## Recent news:

- Following a detailed risk assessment and implementation of a COVID-19 prevention plan, the Board reopened its Sacramento office to the public June 15. Normal hours of operation at 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, excluding state holidays.

- The Board has extended several Pharmacy Law waivers granted during the COVID-19

• Be sure to sign up for subscriber alerts to receive the latest important information from the Board. As a reminder, all facilities, pharmacists, intern pharmacists, pharmacy technicians and designated representatives must sign up to receive subscriber alerts for their license type within 60 days of obtaining a license or at the time of license renewal. Licensees also must update their email addresses with the Board within 30 days of any change of email address. Signing up is quick, easy, and available online at the Board of Pharmacy Email Registration page.
