18	1. On June 30, 2017, Complainant Virginia Herold, in her official capacity as the	
19.	Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs, filed Accusation	
20	No. 5982 against Mindy Louise Luna (Respondent) before the Board of Pharmacy (Board).	
21	(Accusation attached as Exhibit A.)	
22	2. On February 3, 2010, the Board issued Pharmacy Technician Registration No.	
23	TCH 98731 to Respondent. The Pharmacy Technician Registration expired on October 31, 2015,	
24	and has not been renewed.

- 3. On July 11, 2017, Respondent was served by Certified and First Class Mail copies of Accusation No. 5982, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for Discovery, and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7) at Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code (Code) section 4100, is required to be reported and maintained with the Board. Respondent's address of record was and is P.O. Box 224, El Cajon, CA 92020.
- 4. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c) and Code section 124.
- 5. On July 28, 2017, the aforementioned documents were returned by the U.S. Postal Service marked "Not Deliverable as Address, Unable to Forward." The address on the documents was the same as the address on file with the Board. Respondent failed to maintain an updated address with the Board and the Board has made attempts to serve the Respondent at the address on file. Respondent has not made herself available for service and therefore, has not availed herself of her right to file a notice of defense and appear at hearing.
 - 6. Government Code section 11506 (c) states, in pertinent part:
 - (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense . . . and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation . . . not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense . . . shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.
- 7. The Board takes official notice of its records and the fact that Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon her of the Accusation, and therefore waived her right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 5982.
 - 8. California Government Code section 11520 (a) states, in pertinent part:
 - (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense . . . or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent

9.	Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds	
Responder	nt is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the	
relevant ev	vidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this matter, as well as	
taking offi	cial notice of all the investigatory reports, exhibits and statements contained therein on	
file at the l	Board's offices regarding the allegations contained in Accusation No. 5982, finds that	
the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 5982, are separately and severally, found to be true		
and correc	t by clear and convincing evidence.	

10. Taking official notice of its own internal records, pursuant to Code section 125.3, it is hereby determined that the reasonable costs for Investigation and Enforcement is \$17,900.00 as of August 11, 2017.

DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

- 1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Mindy Louise Luna has subjected her Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 98731 to discipline.
 - 2. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.
- 3. The Board of Pharmacy is authorized to revoke Respondent's Pharmacy

 Technician Registration based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation which are
 supported by the evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this case.:
- a. Respondent has subjected her registration to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (f), and Health and Safety Code section 11173, subdivision (a), for unprofessional conduct in that Respondent stole hydrocodone HPAP, promethazine with codeine, and alprazolam, Viagra and suboxone from her employer using fraud, deceit, and dishonesty.
- b. Respondent has subjected her registration to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (j) for unprofessional conduct in that Respondent knowingly violated Health and Safety Code section 11173, subdivision (a), Title 21 U.S.C. section 843, subdivision (a)(3), and the California Uniform Controlled Substances Act (Health and Safety Code 11000, et seq.).

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ORDER 1 IT IS SO ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 98731, heretofore 2 issued to Respondent Mindy Louise Luna, is revoked. 3 Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a 4 written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within 5 seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent.
