It is used to treat muscle spasms
- 15. Hydrocodone/acetaminophen (apap), generic for Norco, Vicodin and Lortab, is a Schedule III controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11056(e), and is a dangerous drug as designated by Code section 4022. It is used to treat pain.
- 16. Methadone, generic for Dolophine, is a Schedule II controlled substance pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 11055, subdivision (c), and a dangerous drug pursuant to Code section 4022. It is used to treat pain and opiate addiction.
- 17. Promethazine with codeine, generic for Phenergan with codeine, is a Schedule V controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11058(c)(1), and is a dangerous drug as designated by Code section 4022. It is used to treat severe cough.
- 18. Temazepam, generic for Restoril, is a Schedule IV controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11057(d)(29), and is a dangerous drug as designated by Code section 4022. It is used to treat insomnia and anxiety.
- 19. Zolpidem, generic for Ambien, is a Schedule IV controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11057(d)(32), and is a dangerous drug as designated by Code section 4022. It is used to treat insomnia.

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- 20. From approximately November 19, 2011 through October 31, 2013, Respondent was employed as a pharmacy technician at the CVS Pharmacy located on Rancho California Road in Temecula, California.
- 21. On October 24, 2013, the CVS Pharmacy discovered the loss of 1,881 tablets of hydrocodone/apap 5/325mg and 1,499 tablets of zolpidem 10mg. The pharmacist-in-charge (PIC) conducted daily counts of both drugs and within 2 days, the PIC reported one container of hydrocodone/apap 5/325 was unaccounted for. Video surveillance review revealed that Respondent may have been responsible for the loss.
- 22. On October 29, 2013, Respondent was pulled over by the Border Patrol on his way to work at the CVS Pharmacy. Officers found 2.6 grams of methadone, along with a pill cutter/grinder with narcotic residue on it and four rolled bills of US Currency with trace amounts of narcotic residue in Respondent's car. Respondent was arrested for illegal possession of a controlled substance intended for sale. Respondent called in to the CVS Pharmacy and advised the PIC that he would not be able to work that day. He told the PIC that he had an issue with his license and had been arrested.
- 23. On October 31, 2013, the Regional Loss Prevention Manager for the CVS Pharmacy interviewed Respondent at the start of his shift. Respondent admitted to stealing controlled substances from CVS Pharmacy over the course of two years. Respondent admitted that he self-medicated with half of the stolen controlled substances and that he sold the other half for \$2 per tablet. Respondent admitted he stole the following from his employer, CVS Pharmacy:

Hydrocodone/apap 10/325mg tab 2,000 tablets Hydrocodone/apap 5/325mg tab 2,500 tablets Hydrocodone/apap 7.5/325mg tab 2,500 tablets Hydrocodone/apap 10/500mg tab 50 tablets Zolpidem 10mg tab 4,000 tablets Carisoprodol 350 mg tab 4,000 tablets Alprazolam 1mg tab 1,500 tablets Alprazolam 2mg tab 1,500 tablets Suboxone 8/2mg tab 450 tablets Temazepam 30mg cap 15 capsules Promethazine with codeine syrup 473ml 3,311 ml

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### FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct: Possession of a Controlled Substance without a Prescription)

- 24. Respondent is subject to discipline for unprofessional conduct under Code section 4301(o) for possession of a controlled substance without a prescription in violation of Code section 4060. The circumstances are set forth in detail in paragraphs 20 through 23 above and as follows:
- a. From approximately November 19, 2011 through October 31, 2013,
  Respondent stole approximately 18,515 tablets and cough syrup that are controlled substances
  from CVS Pharmacy while working there as a pharmacy technician.
- b. On October 29, 2013, Respondent possessed 2.6 grams of methadone when he was pulled over by the Border Patrol.

## SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct: Self-administration of a Controlled Substance)

25. Respondent is subject to discipline for unprofessional conduct under Code section 4301(h) for the self-administration of controlled substances. Respondent admitted that he self-medicated with half of the controlled substances that he stole from CVS Pharmacy from approximately November 19, 2011 through October 31, 2013. The circumstances are set forth in detail in paragraphs 20 through 23, above, and are incorporated herein by reference.

## THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct: Obtaining a Controlled Substance by Fraud, Deceit or Subterfuge)

26. Respondent is subject to discipline for unprofessional conduct under Code section 4301(j) for obtaining controlled substances by fraud, deceit, or subterfuge in violation of Health and Safety Code section 11173, when he stole approximately 18,515 controlled substance tablets and cough syrup from CVS Pharmacy from approximately November 19, 2011 through October 31, 2013. The circumstances are set forth in detail in paragraphs 20 through 23, above, and are incorporated herein by reference.

## FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct: Acts Involving Dishonesty)

27. Respondent's license is subject to discipline for unprofessional conduct under Code section 4301(f) for acts involving dishonesty when he stole approximately 18,515 controlled substance tablets and cough syrup from CVS Pharmacy. The circumstances are set forth in detail in paragraphs 20 through 23, above, and are incorporated herein by reference.

### PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 117407 issued to Robert T. Sommers;
- 2. Ordering Robert T. Sommers to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 12.3; and
