19	1. On or about October 14, 2016, Complainant Virginia K. Herold, in her official		
20	capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer		
21	Affairs, filed Accusation No. 5925 against Sadie Michelle Walker (Respondent). (A copy of the		
22	Accusation is attached as Exhibit A.)		
23	2. On or about July 17, 2013, the Board	l issued Pharmacy Technician Registration No.	
24	TCH 132929 to Respondent. The Pharmacy Technician Registration was in full force and effec		
25	at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 5925 and will expire on May 31,		
26	2017, unless renewed.		
27	3. On or about October 24, 2016, Respondent was served by Certified and First Class		
28	Mail copies of the Accusation No. 5925, Statement	ent to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request	
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for Discovery, and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7) at Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4100, subdivision (a), is required to be reported and maintained with the Board. Respondent's address of record was and is:

2855 Pinecreek Drive, Apt. E425 Costa Mesa, CA 92649.

- 4. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c) and/or Business & Professions Code section 124.
- 5. On or about November 23, 2016 the aforementioned documents served by certified mail were returned by the U.S. Postal Service marked "Return to Sender Unable to Forward."
 - 6. Government Code section 11506(c) states, in pertinent part:
 - (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense . . . and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation . . . not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense . . . shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.
- 7. Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon her of the Accusation, and therefore waived her right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 5925.
 - 8. California Government Code section 11520(a) states, in pertinent part:
 - (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense . . . or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent
- 9. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the relevant evidence contained in the Default Decision Investigatory Evidence Packet in this matter, as well as taking official notice of all the investigatory reports, exhibits and statements contained therein on file at the Board's offices regarding the allegations contained in Accusation No. 5925, finds that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 5925, are separately and severally, found to be true and correct by clear and convincing evidence.

ORDER 1 IT IS SO ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 132929, heretofore 2 issued to Respondent Sadie Michelle Walker, is revoked. 3 Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a 4 5 written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. - 10. Health & Safety Code section 11550 states, in pertinent part:
- (a) A person shall not use, or be under the influence of any controlled substance that is (1) specified in subdivision (b), (c), or (e), or paragraph (1) of subdivision (f) of Section 11054, specified in paragraph (14), (15), (21), (22), or (23) of subdivision (d) of Section 11054, specified in subdivision (b) or (c) of Section 11055, or specified in paragraph (1) or (2) of subdivision (d) or in paragraph (3) of subdivision (e) of Section 11055, or (2) a narcotic drug classified in Schedule III, IV, or V, except when administered by or under the direction of a person licensed by the state to dispense, prescribe, or administer controlled substances. It shall be the burden of the defense to show that it comes within the exception. A person convicted of violating this subdivision is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be sentenced to serve a term of not more than one year in a county jail. The court may also place a person convicted under this subdivision on probation for a period not to exceed five years.

COST RECOVERY

11. Code section 125.3 provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be included in a stipulated settlement.

DRUGS

- 12. Amphetamine is a Schedule II controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11055, subdivision (d)(1), and categorized as a dangerous drug under Code section 4022.
- 13. Methamphetamine is a Schedule II controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11055, subdivision (d)(2), and categorized as a dangerous drug under Code section 4022.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Self-Administration of Controlled Substances Without Prescription)

14. Respondent has subjected her Pharmacy Technician Registration to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (h) in that she self-administered the controlled substances, amphetamine and methamphetamine, without prescription. The circumstances are as follows:

a. At or about 1:00 in the morning on January 15, 2016, officers from the Costa Mesa Police Department responded to a noise complaint. When they arrived at the apartment, Respondent appeared to be under the influence of drugs. The officers observed Respondent's rapid speech, large pupils, absence of horizontal and vertical gaze nystagmuses, and lack of convergence. Respondent admitted to having been up for the past three days using methamphetamine. Respondent also admitted to smoking marijuana and taking approximately .5 to 1 gram of Xanax. Respondent failed the under the influence of a combination of central nervous system (CNS) stimulants and CNS depressants examination and was arrested for being under the influence of drugs. Respondent was transported to the jail for booking and processing. On February 24, 2016, Respondent's toxicological examination report indicated positive for amphetamine and methamphetamine.

b. On January 25, 2016, in a criminal proceeding entitled *The People of the State of California vs. Sadie Michelle Walker*, in Orange County Superior Court, West Justice Center, Case Number 16WM01136, Respondent was charged with violation of HSC section 11550, subdivision (a), use and under the influence of controlled substance methamphetamine, a misdemeanor. On April 21, 2016, Respondent completed the Defense Drug Dismissal Program. On June 20, 2016, the motion of the People for terminal disposition was granted, the charge was dismissed, and the case closed.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Violation of Pharmacy Law Regulating Controlled Substances and Dangerous Drugs)

15. Respondent has subjected her Pharmacy Technician Registration to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivisions (j) and (o) in that Respondent violated Health and Safety Code section 11550, subdivision (a), a pharmacy law of the State of California regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs, as detailed in paragraph 14, above, and incorporated herein by this reference.

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PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 132929, issued to Sadie Michelle Walker;
- 2. Ordering Sadie Michelle Walker to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and,
 - 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
