18	1. On or about July 26, 2014, Complai	nant Virginia Herold, in her official capacity as
19	the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs, filed	
20	Accusation No. 5205 against Brent Douglas Glassick (Respondent) before the Board of	
21	Pharmacy. (A copy of the Accusation is attached	ed as Exhibit A.)
22	2. On or about December 27, 2010, the	e Board of Pharmacy (Board) issued Pharmacy
23	Technician Registration No. TCH 109546 to Re	spondent. The Pharmacy Technician Registration
24	was in full force and effect at all times relevant	to the charges brought in Accusation No. 5205
25	and will expire on May 31, 2016, unless renewe	d.
26	3. On or about August 6, 2014, Respon	ndent was served by Certified and First Class Mail
27	copies of the Accusation No. 5205, Statement to	Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for
28	Discovery, and Discovery Statutes (Governmen	t Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7) at
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1	Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4100	
2	and California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1704, is required to be reported and	
3	maintained with the Board. Respondent's address of record was and is:

5	4. On or about August 6, 2014, Respondent was also served with the aforementioned

9	5. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of	
10	Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c) and/or Business & Professions Code section	
11	124.	
12	6. On August 8, 2014, the Domestic Return Receipt for the aforementioned documents	
13	served to Respondent's address of record was signed by "Harley Glassick." On August 19, 2014,	
14	the U.S. Postal Service returned a signed Domestic Return Receipt for the aforementioned	
15	documents served to Respondent's alternate address.	
16	7. Government Code section 11506 states, in pertinent part:	
17 18	(c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense shall	
19	constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.	
20	8. Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon him	
21	of the Accusation, and therefore waived his right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No.	
22	5205.	
23	9. California Government Code section 11520 states, in pertinent part:	
24	(a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense or to appear at the barring, the agency may take estion based upon the marginal dentis are administed.	
25	hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent.

27	10. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds	
28	Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the

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1	relevant evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this matter, as well as	
2	taking official notice of all the investigatory reports, exhibits and statements contained therein on	
3	file at the Board's offices regarding the allegations contained in Accusation No. 5205, finds that	
4	the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 5205, are separately and severally, found to be true	
5	and correct by clear and convincing evidence.	
6	11. Taking official notice of its own internal records, pursuant to Business and	
7	Professions Code section 125.3, it is hereby determined that the reasonable costs for Investigation	
8	and Enforcement is \$432.50 as of August 29, 2014.	
9	DETERMINATION OF ISSUES	
10	1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Brent Douglas Glassick has	
11	subjected his Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 109546 to discipline.	
12	2. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.	
13	3. The Board of Pharmacy is authorized to revoke Respondent's Pharmacy Technician	
14	Registration based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation which are supported	
15	by the Default Decision Investigatory Evidence Packet in this case.	
16	4. Respondent has subjected his registration to discipline under section 4301(j) of the	
17	Code in that he violated statutes regulating controlled substances on October 16, 2013, when he	
18	was arrested for possession of a controlled substance and controlled substance paraphernalia.	
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	DEFAULT DECISION AND ORDER	

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1	ORDER	
2	IT IS SO ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 109546, heretofore	
3	issued to Respondent Brent Douglas Glassick, is revoked.	
4	Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a	
5	written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within	
6	seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion may	
7	vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute.	
8	This Decision shall become effective on October 24, 2014.	
9	It is so ORDERED September 24, 2014.

.2	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of
3	Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the
4	Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.
5	4. Section 4300, subdivision (a) of the Code states: "Every license issued may be
6	suspended or revoked."
7	5. Section 4300.1 of the Code states:
8	The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by
9	operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of finite distinct the second status of the second status
10	deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license.

12	STATUTORY PROVISIONS

20	7. Health and Safety Code section 11377, subdivision (a) states:
21	Except as authorized by law and as otherwise provided in subdivision (b) or Section 11375, or in Article 7 (commencing with Section 4211) of Chapter 9 of Division
22	2 of the Business and Professions Code, every person who possesses any controlled substance which is (1) classified in Schedule III, IV, or V, and which is not a narcotic
23	drug, (2) specified in subdivision (d) of Section 11054, except paragraphs (13), (14), (15), and (20) of subdivision (d), (3) specified in paragraph (11) of subdivision (c) of
24	Section 11056, (4) specified in paragraph (2) or (3) of subdivision (f) of Section 11054, or (5) specified in subdivision (d), (e), or (f) of Section 11055, unless upon the
25	prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, or veterinarian, licensed to practice in this state, shall be punished by imprisonment in a county jail for a period of not more than
26	one year or pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code.
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Health and Safety Code section 11364.1, subdivision (a) states:

It is unlawful to possess an opium pipe or any device, contrivance, instrument, or paraphernalia used for unlawfully injecting or smoking (1) a controlled substance specified in subdivision (b), (c), or (e), or paragraph (1) of subdivision (f) of Section 11054, specified in paragraph (14), (15), or (20) of subdivision (d) of Section 11054, specified in subdivision (b) or (c) of Section 11055, or specified in paragraph (2) of subdivision (d) of Section 11055, or (2) a controlled substance which is a narcotic drug classified in Schedule III, IV, or V.

#### **REGULATORY PROVISIONS**

9. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, states:

For the purpose of denial, suspension, or revocation of a personal or facility license pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and Professions Code, a crime or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or registrant if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of a licensee or registrant to perform the functions authorized by his license or registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare.

#### COSTS

10. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the

14 administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of

15 || the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and

16 enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not

17 || being renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs

18 may be included in a stipulated settlement.

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### DRUG

11. Methamphetamine is a Schedule II controlled substance as designated by Health
and Safety Code section 11055, subdivision (d)(2), and is a dangerous drug pursuant to Business
and Professions Code section 4022.

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# <u>CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE</u> (Violation of Statutes Regulating Controlled Substances)

12. Respondent has subjected his registration to discipline under section 4301,
subdivision (j) of the Code in that he violated statutes regulating controlled substances on
October 16, 2013. The circumstances are that on or about the evening of October 16, 2013, an
officer with the Garden Grove Police Department was patrolling a corridor of the city known for

1	drugs sales and violent crimes. The officer observed Respondent walking through the area three	
2	to four separate times, each time walking in a different direction. The officer made contact with	
3	Respondent who told the officer he was looking for a place to charge his cell phone. Respondent	
4	appeared very nervous, and his hand was trembling as he handed the officer his identification.	
5	During a consensual search, the officer found a glass pipe with burnt residue commonly used to	
6	smoke methamphetamine in Respondent's jacket. The officer confiscated the pipe and arrested	
7	Respondent for possession of narcotic paraphernalia. While en route to the jail facility,	
8	Respondent began to cry uncontrollably. The officer conducted another search of Respondent.	
9	Inside Respondent's pants pocket, the officer found two small zip-loc baggies containing 3.4	
10	grams of a substance that tested positive for methamphetamine. Respondent was additionally	
11	charged with possession of a controlled substance.	
12	PRAYER	
13	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,	
14	and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:	
15	1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 109546,	
16	issued to Brent Douglas Glassick;	
17	2. Ordering Brent Douglas Glassick to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs	
18	of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code	
19	section 125.3;	
20	3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
