Re: Proposed Amendment of Business & Professions Code Sec. 4113.5 Related to Pharmacy Staffing

Dear President Oh.

The California Pharmacists Association (CPhA) appreciates the discussion and work of the Medication Error Reduction and Workforce Ad Hoc Committee since the beginning of 2022. CPhA writes in support of the proposed amendments to Business & Professions Code Sec. 4113.5 as it relates to appropriate and safe staffing of pharmacies and the autonomy of the Pharmacist in Charge (PIC) in determining safe working conditions.

As discussed in the Ad Hoc Committee meetings, there is a correlation between appropriate staffing levels and pharmacy personnel burnout leading to potential medication errors. This recommendation complements the CPhA sponsored bill in the most recent legislative cycle, SB 362 (Newman) Pharmacy Quotas, which aims to reduce the burnout with profit driven metrics and a lack of focus on patient-centered outcomes.

In addition, the following CPhA policies fully support the recommendations of the Ad Hoc Committee:

- The California Pharmacists Association supports pharmacist and technician staffing which supports workflow without compromising patient safety.
- The California Pharmacists Association supports the development of policies, resources, and practices to support pharmacy personnel's safety and wellbeing in the workplace.
- The California Pharmacists Association supports business policies, practices, resources and staffing models that ensure patient safety

CPhA fully supports the autonomy provided to the pharmacist on duty to determine adequate staffing levels to honor their oath as a pharmacist to provide patient care services safely without fear of retaliation.
