18	PARTIES	
19	1. Virginia Herold ("Complainant") brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity	
20	as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.	
21	2. On or about June 11, 2007, the Board of Pharmacy ("Board") issued Pharmacy	
22	Technician Registration No. TCH 74975 to Asefeh Niktalean ("Respondent"). The Pharmacy	
23	Technician Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought	
24	herein and will expire on September 30, 2010, unless renewed.	
25	JURISDICTION	
26	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following	
27	laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code ("Code") unless otherwise	
28	indicated.	
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STATUTORY PROVISIONS

4. Section 4060 of the Code states:

"No person shall possess any controlled substance, except that furnished to a person upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, optometrist, or veterinarian. . ."

- 5. Section 4300 of the Code permits the Board to take disciplinary action to suspend or revoke a license issued by the Board.
 - 6. Section 4301 of the Code states, in pertinent part:

"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

- (j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, of any other state, or of the United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.
- (o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency..."
- 7. Section 11357 (b) of the Health and Safety Code states, in pertinent part,
- "Except as authorized by law, every person who possesses not more than 28.5 grams of marijuana, other than concentrated cannabis, is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100)."
- 8. Section 11377 of the Health and Safety Code states, in pertinent part:
- "(a) Except as authorized by law and as otherwise provided in subdivision (b) or Section 11375, or in Article 7 (commencing with Section 4211) of Chapter 9 of Division 2 of the Business and Professions Code, every person who possesses any controlled substance which is (1) classified in Schedule III, IV, or V, and which is not a narcotic drug, (2) specified in subdivision (d) of Section 11054, except paragraphs (13), (14), (15), and (20) of subdivision (d), (3) specified in paragraph (11) of subdivision (c) of Section 11056, (4) specified in paragraph (2) or (3) of subdivision (f) of Section 11054, or (5) specified in subdivision (d), (e), or (f) of Section 11055, unless upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, or veterinarian, licensed to practice in this state, shall be punished by imprisonment in a county jail for a period of not more than one year or in the state prison."
- 9. Section 11350, subdivision (a) of the Health and Safety Code states:

"Except as otherwise provided in this division, every person who possesses (1) any controlled substance specified in subdivision (b) or (c), or paragraph (1) of subdivision (f) of Section 11054, specified in paragraph (14), (15), or (20) of subdivision (d) of Section 11054, or specified in subdivision (b) or (c) of Section 11055, or specified in subdivision (h) of Section 11056, or (2) any controlled substance classified in Schedule III, IV, or V which is a narcotic drug, unless upon the written prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, or veterinarian licensed to practice in this state, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison."

COST RECOVERY

10. Section 125.3 of the Code states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE-DANGEROUS DRUGS

- 11. "Psilocybin (mushrooms)" is designated as a Schedule I controlled substance by Health and Safety Code section 11054(d)(18) and is a dangerous drug pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4022.
- 12. Hydrocodone is designated as a Schedule II controlled substance by Health and Safety Code section 11055(b)(j) and is a dangerous drug pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4022. "Norco" is a hydrocodone bitartrate and acetaminophen tablet.
- 13. Zolpidem is designated as a Schedule IV non-narcotic controlled substance by Health and Safety Code section 11057 (d)(32). "Ambien" is a brand name of zolpidem.
- 14. Alprazolam is designated as a Schedule IV non-narcotic controlled substance by Health and Safety Code section 11057(d)(1). "Xanax" is a brand name of allprazolam.
- 15. Marijuana is designated as a Schedule I controlled substance by Health and Safety Code section 11054(d)(13) and is a dangerous drug pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4022.

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FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Possession of Norco)

- Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (j) of the Code for unprofessional conduct in that Respondent possessed Norco, a controlled substance, in violation of Health and Safety Code section 11350 as follows:
- On or about December 13, 2008, an Officer with the California Highway Patrol initiated a traffic enforcement stop on a silver BMW because the vehicle was traveling at a high rate of speed. Respondent was a passenger in the vehicle at the time of the stop.
- As the driver of the BMW provided the Officer with paperwork, the Officer 18. immediately was able to smell an odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle.
- One by one, the occupants of the vehicle were asked if they had any marijuana in their possession. Each occupant, including the Respondent, denied possessing any marijuana.
- The Officer than conducted a search of the vehicle. Inside of the vehicle, the Officer located a brown purse. Respondent claimed ownership of the brown purse. Inside of Respondent's purse, the Officer located four Xanax pills, seven Ambien pills, a pill bottle containing 14 grams of psilocybin mushrooms, three Norco pills and a digital pocket scale.
- Respondent was arrested and transported to the Inyo County Jail. During the booking 21. process, Respondent removed from her bra area, a medication bottle containing 21 grams of marijuana.
- Respondent did not have a prescription for any of the controlled substances found in 22. her possession.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Possession of Xanax)

Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (j) of the 23. Code for unprofessional conduct in that Respondent possessed Xanax, a controlled substance, in violation of Business and Professions Code section 4060 and Health and Safety Code section 11377 (a). Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates, the allegations set forth in paragraphs 17 though 22, inclusive, above, as though set forth fully.

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THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Possession of Ambien)

24. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (j) of the Code for unprofessional conduct in that Respondent possessed Ambien, a controlled substance, in violation of Business and Professions Code section 4060 and Health and Safety Code section 11377 (a). Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates, the allegations set forth in paragraphs 17 though 22, inclusive, above, as though set forth fully.

FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Possession of Psilocybin Mushroom)

25. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (j) of the Code for unprofessional conduct in that Respondent possessed Psilocybin Mushrooms, a controlled substance, in violation of Health and Safety Code section 11377, subdivision (a). Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates, the allegations set forth in paragraphs 17 though 22, inclusive, above, as though set forth fully.

FIFTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Possession of Marijuana)

26. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (j) of the Code for unprofessional conduct in that Respondent possessed marijuana, a controlled substance, in violation of Health and Safety Code section 11357, subdivision (b). Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates, the allegations set forth in paragraphs 17 though 22, inclusive, above, as though set forth fully.

SIXTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct)

Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301 of the Code for 27. unprofessional conduct. Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates, the allegations set forth in paragraphs 17 though 22, inclusive, above, as though set forth fully.

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PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 74975, issued to Respondent;
- 2. Ordering Respondent to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and
 - 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
