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1	Stipulated Surrender of License (Case No. 4249)					

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3. On or about February 27, 1969, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacist License No. RPH 25974 to Norman Tadayoshi Nishi (Respondent). The Pharmacist License expired on February 28, 2011, and has not been renewed.

JURISDICTION

4. Accusation No. 4249 was filed before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on February 2, 2012.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

5. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 4249. Respondent also has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.

6. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a
hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at
his own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to
present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel
the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and
court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California
Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

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Stipulated Surrender of License (Case No. 4249)

CULPABILITY

8. Respondent admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation
No. 4249, agrees that cause exists for discipline and hereby surrenders to the his Pharmacist
License No. RPH 25974 for the Board's formal acceptance.

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9. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of his Pharmacist License without further process.

CONTINGENCY

10. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board of Pharmacy. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board of Pharmacy may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondent or his counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.

11. The parties understand and agree that facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.

12. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an
integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement.
It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions,
negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order
may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing
executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

13. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that
the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

<u>ORDER</u>

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Citation No. CI 2009 41227 issued to Respondent Norman Tadayoshi Nishi as well as the abatements and fines ordered by those citations, are withdrawn and dismissed and that Pharmacist License No. RPH 25974, issued to Respondent Norman Tadayoshi Nishi, is surrendered and accepted by the Board of Pharmacy.

1. The surrender of Respondent's Pharmacist License and the acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of Respondent's license history with the Board of Pharmacy.

2. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a Pharmacist in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.

3. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.

4. If Respondent ever files an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a new application for licensure. Respondent must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for reinstatement of a revoked license in effect at the time the petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 4249 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the application or petition.

20 5. Respondent shall pay the agency a civil penalty in the amount of \$75,000.00 prior to
21 issuance of a new or reinstated license.

9. Section 480 of the Code states:

10 "(a) A board may deny a license regulated by this code on the grounds that the applicant
11 has one of the following:

(3) (A) Done any act that if done by a licentiate of the business or profession in question,
would be grounds for suspension or revocation of license."

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Section 1

10. Section 4105 of the Code states, in pertinent part:

16 "(a) All records or other documentation of the acquisition and disposition of dangerous
17 drugs ... by any entity licensed by the Board shall be retained on the licensed premises in a
18 readily retrievable form.

(b) The licensee may remove the original records or documentation from the licensed
premises on a temporary basis for license-related purposes. However a duplicate set of those
records or other documentation shall be retained on the licensed premises.

(c) The records required by this section shall be retained on the licensed premises for a
period of three years from the date of making."

11. Section 4081 of the Code states:

"(a) All records of manufacture and of sale, acquisition, or disposition of dangerous drugs
or dangerous devices shall be at all times during business hours open to inspection by authorized
officers of the law, and shall be preserved for at least three (3) years from the date of making. A
current inventory shall be kept by every manufacturer, wholesaler, pharmacy ... or establishment

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holding a currently valid and unrevoked certificate, license, permit, registration, or exemption
 under Division 2 (commencing with Section 1200) of the Health and Safety Code or under Part 4
 (commencing with Section 16000) of Division 9 of the Welfare and Instructions Code who
 maintains a stock of dangerous drugs or dangerous devices."

5 12. Section 4332 of Code states, in pertinent part, that any person who fails, neglects, or 6 refuses to maintain the records required by Section 4081 or who when called upon by an 7 authorized officer or a member of the board, fails, neglects, or refuses to produce or provide the 8 records within a reasonable time, or who willfully produces or furnishes records that are false is 9 guilty of a misdemeanor."

10

13. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1714, states, in pertinent part:

"(b) Each pharmacy licensed by the board shall maintain its facilities, space, fixtures, and
equipment so that drugs are safely and properly prepared, maintained, secured and distributed.
The pharmacy shall be of sufficient size and unobstructed area to accommodate the safe practice
of pharmacy."

14. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, states:

16 "For the purpose of denial, suspension, or revocation of a personal or facility license
17 pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and Professions Code, a
18 crime or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a
19 licensee or registrant if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of a
20 licensee or registrant to perform the functions authorized by his license or registration in a manner
21 consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare."

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BACKGROUND FACTS

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24 15. On or around January 30, 1991, the Board issued Original Permit Number PHY
25 36852 to Norman Tadayoshi Nishi (Respondent) to do business as Morningside Medical
26 Pharmacy (Pharmacy) located at 1704 W. Manchester Ave., Los Angeles, CA 90047, the address
27 of record.

Respondent was the Sole Owner and Pharmacist-In-Charge from January 30, 1991 to 16. 1 November 20, 2008. 2 On or around May 13, 2009, during an investigation of the Pharmacy, evidence was 17. 3 adduced that Respondent had removed all invoice records from the Pharmacy and stored them at 4 his home without a waiver issued by the Board. 5 Respondent returned the invoice records dating from June 18, 2007 to November 1, 18. 6 7 2008 to the Pharmacy for the Board's review. The Board's review of the invoice records resulted in the discovery of 217 invoices 19. .8 9 from unlicensed wholesalers of pharmaceuticals, namely, Drogueria De La Villa, Inc. SUC/FMC Distributors of Nevada, Inc., located in Arecibo, Puerto Rico and Drogueria De La Villa, Inc., 10 located in Arecibo, Puerto Rico in violation of Bus. and Prof. Code § 4161. 11 12 FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 13 (Purchasing Dangerous Drugs From Unlicensed Entity) 14 20. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4169, subdivision (a)(1) in 15 16 conjunction with section 4161 subdivisions (a)-(b) and California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770 in that Respondent purchased dangerous drugs from an unlicensed wholesaler or 17 18 pharmacy. Complainant incorporates by reference paragraphs 15 – 19, above, as if fully set forth herein. 19 20 SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 21 (Failure to Produce Records) 22 Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4081, subdivision (a) and 23 21. 24 section 4105, subdivisions (a) – (c) in that Respondent failed to maintain all records of acquisition or disposition of dangerous drugs at the Pharmacy. Moreover, Respondent failed to obtain a 25 waiver for off-site records storage pursuant to the requirements set forth in California Code of 26 Regulations, title 16, section 1707. Complainant incorporates by reference paragraphs 15-19, 27 above, as if fully set forth herein. 28
