16	FINDINGS OF FACT		
17	1. On November 4, 2015, Complainant Virginia Herold, in her official capacity as		
18	the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs, filed		
19	Accusation No. 5386 against Dimitri Deon Archibald (Respondent) before the Board of		
20	Pharmacy (Board). (Accusation attached as Exhibit A.)		
21	2. On March 22, 2012, the Board issued Pharmacy Technician Registration No.		
22	TCH 119075 to Respondent. The Pharmacy Technician Registration was in full force and effect		
23	at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 5386 and will expire on April 30,		
24	2017, unless renewed.		
25	3. On November 10, 2015, Respondent was	served by Certified and First Class Mail	
26	copies of Accusation No. 5386, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for		
27	Discovery, and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7)		
28	at Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section		
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4100, is required to be reported and maintained with the Board. Respondent's address of record was and is 13772 Goldenwest Street #140, Westminster, CA 92683.

- 4. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c) and Business & Professions Code section 124.
- 5. On November 16, 2015, the domestic return receipt for the aforementioned documents sent by certified mail was returned by the U.S. Postal Service indicating receipt on November 14, 2015.
  - 6. Government Code section 11506 states, in pertinent part:
  - (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.
- 7. Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon him of the Accusation, and therefore waived his right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 5386.
  - 8. California Government Code section 11520 states, in pertinent part:
  - (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent.
- 9. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the relevant evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this matter, as well as taking official notice of all the investigatory reports, exhibits and statements contained therein on file at the Board's offices regarding the allegations contained in Accusation No. 5386, finds that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 5386, are separately and severally, found to be true and correct by clear and convincing evidence.
- 10. Taking official notice of its own internal records, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3, it is hereby determined that the reasonable costs for Investigation and Enforcement is \$2,794.50 as of December 9, 2015.

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#### DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

- 1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Dimitri Deon Archibald has subjected his Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 119075 to discipline.
  - 2. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.
- 3. The Board of Pharmacy is authorized to revoke Respondent's Pharmacy

  Technician Registration based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation which are supported by the evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this case.
- a. Respondent has subjected his Pharmacy Technician Registration to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (f), in that he committed acts involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption.
- b. Respondent has subjected his Pharmacy Technician Registration to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (j), for violating statutes regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs, including Health and Safety Code sections 11170 and 11350, subdivision (a), in that he possessed a controlled substance without a prescription.
- c. Respondent has subjected his Pharmacy Technician Registration to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (o) for violating Pharmacy Law, in that Respondent possessed a controlled substance without a prescription in violation of Code section 4060.
- d. Respondent has subjected his Pharmacy Technician Registration to discipline under Code section 4301, for unprofessional conduct, in that Respondent possessed a controlled substance without a prescription in violation of Code sections 4022 and 4059, subdivision (a).
- e. Respondent has subjected his Pharmacy Technician Registration to discipline under Code section 4301 for unprofessional conduct in that he engaged in the activities described in paragraphs a through d, above.

#### ORDER

IT IS SO ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 119075, heretofore issued to Respondent Dimitri Deon Archibald, is revoked.

Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion may vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute.

This Decision shall become effective on February 19, 2016.

It is so ORDERED on January 20, 2016.

23	2. On March 22, 2012, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician		
24	Registration Number TCH 119075 to Dimitri Deon Archibald (Respondent). The Pharmacy		
25	Technician Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought

#### JURISDICTION

- 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.
- 4. Section 4011 of the Code provides that the Board shall administer and enforce both the Pharmacy Law [Bus. & Prof. Code, § 4000 et seq.] and the Uniform Controlled Substances Act [Health & Safety Code, § 11000 et seq.].
- 5. Section 4300, subdivision (a), of the Code provides that every license issued by the Board may be suspended or revoked.
  - 6. Section 4300.1 of the Code states:

The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license.

