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discipline any license, for any reason provided in the Pharmacy Law, (i.e., Business and 1 2 Professions Code sections 4000 et. seq.) Business and Professions Code section 4301 states, in pertinent part: 3 4 § 4301. Unprofessional conduct; licenses procured through misrepresentation, fraud, or mistake 5 The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following: 7 (h) The administering to oneself, of any controlled substance, or the use of any 9 dangerous drug or of alcoholic beverages to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to oneself, to a person holding a license under this chapter, 10 or to any other person or to the public, or to the extent that the use impairs the ability of the person to conduct with safety to the public the practice authorized by 11 the license 12 13 (p) Actions or conduct that would have warranted denial of a license. 14 15 Business and Professions Code section 118 (b), states: 5. 16 17 "The suspension, expiration, or forfeiture by operation of law of a license issued by a board in the department, or its suspension, forfeiture, or cancellation by order of the board or by order of a court of law, or its 18 surrender without the written consent of the board, shall not, during any period in which it may be renewed, restored, reissued, or reinstated, deprive 19 the board of its authority to institute or continue a disciplinary proceeding against the licensee upon any ground provided by law or to enter an order 20 suspending or revoking the license or otherwise taking disciplinary action against the licensee on any such ground." 21 22 6.
