8	6. Government Code section 11506 states, in pertinent part:

21	person, because of the person's race, color, religion, nationality, country of origin, ancestry, and
22	sexual orientation; acts that are substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of
23	a registered pharmacy technician. The circumstances are as follows:
24	a. On several occasions before July 1, 2015, Respondent made numerous
25	annoying and harassing phone calls to an African-American woman in Moreno Valley,
26	California. The woman was the foster mother to Respondent's son. Shortly after gaining custody
27	of Respondent's sixteen-year-old son, Respondent left inflammatory messages on the foster
28	mother's voice mail making racial slurs and criminal threats against her and her biological son.
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b. On July 1 and 2, 2015, Respondent left messages calling the foster mother 1 a "porch monkey, lesbian bitch, and an animal who raises gorillas." On multiple occasions 2 during the messages, Respondent mentioned "taking a ball peen hammer" to the foster parent 3 and her "gorilla son" for putting their "gorilla hands" on his son. The foster mother recognized 4 Respondent's voice having spoken with him on numerous occasions, and by the number of 5 messages she received. A responding deputy from the Moreno Valley Station of the Riverside 6 County Sheriff's Department attempted to contact Respondent based on the phone number where 7 the messages originated. As soon as Respondent identified the deputy, Respondent disconnected 8 the call. The deputy made numerous attempts to call Respondent, but there was no answer. On 9 August 6, 2015, the deputy followed-up with the foster mother, who told the deputy that 10 Respondent had not contacted her recently. 11 On August 25, 2015, in a criminal proceeding entitled The People of the 12 C. State of California vs. Anthony Raymond Beebe, aka Tony Beebe, in Riverside County Superior 13 Court, Hall of Justice Courthouse, Criminal Division Case Number RIF1502372, Respondent 14 was charged with violating Penal Code (PC) sections 646.9, subdivision (a), stalking, and 422, 15 criminal threats of death and great bodily injury, both felonies. The charges alleged that in the 16 commission of the felonies, Respondent committed or attempted to commit the felonies because 17 of the victim's race color, religion, nationality, country of origin, ancestry, and sexual orientation 18 within the meaning of PC section 422.75, subdivision (a). On May 6, 2016, Respondent is 19 scheduled for trial readiness conference, 20PRAYER 21WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, 22 23 and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision: Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 89959, 24 1. issued to Anthony Raymond Beebe; 25