#### STATUTORY PROVISIONS

- 7. Section 4022 of the Code states
- "Dangerous drug" or "dangerous device" means any drug or device unsafe for self-use in humans or animals, and includes the following:
- (a) Any drug that bears the legend: "Caution: federal law prohibits dispensing without prescription," "Rx only," or words of similar import.
- (b) Any device that bears the statement: "Caution: federal law restricts this device to sale by or on the order of a \_\_\_\_\_," "Rx only," or words of similar import, the blank to be filled in with the designation of the practitioner licensed to use or order use of the device.
- (c) Any other drug or device that by federal or state law can be lawfully dispensed only on prescription or furnished pursuant to Section 4006.
- 8. Section 4059, subdivision (a) of the Code states in pertinent part:

A person may not furnish any dangerous drug, except upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7.

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#### 9. Section 4060 of the Code states:

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No person shall possess any controlled substance, except that furnished to a person upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7, or furnished pursuant to a drug order issued by a certified nurse-midwife pursuant to Section 2746.51, a nurse practitioner pursuant to Section 2836.1, a physician assistant pursuant to Section 3502.1, a naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.5, or a pharmacist pursuant to either Section 4052.1 or 4052.2. This section shall not apply to the possession of any controlled substance by a manufacturer, wholesaler, pharmacy, pharmacist, physician, podiatrist, dentist, optometrist, veterinarian, naturopathic doctor, certified nurse-midwife, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant, when in stock in containers correctly labeled with the name and address of the supplier or producer.

Nothing in this section authorizes a certified nurse-midwife, a nurse practitioner, a physician assistant, or a naturopathic doctor, to order his or her own stock of dangerous drugs and devices.

#### 10. Section 4301 of the Code states in pertinent part:

The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

(f) The commission of any act involving moral turpltude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.

(j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, or any other state, or of the United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.

(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency.

## 11. Health & Safety Code section 11170 states:

No person shall prescribe, administer, or furnish a controlled substance for himself.

 12. Health & Safety Code section 11350 states:

Except as otherwise provided in this division, every person who possesses (1) any controlled substance specified in subdivision (b) or (c), or paragraph (1) of subdivision (f) of Section 11054, specified in paragraph (14), (15), or (20) of subdivision (d) of Section 11054, or specified in subdivision (b) or (c) of Section 11055, or specified in subdivision (h) of Section 11056, or (2) any controlled substance classified in Schedule III, IV, or V which is a narcotic drug, unless upon the written prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, or veterinarian licensed to practice in this state, shall be punished by imprisonment pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code.

13. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, states:

For the purpose of denial, suspension, or revocation of a personal or facility license pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and Professions Code, a crime or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or registrant if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of a licensee or registrant to perform the functions authorized by his license or registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare.

- 14. United States Code, title 21, section 843 states, in pertinent part:
  - (a) It shall be unlawful for any person knowingly or intentionally –

(3) to acquire or obtain possession of a controlled substance by misrepresentation, fraud, forgery, deception, or subterfuge;

#### COST RECOVERY

15. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be included in a stipulated settlement.

#### DRUGS AT ISSUE

16. Diazepam is a Schedule IV controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code, section 11057, subdivision (d)(9) and is a dangerous drug under section 4022.

# THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE (Violations of Pharmacy Law)

23. Respondent has subjected his Pharmacy Technician Registration to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (o) for violating Pharmacy Law, in that Respondent possessed a controlled substance without a prescription in violation of Code section 4060, as set forth in paragraphs 18 through 20, above, which are incorporated herein by reference.

## FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

## (Possession of Controlled Substance without a Prescription)

24. Respondent has subjected his Pharmacy Technician Registration to discipline under Code section 4022 and 4059, subdivision (a), in that Respondent possessed a dangerous drug and/or controlled substance without a prescription, as set forth in paragraphs 18 through 20, above, which are incorporated herein by reference.

# FIFTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

#### (Unprofessional Conduct)

25. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301 for unprofessional conduct in that he engaged in the activities described in paragraphs 18 through 20, above, which are incorporated herein by reference.

#### PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

- Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH
   119075, issued to Dimitri Deon Archibald;
- Ordering Dimitri Deon Archibald to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and
