19	1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity
20	as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.
21	2. On or about April 12, 2001, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician
22	Registration Number TCH 37186 to John Eloy Anderson, aka Joan Elloy Anderson (Respondent).
23	The Pharmacy Technician Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the
24	charges brought herein and will expire on May 31, 2012, unless renewed.
25	JURISDICTION
26	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of
27	Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the
28	Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.

14	6. Section 125.3 of the Code states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the	
15	administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of	
16	the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and	I

18	7. Section 118, subdivision (b), of the Code provides that the	
19	suspension/expiration/surrender/cancellation of a license shall not deprive the	
20	Board/Registrar/Director of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period

22	8. Section 490 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that a board may suspend or	
23	revoke a license on the ground that the licensee has been convicted of a crime substantially	
24	related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the business or profession for which the	
25	license was issued.	
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FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

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(Substantially Related Convictions)

9. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under sections 4300 and 4301,
subdivisions (1), in conjunction with section 490, on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, as
defined in California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, in that Respondent was
convicted of crimes substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a pharmacy
technician as follows:

a. On or about October 17, 2003, Respondent was convicted of one misdemeanor count
of violating Penal Code section 273.6 (a) (Violate Domestic Relations Court Order) in the
criminal proceeding entitled *People of the State of California v.John Eloy Anderson*, in the
Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Case No. 3LC00547). Respondent was
placed on summary probation for 36 months on certain terms and conditions which include, but
are not limited to, 25 days in jail, obey protective order, and four psychotherapy sessions with
progress shown.

On or about February 20, 2004, Respondent was convicted of one misdemeanor count 15 b. of violating Penal Code section 273.6(a) (Violate Domestic Relations Court Order), in the 16 criminal proceeding entitled People of the State of California v. John Eloy Anderson in the 17 Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Case No. CM08753. Respondent was 18 placed on summary probation for 36 months on certain terms and conditions which include, but 19 are not limited to, 45 days in county jail, obey protective order, attend psychotherapy sessions, 20 and pay fines, fees, and restitution. Probation was revoked for probation violation on January 24, 21 2005. On September 6, 2005, Respondent was remanded back to custody. On October 26, 2005, 22 the court terminated probation pursuant to a plea agreement in criminal Case No. TA080302 (to 23 be fully described in paragraph (d). 24

c. On or about February 20, 2004, Respondent was convicted of one misdemeanor count
of violating Penal Code section 273.6(a) (Violate Domestic Relations Court Order), in the
criminal proceeding entitled People of the State of California v. John Eloy Anderson in the
Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Case No. 3CM08742. Respondent was

placed on summary probation for 36 months on certain terms and conditions which include, but
are not limited to, 45 days in county jail, obey protective order, attend psychotherapy sessions,
and pay fines, fees, and restitution. Probation was revoked for probation violation on January 24,
2005. On September 6, 2005, Respondent was remanded back to custody. On October 26, 2005,
the court terminated probation pursuant to a plea agreement in criminal Case No. TA080302 (to
be fully described in paragraph (d).

On or about October 26, 2005, Respondent was convicted of one felony count of d. 7 violating Penal Code section 646.9(b) (Stalking: Temporary Restraining Order), in the criminal 8 proceeding entitled People of the State of California v. John Eloy Anderson, the Superior Court of 9 California, County of Los Angeles, Case No. TA080302). Respondent was placed on probation 10 for five years, under terms and conditions which included, but was not limited to, one year in 11 county jail, no drugs or alcohol, domestic violence counseling, drug testing, and no ownership or 12 possession of deadly weapons. Probation was revoked on May 19, 2008 and Respondent was 13 remanded to custody on June 9, 2008. On August 6, 2008, the court denied probation and ordered 14 Respondent to serve three years. Respondent was released from prison on July 27, 2010. 15

The circumstances of the crime are that Respondent was arrested on June 17, 2005 for
stalking and making criminal threats to Brenda G., as well as contempt of court for disobeying a
protective order.

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SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct/Acts Involving Moral Turpitude)

10. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code Section 4301(f) in that
Respondent committed multiple acts involving moral turpitude and a complete disregard for the
laws of this State. Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates, the allegations set
forth above in Paragraph 9 subparagraphs (a) through (d), inclusive, as though set forth fully.

PRAYER

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WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
 and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

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Accusation

1	1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 37186,
2	issued to John Eloy Anderson, aka Joan Elloy Anderson
3	2. Ordering John Eloy Anderson to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of
4	the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section
5	125.3;
6	3. Taking such other and further agtion as deemed necessary and proper.
