19	1. Complainant Virginia Herold brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as		
20	the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.		
21	2. On November 17, 2005, the Board issued Pharmacy Technician Registration Number		
22	TCH 66161 to Respondent Avedis Kouyoumdjian. The registration was in full force and effect at		
23	all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on June 30, 2015 unless it is		
24	renewed.

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JURISDICTION

- 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.
- 4. Code section 4300 provides that every license issued by the Board may be revoked or suspended and that proceedings to discipline a license are to be conducted according to the Administrative Procedure Act (Gov. Code, §§ 11370, et seq.).
- 5. Code section 4300.1 provides that the "expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license."

STATUTES

6. Section 4301 of the Code states, in relevant part:

The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

- (f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.
- (j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, or any other state, or of the United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.
- (o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency.
 - (p) Actions or conduct that would have warranted denial of a license.

DRUG CLASSIFICATIONS

- 11. Kaletra is a brand name for the drug combination lopinavir and ritonavir. Lopinavir and ritonavir are protease inhibitors that prevent replication of the human immunodeficiency virus in infected patients.
- 12. Revatio is a brand name for sildenafil. Sildenafil is indicated for Pulmonary Arterial Hypertension.
- 13. Reyataz is a brand name for atazanavir. Atazanavir is a protease inhibitor indicated for HIV-positive patients.
- 14. Sustiva is a brand name for efavirenz. Efavirenz is a non-nucleoside reverse transcriptase inhibitor that prevents HIV replication in infected patients.
- 15. Truvada is a brand name for emtricitabine and tenofovir disoproxil fumarate. Truvada is used to treat HIV and may be used as an HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis for adults at high risk of acquiring HIV.
- 16. Xeloda is a brand name for capecitabine. Capecitabine is indicated for colorectal and breast cancers.
- 17. The drugs described in paragraphs 11–16 are classified as dangerous drugs and are available only by prescription. (Bus. & Prof. Code, § 4022.)

STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 18. CVS Pharmacy in Glendale employed Respondent as a Pharmacy Technician from 2003 to at least April 29, 2008.
- 19. At 10:00 p.m. on Friday, April 25, 2008, Respondent walked through CVS Pharmacy and selected bottles of Kaletra, Revatio, Reyataz, Sustiva, Truvada and Xeloda. The drugs were worth \$23,426. Respondent placed the bottles in a basket before transferring them to his pockets. He then left the pharmacy without paying for the drugs.
- 20. On Tuesday, April 29, 2008, a CVS Regional Loss Prevention Manager confronted Respondent about the previous Friday's theft. He told Respondent that the drugs he'd taken were worth over \$23,000. Respondent said, "Now I feel really bad because I have been selling them for nothing. The guy I have been selling them to has taken advantage of me." Respondent admitted

1	that he had been stealing medications from the pharmacy and selling them at a rate of about two	
2	times per month for at least a year.	
3	FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
4	(Dishonesty, Fraud, Deceit and Corruption)	
5	21. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subdivision (f),	
6	in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, for unprofessional	
7	conduct because he committed an act involving dishonesty, fraud, deceit and corruption.	
8	Complainant realleges paragraphs 11–20.	
9	SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
10	(Violate Drug Statutes)	
11	22. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subdivision (j),	
12	in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, for unprofessional	
13	conduct because he violated statutes regulating dangerous drugs. In particular, Respondent	
14	violated section 4059, which prohibits the furnishing of dangerous drugs except upon a valid	
15	prescription. Complainant realleges paragraphs 11–20.	
16	THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
17	(Violate Pharmacy Law)	
18	23. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subdivision (o),	
19	in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, for unprofessional	
20	conduct because he violated provisions of the Pharmacy Law (Bus. & Prof. Code, §§ 2700, et	
21	seq.). Complainant realleges paragraphs 11–22.	
22	FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
23	(Conduct that Would Have Warranted License Denial)	
24	24. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subdivision (p),	
25	in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, for unprofessional	
26	conduct because he committed acts that would have warranted denial of a license. Complainant	
27	realleges paragraphs 11–23.

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PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 66161, issued to Avedis Kouyoumdjian;
- 2. Ordering Avedis Kouyoumdjian to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and
 - 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
