20	<u>PARTIES</u>	
21	1. Virginia K. Herold (Complainant) brings this Accusation and Petition to Revoke	
22	Probation solely in her official capacity as the Executive Officer of the California State Board of	
23	Pharmacy.	
24 .	2. On or about September 4, 1985, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacist License	
25	No. RPH 39528 to Norman Bruce Shibley (Respondent). The Pharmacist License expired on	
26	December 31, 2010, and has not been renewed. Effective May 18, 2011, the Board of Pharmacy	
27	suspended Respondent's Pharmacist License.	
28	,	

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3. In a disciplinary action entitled "In the Matter of Accusation Against Norman Bruce Shibley," Case No. 3370, the California State Board of Pharmacy, issued a decision, effective March 28, 2011, in which Respondent's Pharmacist License was revoked. However, the revocation was stayed and Respondent's Pharmacist License was suspended for nine (9) months and placed on probation for a period of six (6) years with certain terms and conditions. A copy of that decision is attached as Exhibit A and is incorporated by reference.

JURISDICTION

- 4. This Accusation and Petition to Revoke Probation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.
 - 5. Section 4300 of the Code states, in part:
- "(d) The board may initiate disciplinary proceedings to revoke or suspend any probationary certificate of licensure for any violation of the terms and conditions of probation. Upon satisfactory completion of probation, the board shall convert the probationary certificate to a regular certificate, free of conditions."
 - 6. Section 4301 of the Code states, in part:

"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

- "(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency."
 - 7. Section 4231 states:
- "(a) The board shall not renew a pharmacist license unless the applicant submits proof satisfactory to the board that he or she has successfully completed 30 hours of approved courses of continuing pharmacy education during the two years preceding the application for renewal.

. . .

"(c) If an applicant for renewal of a pharmacist license submits the renewal application and payment of the renewal fee but does not submit proof satisfactory to the board that the licensee has completed 30 hours of continuing pharmacy education, the board shall not renew the license and shall issue the applicant an inactive pharmacist license. A licensee with an inactive pharmacist license issued pursuant to this section may obtain an active pharmacist license by paying the renewal fees due and submitting satisfactory proof to the board that the licensee has completed 30 hours of continuing pharmacy education.

- "(d) If, as part of an investigation or audit conducted by the board, a pharmacist fails to provide documentation substantiating the completion of continuing education as required in subdivision (a), the board shall cancel the active pharmacist license and issue an inactive pharmacist license in its place. A licensee with an inactive pharmacist license issued pursuant to this section may obtain an active pharmacist license by paying the renewal fees due and submitting satisfactory proof to the board that the licensee has completed 30 hours of continuing pharmacy education."
- 8. Section 118, subdivision (b), of the Code provides that the suspension, expiration, surrender, or cancellation of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued or reinstated.
 - 9. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, states:

"For the purpose of denial, suspension, or revocation of a personal or facility license pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and Professions Code, a crime or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or registrant if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of a licensee or registrant to perform the functions authorized by his license or registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare."

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license on an active status. This correspondence directed Respondent to provide the requested documents by May 18, 2011. This letter was sent via certified mail and received and signed by Respondent on or about April 23, 2011. As of the filing of this Accusation and Petition to Revoke Probation, Respondent has not provided the requested documents to the Board.

- 14. On or about April 23, 2011, Respondent signed his pharmacist renewal application for renewal period January 1, 2011 to December 31, 2013, but failed to provide proof satisfactory to the Board that he completed the continuing education requirements necessary for license renewal.
- 15. Pursuant to section 4231, subdivision (d), of the Code, the Board cancelled Respondent's active pharmacist license and issued an inactive pharmacist license in its place.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Comply with Probation)

16. Respondent has subjected his license to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (o), of the Code, on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, for violating California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1773, in that Respondent failed to comply with the terms and conditions of probation. Specifically, Respondent failed to enroll in and successfully participate in and complete the Pharmacists Recovery Program, failed to obey all laws, provide to the Board evidence of his efforts to maintain skill and knowledge as a pharmacist, and failed to maintain a current and active pharmacist license, as set forth in paragraphs 12 and 15, above, and paragraphs 17 through 24, below.

PETITION TO REVOKE PROBATION

FIRST CAUSE TO REVOKE PROBATION

(Failure to Obey All Laws)

- 17. At all times after the effective date of Respondent's probation, Condition 2 stated, in part:
 - "Obey All Laws. Respondent shall obey all state and federal laws and regulations."

FOURTH CAUSE TO REVOKE PROBATION

(Failure to enroll in Pharmacists Recovery Program)

23. At all times after the effective date of Respondent's probation, Condition 17 stated, in part:

"Pharmacists Recovery Program (PRP). Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this decision, Respondent shall contact the Pharmacists Recovery Program (PRP) for evaluation, and shall immediately thereafter enroll, successfully participate in, and complete the treatment contract and any subsequent addendums as recommended and provided by the PRP and as approved by the Board or its designee. The costs for PRP participation shall be borne by the Respondent.

"Failure to timely contact or enroll in the PRP, or successfully participate in and complete the treatment contract and/or any addendums, shall be considered a violation of probation.

"Probation shall be automatically extended until Respondent successfully completes the PRP. Any person terminated from the PRP program shall be automatically suspended by the Board. Respondent may not resume the practice of pharmacy until notified by the Board in writing."

24. Respondent's probation is subject to revocation because he failed to comply with Probation Condition 17, referenced above. Effective May 18, 2011, Respondent was terminated from the PRP for failing to complete his intake process and enroll in the PRP, as required. Due to Respondent's termination from the PRP program, Respondent's pharmacist license was automatically suspended by the Board.

DISCIPLINE CONSIDERATIONS

25. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent,
Complainant alleges that on or about March 28, 2011, in a prior disciplinary action entitled *In the Matter of the Accusation Against Norman Bruce Shibley* before the Board of Pharmacy in Case
No. 3370, Respondent's license was revoked, with revocation stayed, suspended for nine (9)
months, and placed on probation for six (6) years with terms and conditions for committing

1	violations of Business and Professions Code sections 4301, subdivisions (k) and (l), and 490	
2	(Convictions of Substantially Related Crimes: alcohol related misconduct while camping on	
3	federal grounds and driving while under the influence of alcohol) and Business and Professions	
4	Code section 4301(h) (alcohol abuse). That decision, attached as Exhibit A, is now final and is	
5	incorporated by reference.	
6	<u>PRAYER</u>	
7	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,	
8	and that following the hearing, the California Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:	
9	1. Revoking the probation that was granted by the California State Board of Pharmacy	
10	in Case No. 3370 and imposing the disciplinary order that was stayed thereby revoking	
11	Pharmacist License No. RPH 39528 issued to Norman Bruce Shibley;	
12	2. Revoking or suspending Pharmacist License No. RPH 39528, issued to Norman	
13	Bruce Shibley; and	
14	3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
