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20	In the interest of a prompt and speedy settlement of this matter, consistent with the public		
21	interest and the responsibility of the Board of Pharmacy of the Department of Consumer Affairs,		
22	the parties hereby agree to the following Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order which will		
23	be submitted to the Board for approval and adoption as the final disposition of the Accusation.		
24	PARTIES		
25	1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) is the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy.		
26	She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this matter by Kamala		
27	D. Harris, Attorney General of the State of California, by Lauro A. Paredes, Deputy Attorney		
28	General.		
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- 2. Andrew Isaac Foster (Respondent) is representing himself in this proceeding and has chosen not to exercise his right to be represented by counsel.
- 3. On or about September 10, 2014, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy
  Technician Registration No. TCH 142423 to Andrew Isaac Foster (Respondent). The Pharmacy
  Technician Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in
  Accusation No. 5628 and will expire on May 31, 2016, unless renewed.

### JURISDICTION

4. Accusation No. 5628 was filed before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on February 18, 2016.

Respondent timely filed his Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 5628 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

### ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- Respondent has carefully read, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 5628. Respondent also has carefully read, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.
- 6. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at his own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- 7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

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**CULPABILITY** 

- 8. Respondent understands that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 5628, if proven at a hearing, constitute cause for imposing discipline upon his Pharmacy Technician Registration.
- 9. For the purpose of resolving the Accusation without the expense and uncertainty of further proceedings, Respondent agrees that, at a hearing, Complainant could establish a factual basis for the charges in the Accusation and that those charges constitute cause for discipline. Respondent hereby gives up his right to contest that cause for discipline exists based on those charges.
- 10. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of his Pharmacy Technician Registration without further process.

### CONTINGENCY

- 11. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board of Pharmacy. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board of Pharmacy may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondent. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.
- 12. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 13. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement. It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions, negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order

may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

14. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

### **ORDER**

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 142423, issued to Respondent Andrew Isaac Foster, is surrendered and accepted by the Board of Pharmacy.

- 1. The surrender of Respondent's Pharmacy Technician Registration and the acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of Respondent's license history with the Board of Pharmacy.
- 2. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a pharmacy technician in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
- 3. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.
- 4. Respondent shall pay the agency its costs of investigation and enforcement in the amount of \$1,982.50 prior to issuance of a new or reinstated license. Nothing in this provision shall be construed to prohibit the Board from reducing the amount of cost recovery upon reinstatement of the license.
- 5. Respondent understands and agrees that if he or she ever files an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in the State of California, the board shall treat it as a new application for licensure.

Respondent may not apply for any license, permit, or registration from the board for three (3) years from the effective date of this decision. Respondent stipulates that should he or she apply for any license from the board on or after the effective date of this decision, all allegations set forth in Accusation No. 5628 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by respondent when the board determines whether to grant or deny the application.

Respondent shall satisfy all requirements applicable to that license as of the date the application is 1 submitted to the board, including, but not limited to certification by a nationally recognized body 2 prior to the issuance of a new license. Respondent is required to report this surrender as 3 disciplinary action. 5 **ACCEPTANCE** I have carefully read the Stipulated Surrender of License and Order. I understand the 6 stipulation and the effect it will have on my Pharmacy Technician Registration. 21	1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as		
22	the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs.

24	Number TCH 142423 to Andrew Isaac Foster (Respondent). The Pharmacy Technician		
25	Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will		
26	expire on May 31, 2016, unless renewed.

#### JURISDICTION

- 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.
- Section 4300, subdivision (a), of the Code provides that every license issued may by the Board may be suspended or revoked.
  - Section 4300.1 of the Code states:

The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license.

#### STATUTORY PROVISIONS

Section 492 of the Code states:

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, successful completion of any diversion program under the Penal Code, or successful completion of an alcohol and drug problem assessment program under Article 5 (commencing with section 23249.50) of Chapter 12 of Division 11 of the Vehicle Code, shall not prohibit any agency established under Division 2 ([Healing Arts] commencing with Section 500) of this code, or any initiative act referred to in that division, from taking disciplinary action against a licensee or from denying a license for professional misconduct, notwithstanding that evidence of that misconduct may be recorded in a record pertaining to an arrest.

This section shall not be construed to apply to any drug diversion program operated by any agency established under Division 2 (commencing with Section 500) of this code, or any initiative act referred to in that division.

7: Section 4301 of the Code states:

The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

(h) The administering to oneself, of any controlled substance, or the use of any dangerous drug or of alcoholic beverages to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to oneself, to a person holding a license under this chapter, or to any other person or to the public, or to the extent that the use impairs the ability of the person to conduct with safety to the public the practice authorized by the license.

