18	FINDINGS OF FACT		
19	1. On or about September 14, 2016, Complainant Virginia K. Herold, in her official		
20	capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs,		
21	filed Accusation No. 5855 against Chabelli Alejandra Olachea (Respondent) before the Board of		
22	Pharmacy. (Accusation attached as Exhibit A.)		
23	2. On or about September 10, 2014, the Board of Pharmacy (Board) issued Pharmacy		
24	Technician Registration No. TCH 142431 to Respondent. The Pharmacy Technician Registration		
25	was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 5855,		
26	expired on July 31, 2016, and has not been renewed. This lapse in licensure, however, pursuant		
27	to Business and Professions Code section 118(b) and/or agency specific statute does not deprive		
28	the [Board] of its authority to institute or continu	ie this disciplinary proceeding.	

- 3. On or about September 20, 2016, Respondent was served by Certified and First Class Mail copies of the Accusation No. 5855, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for Discovery, and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7) at Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4100, is required to be reported and maintained with the Board. Respondent's address of record was and is: 15675 Paine St., Fontana, CA 92336.
- 4. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c) and/or Business & Professions Code section 124.
- 5. On or about October 27, 2016, the aforementioned documents were returned by the U.S. Postal Service marked "Unclaimed."
  - 6. Government Code section 11506(c) states, in pertinent part:
  - (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense . . . and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation . . . not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense . . . shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.
- 7. Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon her of the Accusation, and therefore waived her right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 5855.
  - 8. California Government Code section 11520(a) states, in pertinent part:
  - (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense . . . or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent . . . .
- 9. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the relevant evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this matter, as well as taking official notice of all the investigatory reports, exhibits and statements contained therein on file at the Board's offices regarding the allegations contained in Accusation No. 5855, finds that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 5855, are separately and severally, found to be true and correct by clear and convincing evidence.

1 **ORDER** IT IS SO ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 142431, heretofore 2 issued to Respondent Chabelli Alejandra Olachea, is revoked. 3 Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a 4 written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within 5 seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion may 6 7 vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute. #### STATUTORY PROVISIONS

- 3. Section 4300 provides, in pertinent part, that every license issued by the Board is subject to discipline, including suspension or revocation.
  - 4. Section 4300.1 states:

"The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license."

5. Section 4301 states, in pertinent part:

"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake.

Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

"(f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and

whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.

"(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency."

#### COST RECOVERY

6. Section 125.3 states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

III

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#### FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

#### (Acts Involving Dishonesty, Fraud, or Deceit)

7. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (f), in that Respondent committed acts involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit. Specifically, on January 7, 2016, during an investigation at a Wal-Mart store regarding an employee who was detained for embezzlement, Respondent, a pharmacy technician employed at a Wal-Mart was observed by a Loss Prevention Agent (LPA) on surveillance video of December 30, 2015, passing merchandise items through her check stand without scanning them. Respondent was also observed scanning certain merchandise items and voiding the transactions or doing a private over-ride. LPA reviewed additional video surveillance footage from the entire month of December and discovered several other fraudulent transactions. On one specific occasion, Respondent charged a random customer for a drink for herself on their credit card without the customer knowing. When confronted by LPA, Respondent showed no emotion, but said she was sorry. Respondent admitted to all the thefts including several others. Respondent estimated that she passed approximately \$3,000 worth of merchandise to her friends and family since her employment in April, 2015.

#### SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

#### (Violating Provisions of the Pharmacy Act)

8. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (o), in that Respondent violated provisions of the Pharmacy Act. Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates, the allegations set forth above in paragraph 7, as though set forth fully.

#### **PRAYER**

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 142431, issued to Chabelli Alejandra Olachea;

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