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United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.

(j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, or any other state, or of the

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(a) A person shall not use, or be under the influence of any controlled substance that is (1) specified in subdivision (b), (c), or (e), or paragraph (1) of subdivision (f) of Section 11054, specified in paragraph (14), (15), (21), (22), or (23) of subdivision (d) of Section 11054, specified in subdivision (b) or (c) of Section 11055, or specified in paragraph (1) or (2) of subdivision (d) or in paragraph (3) of subdivision (e) of Section 11055, or (2) a narcotic drug classified in Schedule III, IV, or V, except when administered by or under the direction of a person licensed by the state to dispense, prescribe, or administer controlled substances. It shall be the burden of the defense to show that it comes within the exception. A person convicted of violating this subdivision is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be sentenced to serve a term of not more than one year in a county jail. The court may also place a person convicted under this subdivision

### Health and Safety Code section 11364.1, subdivision (a) states:

It is unlawful to possess an opium pipe or any device, contrivance, instrument, or paraphernalia used for unlawfully injecting or smoking (1) a controlled substance specified in subdivision (b), (c), or (e), or paragraph (1) of subdivision (f) of Section 11054, specified in paragraph (14), (15), or (20) of subdivision (d) of Section 11054, specified in subdivision (b) or (c) of Section 11055, or specified in paragraph (2) of subdivision (d) of Section 11055, or (2) a controlled substance which is a narcotic drug classified in Schedule III, IV, or V.

For the purpose of denial, suspension, or revocation of a personal or facility license pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and Professions Code, a crime or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or registrant if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of a licensee or registrant to perform the functions authorized by his license or registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare.

11. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being

renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be included in a stipulated settlement.

#### DRUGS AT ISSUE

- 12. Methamphetamine is a schedule II controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11055, subdivision (d)(2), and is a dangerous drug pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4022.
- 13. Amphetamine is a Schedule II controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11055, subdivision (d), and a dangerous drug pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4022.

### FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

### (Unprofessional Conduct)

- 14. Respondent has subjected his registration to discipline under section 4301, of the Code for unprofessional conduct in that on April 25, 2015, Respondent was observed sitting nude at an elementary school and masturbating, while under the influence of Methamphetamine.
- a. The circumstances are that on or about the early morning of Saturday, April 25, 2015, a deputy with the Riverside County Sheriff Department was dispatched to a nearby elementary school. A witness observed a man sitting nude and masturbating at an elementary school table. The man had a black backpack. The witness yelled at the Respondent, which caused Respondent to run away. The witness observed Respondent jump into the backyard of a nearby residence, which was later identified as Respondent's house. Based upon the witness observations, the deputy went to the identified residence and interviewed Respondent. During a consensual search of his residence, the deputy seized a glass smoking pipe used to smoke methamphetamine, he also found a black backpack, which was described by the witness. Respondent, admitted he has a methamphetamine addiction, and that he indigested methamphetamine the night before. Respondent admitted he went for a walk and that he sat at a table at the elementary school. The officer arrested Respondent for possession of the glass meth pipe. Respondent admitted that he was under the influence and snapped out of his fog when he

realized his behavior was inappropriate. During booking, Respondent provided his blood sample which confirmed the presence of methamphetamine and amphetamine.

b. On or about June 19, 2015, in the criminal proceeding entitled *The People of the State of California v. Andrew Isaac Foster*, in the Riverside County Superior Court, case no. RIM 1508840, Respondent was charged with violating Health and Safety Code section 11550, subdivision (a), willfully and unlawfully used and was under the influence of a controlled substance and Health and Safety Code section 11364, possession of an opium pipe and a device, contrivance, instrument, and paraphernalia used for unlawfully injecting a smoking a controlled substance. The court referred Respondent to Veterans Court, pursuant to a military diversion program, Penal Code section 1001.80, Penal Code section 1000, and Penal Code section 1210.1.

### SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

### (Violation of Statutes Involving Controlled Substances)

15. Respondent has subjected his registration to discipline under section 4301, subdivision (j) of the Code for unprofessional conduct in that on April 25, 2015, Respondent knowingly violated Health and Safety Code sections 11364 and 11550, when he was in possession of paraphernalia and use of a controlled substance, as described in paragraph 14, above.

## THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

#### (Dangerous Use of a Controlled Substance)

16. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subdivision (h) in that on April 25, 2015, Respondent was under the influence of a controlled substance, to wit, methamphetamine and amphetamine. Respondent admitted to having a methamphetamine addiction. Complainant refers to, and by reference incorporates, the allegations set forth above in paragraph 14, subparagraph (a), as though fully set forth herein.

### PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:
